Notes from the President's Desk

The 'Annual Fall Carport Sale' is on hold until a volunteer coordinator steps up. The previous coordinator is too busy this year. (Anyone interested?) Let us know.

Several residents continue to ignore the obligations of the CC&R's pertaining to use of carports and/or parking. Below is quoted the regulation being disregarded.

ARTICLE XIV SECTION (A)

"Not more than two vehicles may be permanently parked on the premises or adjacent to any Lot. All vehicles permanently parked on the premises are to be in operation condition. No Lot, including the driveway, or carport thereof, may be used for the purpose of maintenance, repair, rebuilding, dismantling, repairing or servicing of any kind of vehicle. Vehicles must be parked either in the carport or driveway of the unit and not in the yards thereof."

ARTICLE X

"All clothes lines, equipment, service yards, storage units and wood piles shall be kept at the rear of the dwelling and below the party wall so as to conceal them from view of neighboring units and streets. All rubbish, trash or garbage shall be removed from the premises and shall not be allowed to accumulate."

"Garbage and recycle material may be stored in the carports of the units, but must be screened from view in a manner acceptable to the Board." Containers may not be placed on the street sooner than sunset on the day prior to scheduled removal by The City of Scottsdale and must be removed from the street prior to sundown on the day of removal."

I will once again remind you, each resident signed an agreement (contract) that they have read and understand the CC&R's and By Laws of the Association. A 'Compliance Committee' was appointed on 10/1/2016 to monitor and report to the Board any violations occurring, after which a letter will be sent to the violator.




SCOTTSDALE TROLLEY
