Book Club

This February, our book club will be reading **Station Eleven**, a science fiction novel written by Emily St. John Mandel. The Georgia Flu sweeps across the world, killing most of humanity. Our author, follows the lives of various survivors, tracing how their lives intersect in a group of entertainers call



Traveling Symphony. The story line jumps back and forth between before the apocalypse and after as we follow the characters personal worlds under duress under both timelines. As readers, we are shown a world where hell is the absence of the people you long for. This is a character driven story and I hope you enjoy it and come to our February discussion meeting to discuss it. Look for our evite in February for more information.

January's discussion was on **Atomic City Girls** by Janet Beard. This is a historical fiction story on how the United States built a city in Oak Ridge Tennessee during the 1940's to enrich uranium for the Atomic Bomb. Most of the people they employed did not know what they were working on. Our view of the book was that it did not focus on the women as the title states. It had a very simplistic story line. We were given fewer details about the project than we had hoped. Many of us thought that the non-fiction book called **The Girls of Atomic City** by Denise Kiernan may shed more light as to the stories of the girls on this project. Still, this was a fascinating subject that none of our book club members had any knowledge about.
