

### Wisdom From Afar....

Starting with *Rosh Hashana* and ending with *Yom Kippur*, the period of time that we sometimes refer to as the Days of Awe, is a time to reflect on our actions in the preceding year, realign our priorities, and begin the process of repentance or return (aka, *teshuvah*).

If approached in the right spirit, our High Holy Days liturgy can be so much more than a dutiful recitation, indeed, the songs and prayers have the power to inspire

our personal reflections and lead us on the path for a meaningful experience. For me, personally, the one prayer that touches me most profoundly is *Avinu Malkeinu* ["Our Father, Our King"].

Depending on which Jewish community you belong to, there can be as few as 22 verses and as many as 54 verses. The prayer can be chanted or sung to a variety of melodies. The words can sometimes vary, as well. The last verse can be sung by the entire congregation (the two lines that we actually know).

The origins of the prayer can be found in the *Talmud* (*Ta'anit 25b*). It comes from a story about a time of severe drought. "Rabbi Eliezer went before the Ark to lead prayers for rain and dutifully recited the 24 blessings for rain. But no rain came.

"Then Rabbi Akiva went before the Ark and said, very simply, 'Our Father, Our King, we have no other king but you. Our Father, Our King, for your sake have mercy on us." [Do these words sound familiar to you?]

## Temple Beth Elohim MOURNS THE LOSS OF

### **ELIZABETH MOSES**

Elizabeth Moses died peacefully in the morning of July 23, 2018.

Born in 1964 and a native of Sumter, Elizabeth was the daughter of Robert A. Moses and the late Harriett P. Moses.

She was a graduate of Wofford College (BS 1986) and the University of Massachusetts, Amherst (MS 1995). She spent the first two decades of her professional career working with marine life. This included positions at Sea World and the New England Aquarium as well as wildlife observations of whales and dolphins on a number of federally-sponsored research cruises. She was at sea in the North Atlantic, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Eastern Tropical Pacific. Elizabeth had many other interests which led to new careers, including writing, editing, photography, and transcription. She was

a longtime member of the Jewish Historical Society of South Carolina and worked for the Jewish Heritage Collection and the Jewish Studies Program at the College of Charleston. She spent ten years with the South Carolina Parks Service as an interpretive ranger with historic houses. Most recently she began a new job at the Sumter County Museum, which she dearly loved.

Throughout her life, Elizabeth met many wonderful people and made many friends. She loved to travel near or far and was grateful to her family for the opportunity to visit Pawleys Island, the North Carolina mountains, Canada, and Ireland. On her own, she travelled to Panama, Mexico, and Scotland. She considered the trip to Scotland in 2014 the best trip of her life.

She is survived by her father, Robert A. Moses and his wife Clara G. Moses; her sisters, Natalie Moses (Douglas Klaucke), Carol Moses (David Vasconcelos), Katherine Royer (Brad Royer), and Laura Moses; her niece/nephews and great niece/nephews as well as her great uncle, Herbert A. Moses and numerous cousins.

In accordance with Jewish tradition, Elizabeth will be buried in the Jewish Cemetery in Sumter. Only family will be in attendance.

A Memorial Service will be held at Temple Sinai in Sumter at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 25.

The family will receive friends following the memorial service at the Sumter County Museum Heritage Education Building in McKenzie Hall.

The family wishes to acknowledge the compassionate care provided by the cardiology and palliative care staff of MUSC, Charleston.

"And the rains came down. The Rabbis were amazed.

"A voice from heaven called out and said: 'It is not because this one [Rabbi Akiva] is greater than that one [Rabbi Eliezer], but rather that this one [Rabbi Akiva] is flexible and forgiving and that one [Rabbi Eliezer] is not flexible and forgiving."

For me, the message is clear: the path of *teshuvah* is best traveled with flexibility and forgiveness, with perhaps a good measure of kindness and humility, as well.

### New Memorial Plaques




