# **Lenten Challenge**



On Ash Wednesday, we were invited to Lent: As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

(Ash Wednesday Liturgy)

Lent is a season of looking at our lives through a microscope. Some people respond by "cleaning out" clothing and closets and donate to local thrift stores. Some may accept a change by reading their bibles for an extra 5 minutes. Some people spend this season intentionally serving others. Lent is a season.

Discipleship is not a season, but rather a way of life that continues for 24/7/365. Discipleship is the permanent change in our daily life which causes the realization of the kingdom. As a disciple of Christ, we focus our attention to live "more like Jesus" in every aspect of our lives. We commit to a *permanent change* in our lives, for the sake of the Gospel. Disciples undertake the permanent change to discipleship.

As disciples of Christ who call Mt. Hermon "home", we accept the challenge to discipleship. Join in the season of Lent as we examination and evaluate our lives through a microscope. We examine not to be critical of our lives and life choices, but rather, we examine and align our lives with the life of Christ.

We will begin a series of Bible Studies: "A Call to Discipleship" and the first study will be led by Diane Boulware. The study will be on-line only and will be held on Wednesdays during Lent. A second study will begin after Easter and will be centered around the Disney Movie, Moana.

Discipleship is the core of who we are as followers of Christ. Let's take this challenge together and deepen our discipleship.

#### Congregational Council Mini Minutes January 10, 2021 via Zoom

**ADOPTION OF AGENDA:** Approved with no additions **ADOPTION OF MINUTES:** Approved with no corrections **REPORTS:** 

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. Preached funeral services of 3 members: Mike Watford, Lila Catt, and Lois Watson.
- Treasurer: Written report received for December 2020 with corrections and all of 2020. Parker has gone thru inactive line items of earmarked funds and recommends moving them to other funds or creating a new line-item earmarked fund for each. Please see copy of attached recommendations. Motion **APPROVED** to accept recommendations as amended on handout. Parker also reports a 2020 ending balance of \$67653.96 in Building on Holy Ground fund. He recommends we pay \$47,000 out of this fund towards the principal on our bank loan balance. Motion **APPROVED**.
- Financial Secretary: Written report received for December 2020 and all of 2020.

#### **Team Reports/Recommendations:**

- 1. Worship: Written report received from January 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. Worship Team recommends that in lieu of Easter lilies the funds given "in Honor" and "in Memory" be donated to the Fund for the Arts with a bulletin listing the honorariums and memorials. **APPROVED** with one no vote.
- 2. Support Team: Personnel Committee reports that there is no church owned computer for Music Director or Pastor to use at the church. Recommend purchase of desktop computer for Music Director with cost not to exceed \$750 and purchase of Mac desktop from Pastor Gina she has been using since start of her service for cost of \$1400 from Building Improvement Fund. **APPROVED.** Recommendation from Cemetery Committee that "All cemetery markers must be approved by the Cemetery Committee prior to fabrication for installation in our graveyard." **APPROVED.**
- 3. Care Teams: New care team listings for each council member distributed.
- 4. Outreach: Written report received for November 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. Free Garage Sale in December had 34 clients and donated items left over were donated to His House. The Angel Tree also distributed gifts to 34 children and 10 adults. The Food Pantry provided 40 Thanksgiving and Christmas meals to clients. Our Food Pantry increased services from 136 persons in 2019 to 874 persons in 2020. Each meal costs about \$20 so that was total of \$17,480 worth of food distributed in 2020 thru much appreciated donations to this non budgeted ministry of Mt. Hermon. In addition, our members made 500 face masks that were donated.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. Cross on Sanctuary: Signtech is currently building the cross.
- 2. Health & Safety Task Force: Written report received from January 7<sup>th</sup> meeting. Recommendation that Pastor Gina have discretion to conduct funerals in the sanctuary observing same safety protocols as for other services. **APPROVED.**

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Building Renovation & Repair Task Force: Our current bank loan expires on November 1, 2021, at interest rate of 3.99%. We propose making a list of repairs and renovations needed on our campus to prioritize and consider using the balance of our A/C loan to fund.

#### **Treasurer's Recommendations for Earmarked Funds**

- 1. Move <u>MHL Homework Center</u> balance to new fund "Community Outreach". (\$530.53)
  - Reason: We no longer have a Homework Center and the new program could be used for community outreach programs approved by the Outreach Committee.
- 2. Move <u>Congregational Retreat</u> balance to <u>Leadership Retreat</u>. (\$973.50) Reason: Funds have been in the account for over 10 years and not been used. The Leadership Retreat Fund is sometimes used to pay for facilitators and other expenses of the retreat. All money in the account comes from Council Members.
- 3. Move <u>Christian Edu Service Pro</u> balance to new fund "<u>Children's Programs</u>" (\$49.87)
  - Reason: The funds could be spent for any approved activities for the children not provided for in the budget.

4. Move <u>Children's Designated Con balance to new fund "Children's Programs"</u> (\$1685.54)

Reason: I have no record of what they were designated for. The funds could be spent for any approved activities for the children not provided for in the budget.

- 5. Move <u>Special Flower Fund</u> balance to a new fund "Funeral Meals" (\$1205.06) Reason: There is no longer an official WELCA organization at Mt. Hermon to provide the meals as they had in the past.
- 6. Move <u>WELCA Special Offering</u> balance to a new fund "Women's Center in Tanzania" (\$784.59).

Reason: There is no longer an official WELCA organization at Mt. Hermon to transfer the funds to.

7. Move <u>Playground Equipment</u> fund balance to new fund "<u>Children's Programs</u>" (\$182.00)

Reason: Funds have been in the account for over 10 years and not been used. The funds could be spent for any approved activities for the children not provided for in the budget.

**Current Non-Food Needs** – Deodorant, Laundry Detergent, Dish Soap, Diapers.






