Our church program year ended with a blur of activity. It was a difficult two weeks, with memorial services for Teri Ochiltree and Earl Hammond, a burial service for Elaine Anderson, and the death of former CCJ Executive Director Mark Kubik. Our hearts and prayers go out to all who are grieving.

In the midst of all of that, we hosted the Ames Children's Choirs spring concert. It was great to see our church and parking lot filled to capacity, and to see Mindy (one of the directors) leading a wonderful concert with talented young people including Adde and Lucy Stegemöller, some of our regular Music Camp kids, and a cameo appearance by Emma Phomvisay. While it was a bit crowded, the light and the acoustics of our sanctuary make it a great venue for performances like this and I am glad that we are able to make it available to the community.

And then on May 21, our children and youth led us in a joyful worship celebration. I was impressed by their exuberance and poise and the fact that they were still able to have fun in the midst of it all as they put on skits and acted out Biblical stories. I was also impressed with what they are learning. In two of their skits, they presented alternate versions of the story based on accounts in the various gospels. Some people do not realize that the various gospels are different until they get to seminary! Our kids are learning in Church School. And they decided that while details might be different between Matthew and Mark and Luke, the essential truth of the scripture was the same – and that Jesus is alive!

Amidst all of the activity of recent days, we learned that our Office Manager, Bev Shirbroun, will be leaving us. Her husband Jim, a United Methodist minister who serves at Collegiate Methodist, will be the new pastor at Grace United Methodist in Sioux City beginning July 1. Bev has done a wonderful job for us and we will miss her. We pray for God's blessings on her and her family as they embark on a new adventure.

We have formed a search committee (John Anderson, Dianne Borgen, Susan Russell, and myself) and begun the process of searching for a new Office Manager. This transition comes at a (relatively) good time, as activity slows a bit in the summer. We will likely be without an Office Manager for a few weeks, and during that time we may need some assistance in the office, especially with folding bulletins. We will let you know!

In part because of the transition, this will serve as the *Spire* for June and July. We have a lot coming up this summer! With Spirited Listening, Fellowship Time each Sunday, Music Camp, Green Lake Music Conference, Church in the Park with our friends from the UCC and First Christian, there is a lot to look forward to. Along the way, I hope you will be able to take some time for rest and renewal. I'm looking forward to a baseball game in St. Louis and a trip to Portland for the American Baptist Biennial/Mission Summit, as well as a couple of days at the ocean while there.
