I Punic Wars

- 1. Rome was imperialistic
- 2. They wanted to dominate weaker countries that surrounded the Roman Empire

II City of Corinth

- 1. Greek city state planned to rally against Rome
- 2. 146 BCE the Romans enter Corinth
- 3. Romans kill men, enslave women and children
- 4. They destroyed the city and sent all the riches to Rome
- 5. This was done as a warning to other countries

III Siege of Jerusalem

- a. 63 BCE Jerusalem becomes a Roman province
- b. Zealots *** Jews that Rebelled against Romans
- c. 66 AD Romans destroy Jewish temples, Burn down city
- d. Romans murdered men and women, and enslave thousands
- e. Built wall around city
- f. Jews fought one another, thousands died due to famine and disease
- g. Jews flee Jerusalem
- h. Diaspora- indication for the Jews living outside the land of Israel.
