### **Core Functions of Public Health**

- Assessment
- Assurance
- Policy development



#### **Essential Public Health Services**

- Monitor health status to identify community health problems
- Diagnose and investigate health problems and health hazards
- Inform, educate, and empower people about health issues
- Mobilize community partnerships to identify and solve health problems



# Essential Public Health Services (cont.)

- Develop policies and plans that support individual and community health efforts
- Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety
- Link people to needed person health services and assure the provision of healthcare when otherwise unavailable




# Essential Public Health Services (cont.)








# National Public Health Performance Standards Program

- The National Public Health Performance Standards is a standardized tool used to measure infrastructure and capacity of a public health system, jurisdiction, and/or a governing body
- It is a systematic way of collecting and analyzing data to assist public health systems in developing a benchmark for public health activities

## Operational Definition of a Functional Local Health Department

- The Operational Definition of a Functional Local Health Department defines what people in any community can reasonably expect from their local health department (LHD), and it serves as the framework for LHD standards in the voluntary national accreditation program that is under development. <a href="https://www.naccho.org">www.naccho.org</a>

### **Continuous Quality Improvement**

- Quality in public health is the degree to which policies, programs, services, and research for the population increase desired health outcomes and conditions in which the population can be healthy.
