## **Presentation by Marta Daniels**

Civil Rights activist, author, historian and CLT member, Marta Daniels, will provide a power point presentation about Judge Motley to mark the inclusion of the Chester Land Trust's *Constance Baker Motley Preserve* as a Heritage Site on the CT Freedom Trail. The designation places it among a select few sites that honor extraordinary individuals whose lives have expanded the circle of freedom and opportunity for African Americans in Connecticut and the nation. Marta's presentation includes Judge Motley's early life in New Haven, her trailblazing role as an NAACP attorney de-segregating schools in the South, and her remarkable career as the first female African American Federal District Court Judge. The presentation concludes with details of her life in Chester with images provided by the Motley family.

As a legendary civil rights attorney, a public servant and pioneering federal courtroom jurist, Motley's distinguished legal career shaped American history in civil rights, women's rights and American jurisprudence. Members of the legal community in the lower CT River Valley are especially encouraged to attend to learn more about the extraordinary achievements of a remarkable legal agent on behalf of equal justice under law.
