Don't walk in prepared ski tracks.

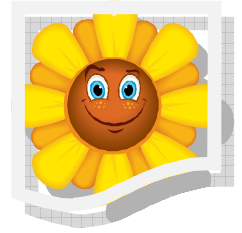
Keep control over dogs and keep them on a leash.

DISTRICT 6 SCHOLARSHIPS

The 6th District will award three \$1,000 scholarships to members in good standing, their children or grandchildren who are Unge Venner members in any lodge in the 6th District. They must attend a 4 year accredited college or university in the USA as a fulltime undergraduate in their sophomore, junior or senior year and have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a scale wherein A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1. When an applicant is deemed worthy of a scholarship (recommended by the 6th District Scholarship Committee and approved by the 6th District board) the funds will be jointly paid to the applicant & to the institution he or she is attending. **Applications must be submitted to the scholarship committee by April 1 of the application year.**

Also the 6th District scholarship to a 2 week Concordia Language Camp Summer Session at The Norwegian Village or "Skogfjorden" in the amount of about \$1700.00, for a camper over the age 13. The applicant must be a Heritage or Unge Venner member of a 6th District lodge. Applications must be submitted to the scholarship committee by May 1 of the application year. Visit website www.ConcordiaLanguageVillages.org for information & applications for the Norwegian Village or "Skogfjorden." The applicant must also apply directly to and meet all requirements of Concordia Language Camp. Those interested in applying for the scholarship for the Concordia Language Camp may get the district applications from members of the scholarship committee.

BANK TESTS HONESTY OF OSLO RESIDENTS

In early January *SpareBank 1 Oslo* crafted a plan to test the honesty of area residents by leaving 10 wallets containing cash, credit cards and personal and financial items in locations across the city. In the event that a wallet was returned, the bank would then reward the finder with 10 times the amount of cash contained in the wallet—an amount significantly higher than the standard 10 percent typically given for returned wallets. The plan is part of a larger initiative titled *Vi bryr oss om Oslo* or "We Care about Oslo," a collaboration between *Radio 1* and *SpareBank 1 Oslo* with the goal of encouraging and inspiring a positive attitude.

To the surprise of project organizers, all 10 wallets were returned with all their contents intact. "I was positive about what kind of results we'd get before we started, but I hadn't expected that fully 100 percent of the wallets would be returned," said Svein Øvregård.

University of Oslo Professor, Ottar Hellevik, shared a similar surprise to the project's outcome, saying "our numbers have shown that Norwegians' ethics have been sinking, so this is encouraging."

While the bank's project results were impressive, studies suggest that people may feel quite differently about returning found money that isn't accompanied by identification. Studies conducted in 1985 and 2009 by Synovate—a global market research company—showed a significant decrease in the number of people who felt it was wrong to keep found money, from 63% to 33%.

Whatever the reason, leader of the "We care about the Oslo" project, Svein Øvregård, is delighted with the result.

NORWEGIAN COFFEE BUNS (HVETEBOLLER)



The Great Scandinavian Baking Book
by Beatrice Ojakangas

These simple buns are served fresh with morning coffee.
Makes 24 rolls.

- 2 packages active dry yeast
- ½ cup warm water, 105°F to 115°F
- ⅓ cup sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- ½ cup melted butter
- 1 tsp. pulverized cardamom seeds
- 2 cups milk, scalded and cooled to lukewarm
- 6 to 6½ cups all-purpose flour

Glaze

- 1 slightly beaten egg
- 2 tbs. milk
- pearl sugar, plain sugar, or crushed sugar cubes for topping

In a large mixing bowl, dissolve the yeast in the warm water. Add a pinch of the sugar and let stand 5 minutes until yeast forms. Stir in the remaining sugar, salt, butter, cardamom and milk.

Add half the flour and beat until smooth and satiny. Add the remaining flour slowly, stirring until mixture will not absorb more flour. Let stand 15 minutes.

Turn dough out onto a lightly floured board and knead until smooth and satiny, 5 to 10 minutes. Wash bowl, grease it, and place dough in bowl, turning to grease top. Cover and let rise until doubled, about 1 hour.

Turn dough out onto a lightly oiled surface. Divide into 24 parts. Shape into smooth balls.

Cover baking sheets with parchment or lightly grease them. Place dough on baking sheets and let rise until almost doubled, about 45 minutes. Preheat oven to 375°F.

Mix egg and milk and brush rolls with the mixture. Sprinkle with the sugar. Bake 15 minutes or until golden.
