Tikkun Olam Opportunities/Community Announcements

To the Englewood Community,
Yom HaShoah will be commemorated on the evening of May 1, 2019. We are turning to our four participating Communities—Ahavath Torah, East Hill, Kehillat Keshet and Kol HaNeshamah—to work together on some new initiatives, projects that will come together that evening for what we are hopeful will be a most meaningful event:

1. We are looking to collect 525 names, along with their stories and photos, of Survivors who have passed that have ties to any of our four congregations.

2. Each name will be paired with one of the 525 chapters of Mishna, and we will be asking the greater Englewood community to sign up to commit to learning one or more chapters between now and May 1. More information about participating in the siyum will be available in the coming months.

3. We will be creating our own collective community exhibit of artifacts from before and during the Holocaust. It has been several years since we last included this project in our Yom HaShoah commemoration, and we are hoping that past participants will once again share their precious items. Additionally, many new families have joined our congregations since that time, and we are looking for new additions to our gallery. Items to be considered might include photographs, Judaica, clothing, books, documents...in short, any mementos precious to your families. The Yom HaShoah Committee members will photograph each object and write a brief description based on information provided, which will be placed near the item on display at the event and documented in a catalogue. The various items will be collected just before the week of the event to best protect these precious mementos.
