## The Drug Cartel Connection

- Nearly 1,000 federal \& local officers raided over 70 shops in LA's Fashion District for money laundering Mexican drug cartel money -
 \$65M seized ${ }_{\text {gnorat }}$


## The Russian Connection to ORC Public Enemy \#1

- Ringleader \& "World's Top Salesman" - cybercriminal 118,000 stolen CC numbers - \$59M (22514)
- Bulgarian, Chicago CC fraud ring boss threatened rival 'would be cut into pieces' (4121/14)
- \$1.1M N.Y. fraudster - 5 years Fed. Prison time for Disney World Ticket scam (122914)
- Staten Island man pleads guilty - built network of false identities - $\$ 200 \mathrm{M}$ international CC scheme ${ }_{(51414)}$


## The Middle Eastern Connection The Convenience Store Industry

- Rochester, NY Food Mart store owner plotted to send jihadists to Syria, kill U.S. troops himself ${ }_{(91814)}$
- 7-Eleven undercover operation shows Long Island 5 store franchisee underreporting sales, pocketing excess cash (6i24113)
- UPDATE: "Baby formula rings may fund terrorist groups" - The National Retail Federation unveiled in a 200 page report that 7 out of 10 cases of baby formula sales involve fencing operations run by citizens of Middle Eastern origin. (514141)


## The 'online' Impact

- Law Enforcement in FL Bust Two MultiMillion Dollar ORC Cases: $\$ 3.2 \mathrm{M}$ selling online
- Florida deputies bust \$1 million retail theft ring (7/7/14)
- Arrests Made in Nationwide Organized Retail \$2 Million Theft of Baby Formula (77714)



## The 'online' Impact

- From Arizona to NY, thieves turn Legos into hard cash (8/19/14)
- Four Arrested After \$200K Worth of Legos Found in Theft Investigation in Phoenix (818814)
- Burlington man accused of stealing $\$ 600 \mathrm{~K}$ in books, Lego toys (5/29/13)
- The Lego King - A Silicon Valley SAP VP software executive put fake bar codes on Lego sets at various Target stores, bought the toys at a steep discount, then sold them online for thousands of dollars (5/23/12)
