Women of the ELCA



Barbara Larick has been a member of First Lutheran since 1965. During many of those years she has participated in the projects and programs of the Women of the ELCA. She recently has served as chair, as well.

What is the purpose of the Women of the ELCA (WELCA)? There have been male ministries in the Church throughout history. Thanks to women like Katie Luther, the ministry of women has been heightened. WELCA provides a separate but equal ministry in the Church.

What does our congregational unit do? We meet for Bible studies and prayer groups. We have sewing and craft groups, like Project Linus that provides coverlets for children. We aid the congregation's ministries through activities like funeral dinners and cookie Sundays. We hold a semi-annual Rummage and Bake Sale that benefits local and global ministries and agencies. Our October sale provided monies for the Hancock County Schools "Boot" project and for Hurricane Harvey/Irma relief. We also contribute to the work of the synod and national church organizations, which provides funding to combat human trafficking, racial justice advocacy, scholarships (i.e. ELCA college and seminary scholarships), and domestic violence.

Where do your funds come from? The Women of the ELCA provide these blessings through their personal contributions. Our ministry is also funded by rummage sales, bake sales, Thrivent and Thankofferings. None of our funding is included in the annual congregational budget, but Thankofferings given today will go directly to support these projects.

Where does our money go? Each month the Stewardship Committee will highlight a ministry of the Church: congregational, local, national and global. We will get a glimpse of how our offerings are being put to work.



Have You Heard the Bells?

A replacement zimbelstern was installed recently. You are hearing a set of eight handbell-like bells being struck randomly by two strikers as the bells rotate. The bells are mounted on a wooden box near the front of the organ pipe chamber and are activated electrically by a pull stop on the organ console.

The zimbelstern (cymbal-star) was common in northern Europe, Germany in particular, during the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries. The bells are activated at the discretion of the organist. Traditionally, they would ring at the Sanctus (Holy, Holy) to emphasize those words of Scripture in the communion liturgy. In addition, any hymns of praise can be enhanced by the use of the zimbel. On Sunday, November 26th we at First Lutheran will dedicate this new little instrument to God's glory. •

Hey, everyone. I am happy to say that the church library is on its way back to normal. Marilynn Dunn and Cyndy Rotman helped begin the process the other day dusting books and oiling shelves. Stop in, check out all the new books and DVD's purchased, borrow a book. The library is alive! I am so excited about the most recent purchases.

A week or so ago some friends and I traveled to Toledo to hear Alan Alda at the Stranahan Theatre. He didn't talk about Hawkeye and "Mash"; he didn't talk about his movies or other TV roles. Instead, he spoke of his current passion: the art of communication. His search for clear communication began when he hosted PBS's Scientific American Frontiers. Over eleven years, he thinks he may have interviewed at least 750 scientists. In the beginning he had a difficult time understanding the scientific jargon. So, together, they developed a pattern to communicate to the audience the complicated, scientific ideas in everyday language.

And then his search for better communication moved to the non-scientific world. He eventually narrowed the key to communication in our everyday world to empathy, the ability to understand and share another person's experiences and emotions. He practiced empathy by observing people on the street, in stores, standing in front of him in a line.

How do we gain empathy for others? If we truly relate to another by listening with our ears and our eyes, exploring another's body language, actively asking questions to understand and so on, we can communicate clearly.

As a result of his years of interest in communicating, he then founded the Alan Alda Center for Communicating Science at Stony Brook University, Stony Brook, New York which serves scientists, medical professionals, students, and the public with opportunities to practice communicating effectively. The Center provides webinars, online learning, workshops.

His recent publication: If I Understood You, Would I Have This Look on My Face? My Adventures in the Art and Science of Relating and Communicating is currently available on the church cart. He begins the book with a quotation often attributed to George Bernard Shaw "The single biggest problem in communication is the illusion that it has taken place." That sentence says quite a bit in our world today. Alda is taking steps to correct the many misunderstandings.

In preparing for Christmas, I have put together a list of daily activities called "Prepare the Way" to get our hearts and minds ready for the birth of the Savior. I will have the sheets available on the library cart as of December 1. I also have set up a "Prepare the Way, Jr" for those sixteen and under that involves random acts of kindness. Then between Christmas and the Epiphany, those who have participated will identify themselves and a drawing for prizes will follow. The prizes have been donated by Paul and Kathy Brooks (but please don't tell Paul. He doesn't know yet!)
