Dear Church Family,

I am excited to share a recent development with you. Earlier this year I was nominated for a fellowship through the Collegeville Institute. I applied for the fellowship and was just notified of my acceptance along with 11 other pastors at the beginning of September. I believe this opportunity will contribute to my own development and to our church and community.

The Collegeville Institute Rural Minnesota Fellows Program brings together an ecumenical group of pastors from rural Minnesota with professionals from other sectors of rural Minnesota society in order to strengthen these religious leaders' sense of themselves as civic leaders and public theologians. Clergy who serve rural areas in Minnesota are often underserved by leadership development opportunities designed to meet their specific needs: we hope to help address this deficit through the Rural Fellows Program.

This unique leadership development opportunity is for pastors in the early to middle years of their career. The program is designed, then, for those who are approximately 5 to 15 years out of seminary, with 20 or more years to give in ministry to church and community. The first cohort of 12 fellows will begin in October 2017 and end in July 2019.

Rural ministry must pay attention to the larger context within which a congregation or parish lives out its mission. Such ministry responds to the issues affecting peoples' lives, and does so with compassion, wisdom, competence and hope.

Some of the topics we will be exploring include: The Changing Face of Minnesota and Its Implications for the Future Agriculture and Food Production The Rural Economy Beyond Farming Immigration as an Opportunity and a Challenge Health Care in Rural Minnesota Rural Poverty – Both Real and Hidden

As a Fellow I will:

Participate in an ecumenical colleague group of 12 individuals for 22 months

Attend eight cohort meetings in Collegeville, MN

Hear from civic and professional leaders and experts on key cultural issues

Sharpen my skills at social analysis and theological reflection

Expand my horizons concerning our rural Minnesota communities and my vision of myself as a pastoral leader Gain confidence to become active participants in conversations about matters of public import both within and outside the congregation


Plan a pastoral project for our congregation or community

Receive \$4,000 in stipends over the period of the program, and have all travel costs relating to meetings covered by the Collegeville Institute

Build a support system lasting past the Rural Minnesota Fellows Program

It has always been my desire to continue to learn and develop myself as your pastor both spiritually and intellectually so that I can best serve the church and its mission. I hope that this process will not only sharpen my own skills as a pastor and leader, but continue to feed into our church's desire to know Christ, to be like Christ, and to make him known in our surrounding communities.

Hi-League Campfire



Extraordinary archival footage is interwoven with interviews with friends, family and students of Bonhoeffer, with historians and theologians, and with the words of Bonheoffer himself, read by Maria Klaus Brandauer.'
