Area of Change:	Details:
Prose Solo	Match the definition on Page 50 with the wording from the <i>Glossary</i> on Page 94 (addition of the word "published" to Page 50).
Speech Eligibility for Provincials	The following groups of classes are now eligible for Provincials: Original Poetry Solo (Classes 83300-83360), Sacred Reading Solo (Classes 83800-83860), Public Speaking Solo (Classes 83900-83950), and Solo Mime (Classes 84600-84670).
Musical Theatre List	This list will now be reviewed and updated every three (3) years.
Provincial Choral – Senior	Class 916 – Choral Senior is no longer a split class (live and recorded). Entries will now only be accepted via recording.
Provincial Rules – Protests	Rule 100 – Fee for protests increased from \$15 to \$50.
Provincial Rules – Acceptance of Entries	Rule 101A – Just a renumbering of Rule 101 to allow for the addition of Rule 101B.
Provincial Rules – Late Entries	Rule 101B – Late Entries If participant festival entries are not received by AMFA on or before the deadline set by the Executive Committee, the fees for those entries plus an additional late fee may be charged to the local festival. This additional fee shall be set by the Executive, but shall not exceed the total entry fee amount.
Provincial Class Time Limits	A number of Provincial Class Time Limits have changed. <i>(see pages 97-98 for details)</i>
Provincial National Classes – Musical Theatre	Performance requirements at ALL three (3) levels for the Provincial National Musical Theatre Class have changed . Please make sure you are aware of and understand these changes.
Provincial National Classes - Choirs	All entries to the Choral Provincial National Classes must be accompanied by a cheque for entry fees to the National Music Festival. If the choir is not successful in being recommended to the National Music Festival, the cheque will be voided and returned.
Provincial National Classes – Choral Ensemble	Please note that the eligible size for Provincial National Choral Ensemble is now 6-12 singers.

Rules Governing the Local Festivals

A local festival may publish an Addendum to accompany the Provincial and National Syllabi. The Addendum includes information that applies particularly to the local festival organization. Please check your local addendum for changes or modifications to classes, rules, or regulations.

See *Rules Governing the Provincial Festival* for local addendum classes that **may** be eligible for provincial recommendation.

A festival may establish additional rules that shall apply only to that festival. Except for classes otherwise designated, selections of music are expected to be of a serious "classical" nature. *See the Glossary*

It is the responsibility of every competitor to be familiar with the *Rules Governing Local Festivals*, the *Rules Governing the Provincial Festival*, meanings of the terms in the *Glossary*, and any rules or regulations established by the local festival in its Local Addendum.

A competitor who is interested in eligibility requirements for the National Festival should consult their local festival contact person or the Provincial Administrator of AMFA.

Local festivals reserve the right to refuse any entry.

MANAGEMENT

- 1. Each festival is managed by a committee. Questions concerning a festival should be directed to the local contact person. Decisions of the committee are final.
- 2. Each festival reserves the right to delete classes or to add classes upon request.
- 3. Adjudicators' decisions regarding performance are final.
- 4. At no time may a teacher or competitor engage the adjudicator in conversation prior to or during any performance for that adjudicator. Such an approach may result in the competitor's disqualification.
- 5. A protest can be considered only if it is made in accordance with regulations established by the festival.

COMPETITORS

- 6. The age of a competitor is established as of December 31 preceding the festival.
- 7. The festival movement is intended for "amateurs". See the Glossary
- 8. Competitors shall enter the festival and all festival classes based upon their gender identification. Sung and spoken selections are not constrained to gender specificity.

9. A competitor may enter only *once* in a Group of Classes. A Group of Classes consists of those classes listed beside each entry on the Local Festival Classes pages.

EXCEPTION: Competitors may enter more than once in a Group of classes if they are playing a different instrument.

- 10. A member of a duet or ensemble may enter more than once in a class provided that he or she performs a different part, plays a different instrument, or is the conductor.
- 11. A competitor taking private vocal/musical theatre lessons may not enter School Vocal/Musical Theatre classes.
- 12. Previous Winners:

A. The winner of a solo (other than a Provincial National) class may enter the same class in any subsequent Provincial Festival after sitting out **two** festival years.

Notes:

- **EXCEPTION:** A class with only one (1) competitor.
- The winner of a solo class at the National Music Festival may compete in a Provincial Festival using the same instrument after sitting out two festival years.
- The National Festival Grand Award winner may not compete in any subsequent Provincial Festival using the same instrument.
- B. The winner of a solo (other than a Provincial National) class may not enter a lower age class in the same discipline in any subsequent year.

SELECTIONS AND PERFORMANCE

- 13. Festivals may use any grading system. Suggested grading system:
 - 90% or over Superior
 - 85-89% Distinction
 - 80-84% Honours
 - Below 80% Merit

A grade of at least 80% must be achieved to receive a First Place Certificate.

Definition of a **Selection** as per the **Glossary**:

- A stand-alone piece of music.
- One, and only one, portion of a song cycle (<u>NOTE:</u> exception allowed in Provincial National Vocal class)
- One, and only one, piece from a collection of pieces, or as prescribed as a requirement in either the Royal Conservatory of Music, Conservatory Canada, or other recognized syllabus.
- One or more movements of a multi-movement composition: e.g. sonata, concerto, or concerted work.
- Piano Plan I 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used

as **ONE** selection as long as they keep within the allotted time limit.

- Piano Plan II 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used as ONE selection, but MUST keep to the grade/level standards as put forth by any of the recognized Conservatory Syllabi, and be within the allotted time limit.
- 14. A festival is not permitted to replace any selection listed in the Syllabus without the approval of the Provincial Administrator or Syllabus Coordinator.
- 15. Names of publishers are included for guidance only. Any standard edition of a selection may be used.
- 16. A solo **OR** group competitor may not perform the same selection in the same festival in the following **two** festival years.

EXCEPTION:

In the Piano concerto classes, the 1^{st} movement may be repeated in the second and third years provided that in the second year, it is augmented by the 2^{nd} movement, and in the third year, all three movements are performed.

- 17. A solo **OR** group competitor may perform a selection only **once** using the same instrument during a given festival.
- 18. In classes with "own choice" selections, the total performance must not exceed 20 minutes unless otherwise stated. *See preamble before classes for details.*

EXCEPTIONS:

Complete Concerto classes for Strings (34350-34380) Complete Concerto classes for Piano (74070-74090) Provincial National classes – 60 minutes

- 19. A complete *published* score, including solo and accompaniment music, not a photocopy, except as provided by Rule 20, must be provided for the adjudicator. The first bar of each line in music scores must be numbered. Each selection should be clearly marked with the class and competitor number.
- 20. Selections:
 - A. Music
 - In every class other than Music Composition, a photocopy may be used **ONLY** if the publisher's written approval has been given.
 - 2. A photocopy of an accompaniment may be used to ease page turning provided the accompanist has, at the accompanying instrument, a *published* edition of the selection.
 - 3. In every Music Composition class, a

photocopy or computer printout must be provided for the adjudicator.

- B. Speech
 - 1. A *published* edition must be available for the adjudicator.
- 21. Each festival reserves the right to disqualify a competitor who is not ready to perform when called.
- 22. Each festival sets its own regulations regarding memorization.
- 23. Accompaniments must be played as written.

EXCEPTIONS: Folk Songs, Musical Theatre, and Pop.

- 24. Each festival sets its own regulations regarding recorded accompaniments.
- 25. No person on- or off-stage may augment or coach a performance.
- 26. Any transposition is permitted except in the following classes:
 - Vocal Solo Bach Aria
 - Vocal Solo Opera
 - Vocal Solo Oratorio

Competitors must mark each selection advising the adjudicator the key in which the music will be performed.

27. The use of recording devices may be permitted provided that the user remains stationary and unobtrusive, and records only his or her own competitor. The use of flash cameras is prohibited during a performance or adjudication. **Adjudications MUST NOT be recorded.**

CHORAL, BAND, AND ORCHESTRA CLASSES

 Every choir member must be a bona fide member. **TEN** percent of the choir membership may exceed a specified age limit by no more than two years. *EXCEPTION:* All National Choral classes. See pages 78, 110–111, and 132 for age limitations in all National Choral classes.
 <u>Note:</u> Professional vocalists and teachers of

singing may sing in a choir of which they are *bona fide* members.

- 29. A choir must consist of at least 13 members. Choirs with fewer members should notify the local festival contact person or the Provincial Administrator of AMFA.
- 30. When a school entry contains combined grades, the grade having the largest number of students determines the class to be entered.
- 31. A choir, band or orchestra entry with members from two or more schools, and trained as a unit, may compete as a school entry only if the members have not been selected on the basis of performing ability. Otherwise, it must compete as a non-school (community) choir, a community band, or community orchestra.

LIST OF LOCAL CLASSES

- **A Group of Classes** consists of those class number ranges which are listed below: e.g. School String Solo classes 35710-35770 or Guitar Advanced classes 37400-37470.
- A competitor may enter only <u>once</u> in a *Group of Classes*.

EXCEPTION: Competitors may enter more than one class in a Group of Classes only if:

- 1. they are playing a different instrument, or
- 2. in the case of vocal classes, if they are singing in a different voice.

Note 1 — Choirs submitting Audio recordings to the Provincial level of competition must perform the same selections on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the local level.

Note 2 — Definition of the term 'selection' is: "one piece of music by a composer, and not two or more short pieces from a collection, cycle, or larger work".

Note 3 — ****NEW IN 2018**** Class **916** – Choral Senior is no longer a split class (live and recorded). Entries will now only be accepted via recording.

Eligibility (Audio Recorded Competition)

- Participation is limited to amateur Alberta choirs, performing in the appropriate class(es) in a live performance at affiliated local Alberta festivals.
- 2. A choir may enter only one choral class at the Provincial level.
- 3. Should a competitor be recommended by more than one local festival, AMFA will only accept the first recommendation.

Performance (Audio Recorded Competition)

- 1. Each festival will set their own rules in regards to the arrangement and cost for the recording sessions. AMFA will not assume any financial responsibility and/or arrangement for recording.
- 2. A designated local festival official must supervise and witness the recording of the performance of choirs recommended to the Alberta Music Festival.
- 3. Only MP3s are acceptable formats for the submission of recorded choral entries.
- 4. No acoustic or electronic compensation, filtering, or other enhancement is to be used while recording.
- It is preferable to have the recording done during the actual performance, but should this not be feasible, it **MUST be received** in the Provincial Office (37 Beech Crescent, Olds, AB T4H 1L8) **BEFORE April** 29th.
- 6. The recording must be the first take, and must be with the same choir, conductor and accompaniment as in the original performance.
- 7. The submitting festival will send with each **Provincial National Choir** entry:
 - a. ONE (1) complete original music score for each selection containing choral parts and accompaniment. The first bar of each line in the score must be numbered, and the performance key indicated on the score.
 - b. **ONE (1)** MP3 recording will be emailed to the Provincial Administrator
 - c. Entry fee of **\$150.00 (payable to AMFA)**
- 8. The submitting festival will send with each entry for Class 971, Class 916, and Class 911:
 - a. **ONE (1)** complete original music score for each selection containing choral parts and accompaniment. The first bar of each line in the score must be numbered, and the performance key indicated on the score.
 - b. ONE (1) MP3 recording
 - c. Entry fee of \$150.00 (payable to AMFA)

PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHORAL COMPETITION:

Provincial National competition is conducted at three progressive levels:

Local Festival

Adjudicators at the Local Festival may choose, in each of the ten Choral categories, one choir that is felt to be of National standard. An MP3, along with the recommendation, **ONE (1)** original music score, and, if applicable, a copy of the receipt for downloaded music, shall be sent to the Provincial Administrator.

Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of National standard. The written recommendation along with the above files shall be sent to the Executive Director of the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals via Dropbox.

National Festival

The electronic files will be uploaded into a specially designated Dropbox folder, and the Executive Director will code them for anonymity and place into a different Dropbox folder for the adjudicators. An entry fee of \$125.00 is required at the National Level.

****NEW IN 2018**** All Entries to the Choral Provincial National Classes must be accompanied by a cheque for entry fees to the National Music Festival. If the choir is not successful in being recommended to the National Music Festival, the cheque will be voided and returned.

Appendix I: Glossary of Terms

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

- Accompaniment A subordinate part for instruments, voices, or ensembles — usually piano; although, one or more instruments are allowed in some classes.
- Action Song A song having definite actions that all the children are expected to perform.
- Adult Of legal age in Alberta.
- Amateur A person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance of music in the particular discipline in which he or she is competing. This stipulation does not, however, preclude such a person having occasionally received remuneration for musical services rendered, even in the area in which he or she is competing.
- Aria An elaborate, accompanied, vocal solo from an opera, operetta, or cantata.
- Art Song The Art Song was a creation of the late 18th and early 19th centuries, and continues into the 20th and 21st centuries. These songs were written for voice with piano accompaniment. Composers such as Mozart, Schumann, Brahms, Schubert, Britten, Quilter, Barber, Bernstein, Rorem, Coulthard, Fleming, etc. were inspired to write music to enhance existing poetry.
 <u>NOTE:</u> The language of the song, if other than English, determines the class to be

than English, determines the class to be entered.

- Associate Standard Refers to a selection of advanced difficulty that must be of at least post-Grade/post-Level 10 or equivalent level/standard. Lists are available in the RCM and Conservatory Canada syllabi.
- **Bach String Solo** A composition written for unaccompanied solo string.
- Ballad (as used in Musical Theatre) Music with a slower tempo, often of a serious nature. See Up-Tempo
- **Ballad/Traditional Air** A narrative poem, often of unknown origin and written in short stanzas. Was originally sung to a repeated tune.
- **Baroque Music** Music composed in or around the Baroque Period, circa 1600-1760.
- **Canadian Composer/Author** A person born in Canada, one who has resided in Canada for at least five years, or a naturalized citizen.
- **Canadian Poetry** Published poetry written by a Canadian author (including those works that are in books printed at direct cost to the author).

- **Chamber Music** A term that originally referred to music not intended for the church, the theatre, or public concert hall. It no longer implies a place of performance, but refers to music written for <u>three, four, or more instruments</u> played with one instrument to a "part", all the parts having equal importance. See Ensemble
- **Choir/Chorus** A group of 13 or more members performing as a single unit.
- **Choral Speech** Is the speaking of a piece of literature by a speech choir. It differs from Choric Drama in that the prime emphasis is on telling the story, rather than acting it out. The focus is on the language and the speaking of the text. There is no movement around the stage, but gestures and simple in-place movements may be used. Variety may be provided through the division of voices, use of solo voices, the physical arrangement of the choir, use of props, and the suggestion of a simple costume.
- **Choric Drama** Is distinguished from Choral Speech in that the choir enacts the story, as opposed to just telling the story through language. The choir may use theatrical elements such as dialogue, characterization and movement around the stage. Solo voices are featured and blocking (grouping) of individual speakers may be incorporated. Other theatrical elements such as scenery, costumes, and props may be used.
- **Class** Each discipline is divided into sub-categories by instrument, and/or by age, and/or by grade level. Each is identified by a five digit number. Each is labeled "a Class". With few exceptions, students may enter only one class in a group of classes. See list of "List of Local Classes" for guidelines

See list of "List of Local Classes" for guidelines regarding groups of local classes

- **Classical Guitar** A plucked stringed instrument originating in Spain.
- **Classical** Refers to music of a serious nature, **NOT** pop, move, TV, or musical theatre. Not limited to the "Classical period."
- **Classical Period** Music composed approximately between 1750 and 1830.
- **Classroom Music** Music designed to portray the many facets of the elementary school program. Singing is the main emphasis, but some movement/creative dance, and limited use of simple instruments is required. Costumes and stage props may be used.

- **Community Band/Choir/Chorus** A group of instrumentalists or singers performing as a unit. The term also refers to a group whose members come from 2 or more schools and who have been selected on the basis of performing ability.
- **Concert Band** A group of musicians playing woodwind, brass, and percussion instruments under the direction of a conductor.
- **Concerted Work** Any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. In festivals, a piano provides the orchestral part.
- **Concerto** A composition written in several movements usually for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment.
- **Contemporary/Modern** In music, a work written from 1900 to the present. In Speech Solo Scenes, works written after 1950.
- **Composition, Music** Music composed by the competitor.
- **Creative Story Telling** The story may be either an original work by the performer, or a traditional story, folk tale, family tale, legend, fable, or myth. Entrants submit a brief plot outline to the adjudicator. Appropriate sounds, props, or movement may be incorporated into the performance provided there is no disruption of the smooth delivery of the story. *The performance* **MUST** be in the teller's own words.
- **Discipline** AMFA defines six disciplines for administrative purposes: Band/Orchestra, Music Composition, Instrumental, Piano, Speech, and Voice.
- **Domicile** Refers to the family home.
- **Dramatic Improvisation** The unified presentation of an idea or theme through action and dialogue. It must be spontaneous, unscripted and have clarity and purpose.
- **Duet** Two individuals performing different parts as a unit.
- **Duologue** A speech selection for 2 individuals performing different parts.
- **Ensemble** A small group, the required size of which depends upon the class entered. In Choral: 8 12 singers; in Chamber: 3 6 performers.
- **Family Music** Music performed by a group all of whom, including the accompanist, are members of the same family.

- **Finger-style Guitar** Describes a manner of playing in which the fingertips are used to pluck the strings.
- **Flamenco Guitar** Describes accompaniments used in gypsy folk songs and dances of Spanish music.
- **Folk Guitar** Describes accompaniments of folk songs employing simple chords and arpeggios.
- **Folk Song** Music which has entered into the heritage of the people and which can usually be assigned to no composer, school, or period. It has been fashioned and refashioned through many generations by countless individuals and was usually passed on orally.
- **Full Orchestra** A large group of musicians performing as a unit and using string, woodwind, brass, and percussion instruments.
- **General Classes** Syllabus classes **NOT** identified as "school classes". General classes are intended for students receiving private lessons. In a choral context, non-school choral groups or school groups from 2 or more schools selected on the basis of ability. *See School Classes*
- **Gesture** Movement of the hands and arms, that clarifies or emphasizes the meaning and emotional content of a performance.
- **Group Competitor** Two or more individuals performing as a unit.
- **Group of Classes** A competitor may enter only <u>one</u> class in a given Group of Classes. A Group of Classes consists of those classes listed beside each entry on the Local Festival Classes pages. *See Rule 8 in the "Rules Governing Local Festivals" See list of "List of Local Classes" for guidelines regarding groups of local classes*
- **Group Study** A method of teaching a group collectively rather than teaching each person individually.
- **Handbell** A musically tuned bell with a handle made of leather or plastic that allows it to be held in the hand.
- Handchime/Tonechime A metal tube slotted and cut to produce a musical sound.
- **Impressionism/Impressionistic Idiom** The style of music composed at the time of Debussy and continued by his followers. It conveys moods and emotions aroused by the subject rather than portraying a detailed tone poem.

- **Instrumental** Generally refers to the string, woodwind, brass, and percussion families, but includes the singing voice and the speaking voice as separate instruments. It also has a more specialized meaning as one of the Disciplines.
- **Lieder** A distinctive type of German vocal solo composition that was an outcome of the Romantic Movement of the late 18th and early 19th centuries. In Lieder, the quality of the verse is very important. The piano part is more than an accompaniment and, as does the vocal part, demands artistic interpretation.
- Light Opera/Operetta A type of comic or light-hearted opera containing spoken dialogue.
- Lyric Poetry Is distinguished by its intense personal feeling and unified by the poet's consistent response to an incident or idea. Lyric poetry frequently exhibits a graceful, fluid rhythm and an evocative pattern of sound. It is reflective poetry, and although a lyric may relate an incident or episode, the story element is of secondary importance. Movement and gesture, if any, should be restrained and should never draw attention away from the language. See Narrative/Dramatic Poetry
- Madrigal A composition for several voices, performed unaccompanied. The texts of a madrigal are usually secular.
- **Medley** A piece composed from parts of existing pieces, played one after another, sometimes overlapping.
- **Mime** Is a silent art form that uses body and face as instruments of communication. The art of mime is based on careful and sensitive observation, and the translation of that observation, along with thoughts and emotion into movement and expression so as to express a mood or present a scenario. The performer must communicate character, storyline, location and emotion clearly. Skills such as economy of movement, eye focus, the ability to position objects and maintain consistency of distance are vital. While classical mime skills may be incorporated into the mime work, the focus is on the piece as an artistic whole — as a scene driven by personal communication.

Mixed Choir/Chorus – A group of female and male singers performing as a unit.

Modern/Contemporary – See Contemp./Modern

- **Musical Theatre/Broadway Musical** A staged production, recognized revue, or movie musical that incorporates the elements of acting, song and movement. *See Revue*
- Narrative/Dramatic Poetry Is poetry that tells a story and stresses plot and action. It often contains dialogue, characterization, and conflict. Although narrative/dramatic poetry may contain lyrical or descriptive passages, it usually minimizes or ignores the poet's expression of personal feelings. Movement and gestures should flow naturally from the text and the performer's interpretation. *See Lyric Poetry*
- **Obbligato** An accompaniment that has a distinct character and independence providing special or unusual effects, and is an integral part of the composition.

Operatic Solo – See Aria

- **Oratorio** Drama which may be sacred or secular and set to music. It contains all the elements of an opera, but is seldom staged.
- **Partner Song** Two different songs that have a similar harmonic structure and length, so they may be sung together.
- **Piano Quick Study** A class in which a competitor performs a selection within 24 hours of receiving the music.
- Plectrum Guitar Describes a manner of playing in which a small piece of plastic is used to strum the strings.
- Popular Vocal Is non-classical in style and includes: Movie/TV/Pop, vocal jazz, country and western, and contemporary gospel music. Does NOT include Musical Theatre.
- **Prescribed Selection** A test piece that is listed in the current syllabus for a specific class.
- **Private Lessons** Regular scheduled instruction on a continuing basis under the guidance of a recognized instructor receiving compensation for such instruction.
- **Production Number** A vocal presentation assisted by a background ensemble.

- **Professional** A person whose principal means of livelihood is obtained from the practice of music in the particular category in which he or she is competing.
- Props Objects used to enhance a presentation usually in musical theatre, some solo speech classes, choral speech, and choric drama. They may be hand-held (a purse, a glass, a mop) or be stage props (a doorway, a stool, a table and chair). Stage props are set up before the performance begins. In all cases, props should be simple, limited in number, and an integral part of the performance.
- Prose Solo A prose selection may be fiction or non-fiction from a published story, essay, novel, or the like.

Public Domain – Means the author has been dead for at least fifty years and therefore the work is out of copyright.

- **Quartet** Four individuals performing different parts as a unit.
- **Quintet** Five individuals performing different parts as a unit.
- Readers Theatre Is a form of group interpretation that can represent the staging of all kinds of literature. It is a presentational, non-realistic form of production that includes the audience's imaginative participation as a scripting and staging principle. It emphasizes the experience in the text and appeals to the audience's ability to imagine. The actors may be seated, movement is limited, and scripts may be used as props.
- **Revue** A topical, satirical theatrical entertainment consisting of a series of scenes having a central theme, but no plot. *See Musical Theatre/Broadway Musical*
- **Rhythm Band** A group of performers playing very simple instruments, usually percussive. A component of the elementary school program.
- **Romantic Music** Music composed between 1830 and 1900.
- **Sacred** A selection using a religious theme or a religious text set to music. It should be "classical" in style, but **NOT** an oratorio.

- **Sacred Reading** The oral communication, in English, of a passage taken from any faith's holy text.
- School Band/Choir/Chorus A group of at least 13 performers, usually from one school, performing as a unit. See Rules 250 & 260 under "Rules Governing the Provincial Festival"
- **School Classes** Are so identified in the Syllabus. They are intended for students receiving musical or speech instruction in a classroom setting. That does not preclude receiving extra coaching from their school teacher. Students receiving private lessons may not enter classes identified as "school classes" unless part of a group entry. *See Private Lessons*
- **Sea Shanty** A song originally sung by sailors. Similar in origins to a folk song.
- Selected Voice Choir/Chorus A choir or chorus whose members are selected or "hand-picked". The standard of performance is higher than that which is expected of an unselected choir.

Selection -

- A stand-alone piece of music.
- One, and only one, portion of a song cycle (<u>NOTE:</u> exception allowed in Provincial National Vocal class)
- One, and only one, piece from a collection of pieces, or as prescribed as a requirement in either the Royal Conservatory of Music, Conservatory Canada, or other recognized syllabus.
- One or more movements of a multi-movement composition: e.g. sonata, concerto, or concerted work.
- Piano Plan I 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used as ONE selection as long as they keep within the allotted time limit.
- Piano Plan II 1 (one) or more movement(s) of a Multi-movement Piano Selection may be used as ONE selection, but MUST keep to the grade/level standards as put forth by any of the recognized Conservatory Syllabi, and be within the allotted time limit.
- Senior Usually refers to the level of achievement. In Provincial classes, refers to those 17 years and over.
- **Sight Singing/Reading/Playing** The performance of a selection by a competitor who has had only a few minutes preparation.

- **Sonata** A composition usually written in three or four movements for solo instrument with or without piano accompaniment. The solo instrument and accompaniment are of equal importance; although, generally, only the soloist is adjudicated.
- **Sonnet Sequence** Two sonnets with a similar theme, not necessarily by the same author.
- **Special Study** Classes for competitors who are in the beginning stages of study.
- Story Telling See Creative Story Telling
- **String Orchestra** A group of musicians using only string instruments, and performing as a unit.
- Traditional Air/Ballad See Ballad/Traditional Air
- **Transcription** The arrangement of a composition originally written for one instrument but adapted for another.
- **Trio** Three individuals performing different parts as a unit.
- **Unaccompanied** A selection written for solo or group, and performed without instrumental assistance.
- **Unchanged Voice** Refers to a singer, usually male, whose voice has not yet "broken" changed from an adolescent to an adult sound.
- **Up-Tempo (as used in Musical Theatre)** Music with a lively tempo, often comedy. *See Ballad*

- 2. Own choice selection from advanced repertoire **as recommended from Provincial Festival.** If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

PROVINCIAL NATIONAL PERCUSSION SOLO

MEMORIZATION AS STATED

RECORDINGS ARE ADJUDICATED AND THE WINNERS WILL BE NOTIFIED.

Instruments must be stated on the entry form. Piano accompaniment is permitted, where appropriate. All works for single percussion instruments **MUST** be **MEMORIZED**. For multi-instrument works and snare drum, **MEMORIZIATION** is encouraged, but **NOT REQUIRED**.

Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum

- In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:
 - 1. Enter Class 60001 and perform the following repertoire:
 - One (1) work for Keyboard Percussion (e.g. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone) from advanced repertoire
 - One (1) work for Timpani OR Multi-percussion OR Snare Drum from advanced repertoire
 - One (1) own choice from advanced repertoire
 - 2. At the discretion of the Local Festival, the competitor may perform live OR via recording

Provincial Festival (via recording ONLY)

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform three (3) selections which MUST have been adjudicated at the Local Level consisting of:

- 1. One (1) work for Keyboard Percussion (e.g. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone) from advanced repertoire
- 2. One (1) work for Timpani OR Multi-percussion OR Snare Drum from advanced repertoire
- 3. One (1) own choice from advanced repertoire

National Festival (see National Syllabus for all Rules and Regulations)

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform the same three (3) selections from the Provincial Level consisting of:

- 1. One (1) work for Keyboard Percussion (e.g. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone) from advanced repertoire
- 2. One (1) work for Timpani OR Multi-percussion OR Snare Drum from advanced repertoire
- 3. One (1) own choice from advanced repertoire

Percussion Entry Regulation and Guidelines:

- Only MP4 recordings or via private YouTube are acceptable formats for the submission of percussion entries.
- Ensure that you submit a high quality recording. Competitors will be notified of any technical problems with the recording.
- **NO EDITING IS ALLOWED.** The recording must be recorded as one, with no interruptions. Keep the camera running in-between selections, no matter how long the pause. Do not stop recording for general background noise, unless it is so loud that it will affect the sound quality. Follow the exact order of repertoire as it is listed on the entry form. Do not announce your name, and try to avoid recording your voice.
- One (1) original music score for each selection, with the first bar of each line numbered, **MUST** be submitted with the recording.
- An entry fee of \$125 is required. Please submit your recording at least one week before the deadline. Only entries received on or before the entry deadline will be eligible.

NEW IN 2018 PROVINCIAL NATIONAL MUSICAL THEATRE SOLO, Any Voice

ALL SELECTIONS MUST BE **MEMORIZED** AT ALL LEVELS (LOCAL, PROVINCIAL & NATIONAL)

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial Level of competition must perform the selection(s) on which they were recommended by at the adjudicator at the Local Level. The recommended selections must include a Ballad and Up-Tempo work.

The term "Up-Tempo" is used to describe music with a lively tempo, often comedy, e.g. – "One Hundred Easy Ways" (from *Wonderful Town*). The term "Ballad" is used to describe music with a slower tempo, often of a serious or introspective nature, e.g. – "On My Own" (from *Les Misérables*).

All selections are to be sung from a published score, in any published key of a staged musical. Competitors may use: costumes, one (1) hand prop per selection (a table, chair and coat rack is provided). Spoken passages are allowed only if published in the script/score provided. The original copy can be the Broadway score, from an Anthology, or purchased online. Proof of purchase must be shown for all online purchases.

Selections are not to include operetta/light opera (e.g. Romberg, Johann Strauss, Lehár, Gilbert & Sullivan, and Offenbach).

Local Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 30 minutes, or as specified in your Local Addendum In order to be eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival:

1. Enter Class 97000 and perform the following repertoire:

- One (1) Musical Theatre Ballad
- One (1) Musical Theatre Up-Tempo
- One (1) Own choice*

Provincial Festival

Time Limit: Maximum of 30 minutes inclusive.

Competitors must perform three (3) selections which MUST have been adjudicated at the Local Level consisting of:

- 1. One (1) Musical Theatre Ballad
- 2. One (1) Musical Theatre Up-Tempo
- 3. One (1) Own choice*

National Festival (see National Syllabus for all Rules and Regulations)

Time Limit: Maximum of 60 minutes inclusive (including costume changes).

Competitors must perform **five (5) selections** consisting of:

- 1. Musical Theatre Ballad as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 2. Musical Theatre Up-Tempo as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 3. Own choice selection as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 4. Own choice*
- 5. Own choice*

*At the National Festival, five contrasting pieces in different tempi and from different eras are to be performed. At least two (2) selections MUST have been performed before 1964. One selection by Sondheim is recommended. Please contact your Local Festival for details **before** entering any Provincial National Class.

PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHORAL – COMMUNITY

Local Festival – Community Choirs

Only those Community choirs interested in competing at the National level should enter classes 90000-90090. All Provincial National choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Festival classes will be recorded and submitted in MP3 format – travel to the Provincial Festival in Edmonton, or the National Festival, is not required.

- Choirs must perform two (2) contrasting own choice selections, as specified in the classes listed below.
- Only ONE (1) original complete copy of each music score is to be submitted (please note: any downloaded music MUST include the front cover of the music no reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on the MP3, or the front cover of music submitted electronically.
- Memorization is not mandatory.
- Brief solo passages are allowed only in one of the selections and those passages must not exceed 10% of the length of the selections. Choreography is not allowed in choral classes.

90000 - 19 YEARS AND OVER - 13 or more singers

National Award: Honourable Barbara J. Hagerman

- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

90010 – MALE – 13 or more singers, no age restriction

- National Award: City of Lincoln
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

90020 - 19 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

- National Award: George S. Mathieson
- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

NEW IN 2018 90040 – ENSEMBLE – 6–12 singers, no age restriction

National Award: Richard W. Cooke

• **Two (1) contrasting selections**, at least one of which must be sung in **three (3) or more parts** and one (1) of which must be a madrigal (may be a contemporary madrigal).

90050 - 16 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

National Award: Dr. & Mrs. J.F.K. English

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (1) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

90070 - 12 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

National Award: Margaret Wharton Memorial

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

90090 - 25 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers

National Award: Barbara Clark

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of a National standard.

- The recommended Choir will have submitted an original complete copy of each score (including the front cover)
 when they entered the local festival. No reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from
 which it was recommended should be on submitted the MP3 or music score.
 - The Provincial Administrator will send the music scores, MP3, entry form, to the National Festival Executive Director via the designated Dropbox folder, and fees will be forwarded as well.

National Festival (see National Syllabus for all Rules and Regulations)

The Executive Director will code all files for anonymity and place them into a different Dropbox folder for the adjudicators. The MP3 files from all the provinces shall be heard by two appointed adjudicators and the winners of the Choral competitions will be notified.

PROVINCIAL NATIONAL CHORAL – SCHOOL

Local Festival – School Choirs

Only those School choirs interested in competing at the National level should enter classes 90000-90090. All Provincial National choirs who are recommended to the Provincial Festival classes will be recorded and submitted in MP3 format – travel to the Provincial Festival in Edmonton, or the National Festival, is not required.

- Choirs must perform two contrasting own choice selections, as specified in the classes listed below.
- Only ONE (1) original complete copy of each music score is to be submitted (please note: any downloaded music MUST include the front cover of the music no reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on the MP3, or the front cover of music submitted electronically.
- Memorization is not mandatory.
- Brief solo passages are allowed only in one of the selections and those passages must not exceed 10% of the length of the selections. Choreography is not allowed in choral classes.

90010 – MALE CHOIR – no age restriction – 13 or more singers

National Award: City of Lincoln

- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

90030 – 19 YEARS AND UNDER – 13 or more singers from a single school

National Award: Paul J. Bourret

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one of which must be sung in three (3) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

NEW IN 2018 90040 - ENSEMBLE no age restriction - 6-12 singers

National Award: Richard W. Cooke

• **Two (2) contrasting selections,** at least one of which must be sung in **three (3) or more parts** and one (1) of which must be a madrigal (may be a contemporary madrigal).

90060 - 16 YEARS AND UNDER - 13 or more singers from a single school

National Award: David Ouchterlony

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

<u>90080 – 12 YEARS AND UNDER</u> – 13 or more singers from a single school

National Award: Florine Després

- Five percent (5%) of the choir membership may exceed the specified age limit by no more than two (2) years.
- Two (2) contrasting selections, at least one selection must be sung in two (2) or more parts.
- Only one (1) folk song is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of a National standard.

- The recommended Choir will have submitted an original complete copy of each score (including the front cover) when they entered the local festival. No reference to the name of the choir, its conductor, or the festival from which it was recommended should be on submitted the MP3 or music score.
 - The Provincial Administrator will send the music scores, MP3, entry form, to the National Festival Executive Director via the designated Dropbox folder, and fees will be forwarded as well.

National Festival (see National Syllabus for all Rules and Regulations)

The Executive Director will code all files for anonymity and place them into a different Dropbox folder for the adjudicators. The MP3 files from all the provinces shall be heard by two appointed adjudicators and the winners of the Choral competitions will be notified.

HISTORY

An all-Canadian Music Competition was held in Centennial Year (1967) with final competitions at Saint John, New Brunswick. This was funded by the National Centennial Committee in conjunction with Provincial governments. The Federation of Canadian Music Festivals, founded in 1949, was primarily responsible for its organization and administration.

In 1972, the National Festival was instituted on an annual basis, with final competitions held in early September at the Canadian National Exhibition.

In 1973, the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce became the Festival's corporate sponsor....a relationship that was appreciated for 24 years.

In 1981, it was decided that the National Festival would be held in a different province each year.



PROCEDURE

Before competing in the National Music Festival, competitors must first qualify at a Local Music Festival in the province where they live or study. In the case of chamber groups, the majority of members must study or reside in the province they wish to represent. After attaining the required standard, they must be recommended by the adjudicator(s) to proceed to the Provincial level of competition. The winner in each class at the Provincial level of competition is then eligible to compete in the National Music Festival. An entry fee of \$200 per solo entry is required at the National level for live solo performances; \$500 per Chamber Ensemble, and \$125 per entry for those competing in percussion and choral classes by recording. Competitors are responsible for covering the cost of their travel, meals, and accommodation at the National Music Festival.

A high standard of music selection is expected at each level – Local Festival, Provincial Festival and National Festival. Selections must be of advanced difficulty and should include at least one large-scale work.

REGULATIONS (Classes 1 through 9)


GENERAL

- Competitors must read and comply with the rules and regulations governing the National Music Festival, including the Concept and Code of Conduct as set out in the Syllabus and Regulations. If clarification or assistance is needed, please contact your Provincial Administrator or the Executive Director of the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals.
- 2. The National Music Festival is open to "non-professional musicians who are:
 - i. 28 years or younger as of December 31 preceding the festival**
 - ii. Canadian citizens, or
 - living or studying in Canada, who perform at festivals affiliated through Provincial Music Festival Associations.

*A non-professional musician is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance of music in the particular category in which he or she is competing. This stipulation does not, however, preclude such a person having occasionally received remuneration for musical services rendered, even in the area in which he or she is competing. The competitor's signature is required on a national entry form confirming non-professional status. It is recommended that Local Festivals also have competitors verify, by signature, their non-professional status.

**Competitors 14 years and under (at the time of the National Music Festival) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

- Competitors can only be recommended to their Provincial Festival from one Local Festival. No competitor can represent more than one province, in a single discipline.
- 4. The majority of members in a chamber group must reside or study in the province they represent. The majority (50% or more) must consist of new members who have not participated in a first-place chamber group at the National Festival for the last three years.
- A signed recommendation from the adjudicator is required before any competitor may advance from the Local Festival to the Provincial Festival and Provincial Festival to the National Festival.
- 6. The signed Competitor entry form signifies knowledge of, and agreement with the General Regulations.
- 7. Competitors are prohibited from contact with the adjudicators until competitions are completed.
- 8. First, second and third placements are awarded at the discretion of the adjudicators.





- First-place winners are not eligible to compete in the same class at the National Music Festival for the following three years. Winners of the Grand Award are not eligible to compete again, in the same class.
- 10. Only FCMF sanctioned audio/video recording or photography is allowed.
- 11. The President of the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals is the final authority in all matters.

LOCAL FESTIVALS


 The maximum number of competitors recommended from each Local Festival to compete at the Provincial Festival in National Festival classes 1 through 9 inclusive is determined by the Provincial Association. The decision of a Provincial Association will apply equally to all Local festivals in that province. Note: To be eligible for the National Festival competition, a competitor must obtain a minimum mark of 85 in the appropriate classes at the Local Festival.

PROVINCIAL FESTIVALS

- Local Festival winners in Classes 1 through 9, if recommended, are eligible to compete at the Provincial Festival.
- Competitors are responsible for providing their own accompanist. Accompaniment is restricted to one piano in Classes 1 through 7, and 9.
- 3. At the Provincial Level of competition, no marks are given. The winner in each class, if recommended by the adjudicator, is eligible to compete in the National Music Festival. Alternates may be recommended at the discretion of the adjudicator should a satisfactory standard be attained.

NATIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL

- The adjudicator at the Provincial Festival may recommend a winner in each of Classes 1 through 9 to
 proceed to the National Music Festival, should a satisfactory standard be attained. If a recommended
 competitor is unable to participate, an alternate is eligible to enter (see Provincial Regulation #3). Only
 one substitution is permitted for a Chamber Group with the approval of the FCMF Executive Committee.
- Adjudicator recommendation and information forms of Provincial winners (and alternates, if any) must be submitted to the FCMF, within two weeks of the close of the Provincial Festival or by the entry closing date listed on the national registration form, whichever is earlier. Late or incomplete entries will not be accepted.
- 3. Competitors are:
 - responsible for their own equipment (except pianos, and props as outlined in Class 9).
 - required to perform in the Grand Awards concert when they place first in Classes 1 through 9 (with the exception of Class 7 – Percussion).
 - provided practise rooms as well as official rehearsal times in the performance hall.
 - given performance and master class adjudications following the conclusion of the competitions.
 - required to be in attendance at the National Music Festival for the Official Briefing through to the conclusion of the Grand Award Competition (note Dress Code on Page 17)





- advised to stay in the official accommodation from the evening of the competitor briefing to the end of the Grand Award Competition.
- · responsible for contact with, and payment for, their accompanists.
- The Federation of Canadian Music Festivals and the National Music Festival are not responsible for lost or damaged musical instruments

PERFORMANCE

- 1. Competitors must:
 - perform the repertoire indicated on their official National Entry Form which is to include the
 repertoire performed for, and recommended by, the adjudicator at the Provincial Festival. Entry
 forms must be submitted complete with the names and numbers of movements identified and the
 full name of the composer.
 - provide <u>two</u> original scores, (except percussion who must provide one digital copy with their
 recording) or authorized copies of music containing solo and accompaniment in the proper key, one
 for the adjudicator and one for the accompanist. When possible, please provide an additional score
 or authorized copy for the second adjudicator. All copyrights must be observed. As an aid to the
 adjudicators, competitors must number the first bar of each line.
- 2. Competitors are:
 - allowed 60 minutes inclusive at the National level and Grand Award Competitors are allowed 10 minutes inclusive.
 - In Classes 1 through 8 the performance begins when the first note of the performance is heard and ends with the last note.
 - In Class 9 the performance begins and ends with the first and last word, movement or note.
 - advised to reflect a variety of styles and periods in their choice of repertoire. They are also
 encouraged to use Canadian compositions in their performances.
- Repetition of music is not allowed for competitors returning to the National Music Festival. This also applies to Chamber Groups where more than one member returns.
- Memory work is mandatory in all solo classes except for Percussion (multi-instrument works and snare drum) and Chamber.
- 5. Oral introductions are not permitted in any discipline.
- 6. Accompaniment is restricted to the piano, unless otherwise indicated in the score.

The use of photocopied, duplicated, or altered copyright music by competitors or accompanists in the National Music Festival will not be tolerated.



CLASS 1 - VOCAL SOLO, ANY VOICE

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform the selection(s) on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. The recommended selections must include an Advanced operatic aria and sacred aria from standard repertoire with recitative where applicable and at least one movement of a multi-movement work/song cycle.

An own choice selection is defined as "a single movement composition or one or more movements of a multimovement composition". Song cycles are an example of a multi-movement work.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced selection from an Opera, with recitative where applicable, original key, original language; advanced Sacred Aria (Aria from an Oratorio, a work of J.S. Bach, or other major sacred work), with recitative where applicable; and at least one movement of a multi-movement work/song cycle; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Two or more languages to be included. Competitors must perform three selections consisting of:

- One selection from an Opera, with recitative where applicable, from advanced repertoire, original key, original language.
- One Aria from a major sacred work, with recitative where applicable, from advanced repertoire, original key, language optional.
- Multi-movement/song cycle art song from advanced repertoire at least three movements of the selection to be performed at the National Festival, or a complete song cycle if less than four movements.

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Three or more languages to be included. Competitors must perform five selections consisting of:

- One selection from an Opera, with recitative where applicable; from advanced repertoire original key, original language as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- One sacred Aria (Aria from an Oratorio, a work of J.S. Bach, or other major sacred work), with recitative where applicable, from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- Multi-movement / song cycle art song from advanced repertoire at least four movements of the selection or the complete song cycle if less than four movements, as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- 4. Own choice selection from advanced repertoire, which may not be a multi-movement or song cycle.
- 5. Own choice selection from advanced repertoire, which may not be a multi-movement or song cycle.



CLASS 2 - PIANO SOLO

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- · an advanced Sonata, Concerto or Concerted Work; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Note: A Concerto or a Concerted Work is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. Only one Concerto is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- At least two consecutive movements of an advanced Sonata or Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Sonata, Concerto, or Concerted Work as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.



CLASS 3 - STRING SOLO

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Instrument must be stated on entry form. Guitar performers must enter Class 4.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from

- an advanced Concerto, Concerted Work; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Note: A Concerto or a Concerted Work is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. Only one Concerto is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. At least two consecutive movements of an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Concerto or Concerted Work as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

CLASS 4 - CLASSICAL GUITAR SOLO

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Piano accompaniment is permitted, where appropriate.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced work; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Note: A Concerto or a Concerted Work is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. Only one Concerto is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- One own choice selection of an advanced work, that may be a multi-movement work, or at least two consecutive movements of a Concerto.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform three selections consisting of:

- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival; additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending upon time. If a concerto, complete Concerto must be performed.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival (may not be another Concerto).
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

CLASS 5 - WOODWIND SOLO

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Instrument must be stated on entry form.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced Concerto, Concerted Work; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Note: A Concerto or a Concerted Work is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. Only one Concerto is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. At least two consecutive movements of an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

CLASS 6 - BRASS SOLO

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Instrument must be stated on entry form.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced Concerto, Concerted Work; or
- National Class, as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Note: A Concerto or a Concerted Work is defined as any composition originally written for solo instrument with orchestral accompaniment. Only one Concerto is permitted.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. At least two consecutive movements of an advanced Concerto, or a complete Concerted Work.
- One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another Concerto or another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. Complete advanced Concerto or Concerted Work as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival (may not be another Concerto). If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.

CLASS 7 - PERCUSSION SOLO - BY RECORDING

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform the selection from advanced repertoire on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Instruments must be stated on entry form. Piano accompaniment is permitted, where appropriate. All works, for single percussion instruments must be memorized. For multi-instrument works and snare drum, memorization is encouraged, but not required.

RECORDINGS ARE ADJUDICATED AND THE WINNERS WILL BE NOTIFIED.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced work; or
- National Class as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections

- 1. One work for Keyboard Percussion from advanced repertoire (eg. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone)
- 2. One work for Timpani or Multi-percussion or Snare Drum from advanced repertoire

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes inclusive. Competitors must perform three selections.

- 1. One work for Keyboard Percussion from advanced repertoire (eg. marimba, vibraphone, xylophone)
- 2. One work for Timpani or Multi-percussion or Snare Drum from advanced repertoire
- 3. One own choice from advanced repertoire

Percussion Entry Regulations and Guidelines:

- Only MP4 recordings or via private YouTube are acceptable formats for the submission of percussion entries.
- Ensure that you submit a high quality recording. Competitors will be notified of any technical problems with the recording.
- NO EDITING IS ALLOWED. The recording must be recorded as one, with no interruptions. Keep the camera
 running in-between selections, no matter how long the pause. Do not stop recording for general background
 noise, unless it is so loud that it will affect the sound quality. Follow the exact order of repertoire, as it is listed
 on the entry form. Do not announce your name and try to avoid recording your voice.
- One original music score for each selection, with the first bar of each line numbered, must be submitted with
 recording.
- An entry fee of \$125 is required. Please submit your recording at least one week before the deadline. Only
 entries received on or before the entry deadline will be eligible.



CLASS 8 - CHAMBER GROUP

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform at least two consecutive movements of the advanced selection on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Voice category and Instruments must be stated on entry form.

A combination of any recognized orchestral instruments including harp, guitar, recorder and/or percussion with or without piano and/or one voice, with a minimum of 3 to a maximum of 6 performers each having their own part. When piano is included, the piano part must be original and not an orchestral reduction. Instrumentation and amplification may be used only as indicated in the original score.

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- an advanced work; or
- National Class as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform two selections consisting of:

- 1. At least two consecutive movements of own choice advanced selection performed at Local level.
- 2. One own choice selection from advanced repertoire (may not be another movement of the above).

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes including set up, tuning, pauses, and striking (removal of equipment). Competitors must perform **two selections** consisting of:

- 1. Complete own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival.
- Own choice selection from advanced repertoire as recommended from Provincial Festival. If this selection is from a multi-movement work, additional movements or the complete work may be performed depending on time.



CLASS 9 - MUSICAL THEATRE SOLO, ANY VOICE

Competitors proceeding to the Provincial level of competition must perform the selection(s) on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. The recommended selections must include a Ballad and Up-Tempo work. The term "Up-Tempo" is used to describe music with a lively tempo, often comedy, e.g. – "One Hundred Easy Ways" (from *Wonderful Town*). The term "Ballad" is used to describe music with a slower tempo, often of a serious or introspective nature, e.g. – "On My Own" (from *Les Misérables*).

All selections are to be sung from a published score, in any published key of a staged musical. Competitors may use: costumes, one {1} hand prop per selection (a table, chair, and coat rack is provided). Spoken passages are allowed only if published in the script/score provided. The original copy can be the Broadway score, from an Anthology, or purchased online (proof of purchase must be produced. Proof of purchase must be shown for all online purchases.

Selections are not to include operetta/light opera (e.g. Romberg, Johann Strauss, Lehär, and Offenbach).

Local Festival

Competitors must be recommended to Provincials from:

- two selections consisting of the following: Musical Theatre Ballad and Musical Theatre Up-Tempo; or
- National Class as provided for in the Provincial/Local Festival Syllabus.

Provincial Festival

Maximum time limit to be determined by the Provincial Association. Competitors must perform three selections consisting of:

- 1. Musical Theatre Ballad
- 2. Musical Theatre Up-Tempo
- 3. Own Choice*

National Festival

Maximum time limit of 60 minutes (including costume changes). Competitors must perform five selections consisisting of:

- 1. Musical Theatre Ballad as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 2. Musical Theatre Up-Tempo as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 3. Own choice selection as recommended from Provincial Festival
- 4. Own choice*
- 5. Own choice*

*At the National Festival, five contrasting pieces in different tempi and from different eras are to be performed. At least two selections must have been performed before 1964. One selection by Sondheim is recommended.



CHORAL CLASSES AND REGULATIONS

Note: Choirs submitting recordings to the Provincial level of competition must perform the same selections on which they were recommended by the adjudicator at the Local level. Please note that the definition of the term 'selection' is "one piece of music by a composer, and not two or more short pieces from a collection, cycle or larger work".

- Participation is limited to amateur Canadian choirs, performing in the appropriate class(es) at affiliated festivals.
- 2. A choir may enter only one choral class at the National level.
- A Festival official must supervise and witness the recording of the performance of choirs recommended for Provincial/National competitions.
- Only MP3 recordings, are acceptable formats for the submission of choral entries. If a recording is submitted for adjudication at the Provincial Level, the same one must be submitted to the National Level.
- Recordings must be done by May 15, with the same choir, conductor, accompanist, and accompaniment as in the original performance. The recording must be the first take.
- No acoustic or electronic compensation, filtering, or other enhancement is to be used while (or post) recording.
- Recordings and music scores should contain no reference to the name of the choir, its conductor or the Festival from which it has been sent.
- 8. Recorded Choral entries must be submitted as follows:
 - MP3 format of recordings are to be uploaded during the on-line registration process.
 - · A clear, scanned copy of the score (including a picture of the cover) must also be uploaded.
 - A short biography of the choir, waiver, and media contacts are to be uploaded during the on-line registration process.
 - All materials must be received by entry deadline.
- 9. All copyrights regarding music must be observed.
- 10. An entry fee of \$125 per choir is required at the National level.

The competition is conducted at three progressive levels:

Local Festival

Adjudicators at the Local Festival may choose, in each of the Choral categories, choirs that are felt to be of National standard. Written recommendation along with recordings and a digital copy of the music scores must be submitted to the Provincial Administrator.

Provincial Festival

Adjudicators at the Provincial Festival may choose, in each category submitted, one choir that is felt to be of a National standard. The written recommendation along with the recording and a digital copy of the music scores as outlined above must be submitted by July 1st.

National Festival

Recordings are adjudicated and the winners are notified.



The National Music Festival provides opportunities for the following types of choral groups:

Ensemble	limited to 6 to 12 singers.
School choirs	must have a minimum of 13 singers all from one school.
Community choirs	must have a minimum of 13 singers and are not school choirs.
Male voice choirs	may be school or community and may be unchanged or changed voices, or
	a combination of them.

These rules apply to all classes:

- Only selections performed, adjudicated and recommended from Local and Provincial Festivals are acceptable.
- b. The competition is based on the performance of TWO CONTRASTING SELECTIONS, only one of which may include brief solo or solo ensemble passages.
- c. The total number of bars of the solo or solo ensemble passage(s) must not exceed 10% of the total length of the selection. Please note that the definition of the term 'selection' is "one piece of music by a composer, and not two or more short pieces from a collection, cycle or larger work".
- d. In classes limited by an upper age, 5% of the members may exceed the age limit by not more than two years.
- e. Ages are determined as of December 31 preceding the Festival.

Each of the four types of choirs listed above may be limited by age, gender, or other restrictions.

ENSEMBLE:

- The Richard W. Cooke Award (Class 104)
- must be an ensemble (6-12 singers)
- at least one selection, in three or more parts

SCHOOL CHOIR:

The members of a school choir must all be from the same school. Only one folk song is permitted.

Paul J. Bourret Award (Class 103)

- singers, 19 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in three or more parts

David Ouchterlony Award (Class 106)

- singers, 16 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in two or more parts

Florine Després Award (Class 108)

- singers, 12 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in two or more parts

COMMUNITY CHOIR

A minimum of 13 singers is required. Only one folk song is permitted.

The Honourable Barbara A. Hagerman Award (Class 100)

- the majority of members, 19 years of age or over
- at least one selection, sung in three or more parts

George S. Mathieson Award (Class 102)

- singers, 19 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in three or more parts

Dr. & Mrs. J.F.K. English Award (Class 105)

singers, 16 years of age and under
 at least one selection, sung in three or more parts

Margaret Wharton Memorial Award (Class 107)

- singers, 12 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in two or more parts

Barbara Clark Award (Class 109)

- singers, 25 years of age and under
- at least one selection, sung in three or more parts.

MALE CHOIR:

The City of Lincoln Award (Class 101)

- restricted to male singers (no age limitation)
- · at least one selection, sung in three or more parts



COMPETITOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Competitors are guests of the National Music Festival and hosting organization. This code has been developed to provide the best conditions for competition and to uphold FCMF's important values.

- Competitors are to remain for the entire Festival and take part in the briefing session, reception, performance workshop classes, adjudications, Host Night and the Grand Award Competition.
- 2) Dress Code (see below), must be observed.
- The following applies to all competitors under the age of majority (in the host province) who are staying in the official accommodation:
 - Curfew is 11:00 pm.
 - · Competitors must have permission of their Provincial designate to leave the Festival site.
 - No alcoholic beverages or illegal substances are allowed
 - Quiet hours between 11:00 pm and 8:00 am must be observed
- Practice and rehearsal rooms will be available for all competitors/accompanists and times must be observed.
- 5) Competitors are encouraged to attend as many of the competitions as possible.
- 6) It is the responsibility of each competitor to read and comply with all regulations as set out in the Code of Conduct and the Official Regulations and Syllabus. Any infringement of rules may result in disqualification.
