
## Ham Radio in Public Service – Beyond EmComm

Amateur radio operators get involved in the art and science of radio for a variety of reasons: an interest in electronics, a desire to communicate beyond our immediate circle of friends and family, an interest in emergency communications, or just because it sounds like fun! But there is, of course, another function of ham radio operators: to be of service to the communities in which we live.

One of our primary service goals is to be prepared to serve as an emergency communications resource for the general public and first responders if first line methods such as cellular and landline phones fail. That's why we have our Saturday Em Comm nets, and why some of us participate in events such as the biannual Simulated Emergency Tests (SETs) organized by the KARO ECHO Ham Radio Association.

Another way we can be of service is to provide communications for planned, nonemergency community events, such as marathons, Scouting events, bike rides, or festivals. A typical race or ride or festival covers a large area, with different stops or booths or checkpoints for its participants. Stationing an amateur radio operator at these


spots can help the event organizers keep track of problems in any specific zone, and allows for a quick dispatch of help from the main hub if first aid or additional supplies are needed.



Not only does this kind of public service build goodwill between the club and the larger community, it also functions as a sort of "free advertising" to encourage interest in the club and ham radio in general.

To be effective in this area of public service, we would need at least a modicum of organization – namely, a member who is willing to serve as the liaison between the club and the organizers of community events, and who could recruit other members to participate in the events. There's no need to reinvent the wheel: other local clubs that have public service coordinators or committees could be great resources for a CCCC liaison, to help get the position "off the ground."

This would be a great opportunity for a new ham, or an experienced ham who is looking for a new challenge! So...are you interested? Reach out to any of the board members (listed at the end of the newsletter) and let us know! Thank you to Don Simon, NI6A, for the idea and context for this article.



## **CCCC Monthly Zoom Meeting Minutes, March 10, 2024**

The monthly Zoom meeting was brought to order by President Wing K6YDE, at 10:05 AM. Present were Audrey W6BBQ, Howdy KE6BEE, Jan AC5RB, Ron KE6RS, Karen KK6ZPM, Jay KJ6WSS, Karen KK6ZPM, Xia K2XIA, Don NI6A, and DJ KJ6DJ.



Wing thanked everyone for their support and adjusting to the time change. He said the new editor, Xia, did a fantastic job on our newsletter, the Communicator.

MINUTES: Audrey moved that the minutes of the February 2024 meeting be accepted; seconded by Karen. MOTION CARRIED.

MEMBERSHIP: Audrey said there was no change in the membership since last report. She has sent out self-addressed envelopes to those members that hadn't renewed yet and will be putting together the 2024 roster.

TREASURER REPORT: The report by Audrey will be found in the Communicator

TRIVIA: Jan said after tallying 46 questions, there were 26 different participants, 2l questions everyone got correct and there was none that stumped everyone. She thanked everyone for their participation.

NET CONTROLS: Xia said she was enjoying the trivia, wished that there were more than 4-6 participants, and sometimes there were 10-12. That was consensus from other Net Controls.

Karen said she has been encouraging GMRS users to listen to our nets, especially the Saturday morning nets where we have 2 meter, 440 and 220 and FL-digi. The GMRSers do not have the license to talk on ham frequencies. She does a first Wednesday net for the GMRS people and is getting good participation.

Howdy said the 25 foot mast has been mounted. He keeps checking and working to keep things going. Our 440 frequency is close to the GMRS radio frequencies so they can monitor. He is getting everything set up to switch channels programmed. Wing thanked him for setting up opportunities that would be helpful in emergency. Wing also reminded us that anyone can listen to our transmissions, so be careful of personal information over the air.

DJ has been handling Alvin KK6UQX's nets while he is not able to connect. He noted that all our nets are doing by Board members and encourages others to help out, even if not on regular basis. Good experience also in case of emergency. So far no one has responded. Xia suggested maybe individuals could be encouraged to volunteer to do net control duty as a one-off, just to try it out; DJ would like to see volunteers on a rotation like our Thursday evening nets.

TECH REPORT: Howdy has been working on good stewardship of our site. He proposes to build a retaining wall to deal with erosions around the transformer box for access. He proposed it would take a small volunteer work party and a small amount of materials, maybe \$70.00 worth, to solve that situation. It is not enough to have the gravel and take care of the weeds. The whole project would include a retaining wall about 18 inches high on two adjoining sides, one 6 foot long, the other 4 foot long. Audrey made a motion to approve up to \$100 for the project; Jan seconded. MOTION CARRIED

Howdy said this project could be done within next couple of weeks. He also said it could be combined with a second project for the right hand container, which leans now, due to time and the wet weather. The supports are rusting out and the weight of building is a serious concern. Jay suggested a solution to put in concrete footing and add five piers to support it. Also, a plywood box is deteriorating, and should be dismantled and removed. Jay was concerned the plywood is combustible and should have been taken out. A work party to establish access and removal would run around \$400.00. To do those projects including wall would be \$500.00. Audrey moved that we approve these projects; Jan seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

In discussion, there were questions about ownership and who responsible for various upkeep. There are different agencies involved. Howdy has tried to contact ones involved. no responses. Wing said to be sure to document everything with pictures. It would be good will for us to take care of it. Jay said that the Mt. Diablo club has to pay \$500 a month for its repeater station; we have a very low cost and our good will could avoid problems ahead. The City of Richmond has a repeater up in our area also.

Howdy showed a sample of the aluminum sign to post to identify our area. It would be about 12x18 inches. There was discussion about adding more information about our frequencies and services we provide like Mesh, WinLink, Packet as well as public service, website, and contact information. He estimated the cost to be around \$50.00. The issue has been deferred for more input.
