#### As the church year comes to an end ...

The church year ends on November 22<sup>nd</sup> with Christ the King Sunday. The first Sunday in Advent is November 29<sup>th</sup>. It seems hard to believe that 2020 is almost over. We are instructed to move our clocks back one-hour on November 1<sup>st</sup>. Personally, I'm not sure I want to participate in this task. I am not sure I want an extra hour of this 2020 year. This task and requirement are not for me to decide, though, is it? Sometimes just by where



we are and who we are around, our lives are shaped by variables outside of our control. Covid-19 has changed much about how we live. It has certainly changed how we worship. As the Health and Safety Task Force makes re-opening recommendations to the Church Council, I ask that you continue to keep yourselves well and free from this virus which has caused havoc on our world. As we move into a "time to begin the reopening phases" you must know that **your health and safety are our highest priority.** 

Surely everyone will not feel comfortable returning to the sanctuary. Remember that LiveStreaming will continue as a permanent ministry even once we return to inperson worship! We are doing everything in our powers to keep the air clean: We have installed Merv-13 filters in the sanctuary. We will circulate the air for a longer time both before and after service. We will be appropriately spaced in the sanctuary. Masks are worn in the buildings. We will wear masks and gloves while distributing communion. Communion will be distributed in both the narthex for those attending worship and also continue to be distributed on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays in the parking lot. Scripture tells us about moving into times of experiencing ups and downs: a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; Ecclesiastes 3:3-4 As we move into this "time to dance" as we return to in-person worship, we move forward with the highest of safety and protection for God's people. After all, we are disciples of Christ who call Mt. Hermon "Home" and I deeply care for each of you! Please stay in touch with your Council Representative and keep yourself in the know about moving to in-person worship.

As we move into the season of Harvest and Thanksgiving, know that I thank God for you and the ministry which we share!

#### Congregational Council Mini Minutes September 13, 2020 via Zoom

**ATTENDANCE:** All were present with the exception of Devona Price and Mitchell Stevens **CARES AND CONCERNS:** Praying for Earl Sease's sister who is in hospital with broken leg, Buddy Hydrick's cousin and sister, Buddy Hydrick's granddaughter in hospital twice within a week, Diane Boulware's nephew Neal a firefighter in Los Angeles wildfires, Becky Koon, Bryce Addy recovering, Clifton Addy eye surgery this week, and Eldon Eargle waiting to have surgery **ADOPTION OF AGENDA:** Approved with no additions

**ADOPTION OF MINUTES:** Approved with following changes: Income from parsonage to be reported as Facilities Usage fee, Food Pantry sign in sheet to be changed weekly instead of daily and stored in its room.

#### **REPORTS:**

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. Our new seminarian is Mr. Matthew Hansen and he will be with us for 4 hours per week for 12 weeks assisting with worship.
- Treasurer: Written report received for August 2020 and all of 2020.
- Financial Secretary: Written report received for August 2020.

#### TEAM REPORTS/RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Worship: Written report received for August 24, 2020 meeting. Our live streaming Sunday services average 118 people watching and 273 views. The music concert had 755 views and The Dulcimer Guy concert 1600 views. Masks are mandatory inside the church. The Health & Safety task force is meeting every two weeks tracking local COVID cases and making plans about how and when to reopen for in person worship.
- 2. Support: Joel Price Sr. distributed the names of the 7 persons in the church with a Commercial Driver's license for the bus.
- 3. Outreach: Written report received from August 24, 2020 meeting. We have 11 teams of two persons to serve in the Food Pantry. We are trying to add paper products, deodorant, and cleaning supplies. Two prayer request boxes have been installed at the Food Pantry. Carson Thornton, a Boy Scout, and his father have volunteered to build a Little Free Library near Hidden Valley Mobile Home Park. Back to school drive was a success with donations given to six schools in the area.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- Cross on Sanctuary: Metro Signs who installed our church sign came for an evaluation. They
  quoted \$3668 just to remove the cross from the steeple. They would have to examine it for
  materials used and potential electrical rewiring to give a quote on making a new one and
  installing it. They estimate that could range from \$10,000-\$12,000 additional cost.
  Additionally, if the cross is lit and the bulbs burn out it would cost about \$4000 to replace and
  would likely burn for 5 years. Marion Leaphart talked to Marion Duncan of a sign company in
  Lown Town who are going to come and give another quote. He estimates a cost of \$6000\$7000 without having seen the cross yet. He will come to give a more exact quote. We have
  asked both of them to give quotes for a lit and unlit cross to reinstall on the steeple.
- 2. Health & Safety Task Force: They are studying when to recommend reopening for in person services. Should we go by positivity rate of <5% as recommended by CDC? Are any other stats relevant? Do we get specialized HVAC filters and how much do they cost?

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. New Seminary student: Matthew Hansen will be here for 12 weeks assisting in worship
- 2. Services for October 4<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>: These two weeks services will be recorded on September 27<sup>th</sup> to give everyone involved in the worship service a vacation. We will still be able to access them on Facebook Live.
- 3. Annual meeting with Church Council and Budget voting: Pastor Gina has talked with the SC Synod on how to handle these processes without in person meeting together. She has found

out you can buy an FM transmitter for about \$120 that lets you broadcast from inside the church to cars in the parking lot on a certain frequency. We could use this to broadcast the meeting to members without contact. Council members could go to cars to distribute and collect ballots. Motion to pursue purchasing FM transmitter for annual meeting. **APPROVED.** Council to receive list of eligible/ineligible members from Susan to ask if they will serve on Council if nominated. The nominations should be emailed to Pastor Gina or Ronnie Fulmer before our next meeting.

- 4. Council member asked if Daryl Leigh Anthony would be contacted to have the Teach Team meet and discuss possible online options for Sunday School/Christian Education for children.
- 5. Next council meeting will be October 11<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm via Zoom with devotions from Buddy Hydrick.

# Outreach Happenings . . .

#### **Food Pantry**

Our Food Pantry is booming. We are averaging 29 families each week. Each family receives \$20 worth of food. That amounts to **\$580 worth of food** that we distribute each week to the community. Your donations of food and money are crucial to the continued success of our Food Pantry. Thank you for supporting the Food Pantry and enabling us to be God's hands in the community.



#### **Current Items Needed in the Food Pantry**

The complete list of what we need each week is listed on the church website. This month we are emphasizing our need for **canned meats**, **peanut butter and jelly**. Any donation will be greatly appreciated.



**Angel Tree** – Are you interested in helping someone have a brighter Christmas this year? Consider sponsoring a child/parent from our Angel Tree. This year's Angel Tree will be virtual. The families we are helping attend our local schools. If you are interested in sponsoring a child or their parent this year, please send the Outreach Team an email message at <u>mthoutreach@gmail.com</u> or call the church office at 803-794-6430. We will then give you access to the virtual tree so that you can choose which child/person you want to help. We have asked each parent to list their children's needs and wishes. We have several children already on the list and will be adding others within the next week or two. Each person's name has been coded to protect their privacy.

In an effort to keep the number of gifts each child within a family receives equal, we ask that you wrap gifts together or separately for a total of FIVE packages per child. Please write the child's code in pencil or attach a removable tag with their code and return the wrapped gifts to the church by **Monday**, **Dec.** 7. The church office is open from 9 - 1 pm M-F.

**Free Garage Sale** – We are still making plans to have a Free Garage Sale again this year. When it will be is still to be determined. We hope to have it in December as we usually do, but that is not certain at this time. If you have items you would like to donate to help those



in need, please bring them to the church and place them in the conference room at the base of the stairs under the sanctuary. If you have furniture that you would like to donate, please call either Diane Boulware or the church office. Furniture will be stored in another area.

**Prayer Request Boxes** – One of the procedures that has changed in the Food Pantry since COVID 19 is that we no longer use a notebook for the guests to sign. In that notebook, they had an opportunity to write prayer requests. So, we have installed two Prayer Request "mailboxes" in which the community members can let us know specific needs/concerns for which they would like for us to prayer. The congregation is welcome to use these also. The Prayer Request Boxes are located in the grass parking lot by the Little Free Library and at the corner of the cemetery nearest the Education Building and Food Pantry pickup. Members of the Outreach Team check these boxes regularly to make sure that any requests are prayed for in a timely manner. These requests are prayed for by the Outreach Team and given to Pastor Gina to be included in her prayers.



#### **Face Masks**

Our face mask ministry continues. We have distributed over **400** face masks to members of the community through the Food Pantry. These masks are all handmade and donated to this ministry. If you are in need of a face mask, please let us know. We want to do our part to slow the spread of COVID 19 and spread God's love into our community.

#### The Little Free Library needs novels

We are in need of adult and youth novels in our Little Free Library. If you have some to donate, we would love to have them. We want to help strengthen literacy skills and inspire a love of reading in our community. You can borrow and return, replace with another book, or if you just loved the story, keep it! The Little Library is open to all!
