Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

20th Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke12:49-53

Set a fire? Divide the earth? Did Jesus just say that? We call him the 'Prince of Peace' (Isaiah 9:6) don't we? And He told us "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you" (John 14:27). So, what is this about Jesus being a divisive 'fire-starter'? I suggest that Jesus is not being capriciously 'inflammatory' like so many of our politicians today that 'throw firebombs' only to rile people up and turn them against one another. That is not what Jesus is talking about here. He is expressing what I heard a guidance counselor say one time about trying to animate aimless & lethargic students, when he said, "I think a couple bolts of lightning are needed to get them moving". He was suggesting that teachers 'light a fire' under the students to motivate them to apply themselves more to their studies. With Jesus' division-talk here, I understand Him to mean 'My followers make a difference'- there is a clear division or dividing line between a disciple and anyone else. Jesus means that there is an obvious demarcation line between the time before He was born, and the time after He died (which we definitely see in the historical markings 'BC' and 'AD'!) Jesus is stirring up motivation. He wants to 'start our engines' similar to how mechanics tell us who are sitting behind the steering wheel to 'fire it up' to see how the car is running. In the Book of Revelation, a judgement is declared against the Church of Laodicea, because of its complacency and self-satisfaction. The Lord says of them, "Because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth" (Revelation 3:16). That church in Laodicea needs warming up (fired-up/heating) to be a good witness to the faith. So, Jesus' fire and division speech is meant to prevent us from being lukewarm and ineffective in our discipleship to Him.

More perplexing to us, though, may be Jesus when speaks about the divided houses in His wake. What does that mean? Well unfortunately, we know that Jesus experienced 'rejection' even from His hometown of Nazareth (Luke 4:28-29). Obviously some of His extended kinfolk chose to reject Him, complete with His teaching and His ministry. Why? Perhaps they thought Jesus was asking too much, by calling us to sacrifice our pride and to serve others, to love our enemies and to lie virtuously. Maybe it was simple jealousy or some other base motive of theirs, such as them just wanting to control Him for their own purposes. (Of course even among His chosen apostolic family, Jesus had breakaways such as Judas, who separated from Him over His teaching). Yet, Jesus had predicted that there would be such inevitable divides. When He sent the apostles out on mission, He taught them in advance to simply accept rejection and keep focused on the Kingdom mission work ('shake the dust and move one'--Luke 9:5, 10:11) We have to ask though, "Who would oppose Christ?" Yet, we all do every time we sin. We are pulling away from God (breaking and going our own way instead of Jesus' way). Yet, by grace, I hope we can always realize it quickly, convert immediately and turn back to Christ. But that is our freedom to 'remain' with Christ or to 'split' from Christ (In those times, we are the ones initiating the 'division') God wills that we remain united, but that requires us to conform our wills to God's will. Jesus was clear at the Last Supper when He prayed that even among His disciples, who we would hope were already united, that, they may be one' (John 17:11). However, God creates each of us with free will, and God honors our freedom, even to the point of accepting our rejection of Him. Jesus had indicated even earlier in the gospel accounts that misunderstandings (and parting divisions) among family may happen when it came to following Jesus, After Peter exaggeratedly celebrated his own sacrifices, claiming even that he 'gave up everything' (Mark 10:28), Jesus tells Peter, "I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age...." (Mark 10:29-30). I find Jesus' words here to be comforting. Maybe a 'division based on Christ' is only temporary. Good does overcome. Love conquers gently. If we patiently stay with Christ, the good will return. Like how many broken-hearts were comforted back in our old 'schoolhouse' days, when a 'lost crush' walked out on them, a trusted friend would console them with the words, "Let them go. If he/she is truly good for you, then they will be back. God wills that the good always returns." Maybe discipleship here, simply amounts to practicing 'healthy detachment'! Peace, Fr Brian
