

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING

October 4, 2017

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Thomas Clark called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Trustees present: Scott Crandall, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Wes Howell, Guy Bakke, and Grace Bohall. Staff present: Town Manager Mark Campbell, Public Works Director Jason Bock, and Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

WIKBERG MOVED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES AS AMENDED. HOWELL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

HOWELL MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM SEPTEMBER 21, 2017 THROUGH OCTOBER 4, 2017 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$103,517.56. CRANDALL SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

CRANDALL MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Chris Sammons presented the board with an idea to reroute Highway 9 onto what is currently County Road 396, which goes between the airport and the fairgrounds.

Gary Bumgarner spoke to the board regarding the weed notice he received via certified mail. He felt that the town could have notified the violators better, rather than just sending them a certified letter, like a verbal notice first. The board agreed that more needs to be done to clean up the weeds and junk around town, including their own right of ways.

Manager Campbell presented the board with the 2018 draft budget. It reflects a 3% cost of living pay increase, a 1% increase in health insurance premiums, and some repairs to the water plant and town reservoir. He went over a few other items, and encouraged anyone to meet with him if they have questions or concerns.

The Mayor reported

- The month of September only saw 24% of average for the water month.
- He and Manager Campbell met with representatives from Grand River Ranch, to discuss the long term possibility of expanding the Jones #1 reservoir.
- He and Manager Campbell attended a mass economics presentation at the Grand County Commissioners meeting, and also attended a Rural Transportation Coordinating Council meeting.
- He and Shelly McManus from the Chamber attended a Rocky Mountain Initiative meeting about the over crowding in Rocky Mountain National Park.

There was no Police Chief report.


The Public Works Director reported:

- The divers will be back at the reservoir next week to do the repairs at the reservoir.
- He is still waiting on the reports for the work that needs to be done on the river pumps.
- They have been working on blowing out the sprinkler systems and preparing for the winter season.

The Manager Reported:

- He will be presenting the board with updated agreements with the county for the snow removal at the airport and the mag chloride application on Jackson Avenue.
- Next year, the town will be the permit holder for the fireworks, rather than the chamber of commerce.
