CONFERENCE CAKEWALKS

Remember the old "cakewalk" contests played at carnivals and fairs and school festivals?

You pay a dollar or two to enter. Music starts playing, everybody walks around these numbered placards placed on the ground, and when the music stops one lucky number wins a cake or some other prize. Win or lose it is a fun game.

The conference realignments of the past couple of years remind me of the cakewalks, only with winners landing in lucrative conferences paying out millions to members, and losers left out when the music stopped. The conference cakewalks have not been so fun for everyone.

Welcome back to THE BLITZ, where you always land on a lucky number and never get left out of the latest weekly college football news, information, and statistics.

We are still a week away from full conference play in college football, but one matchup caught my eye this week and brought to mind the winners and losers of the conference cakewalk: West Virginia at Maryland at 12:00 ET on the Big Ten Network. In my mind, those two schools epitomize some of the silliness and surprise of conference realignment these past few years.

West Virginia was a solid member of the Big East, a decent football league and excellent basketball conference. On the gridiron, the Mountaineers annually played traditional geographical foes like Pitt and Cincinnati, opponents with historical significance such as Syracuse, and a recently formed league rivalry with Louisville.

However, when the conference cakewalk music stopped, West Virginia ended up in \dots the Big 12?

This season Mountaineer fans have to travel to Texas to play in Lubbock and Austin, they can sojourn to Stillwater the week of Halloween to watch Oklahoma State, and finish up the season in Ames for the lowa State game the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Bundle up for that one.

Maryland was luckier. The Terps were a founding member of the ACC in 1953, but bolted for the big money of the Big Ten in 2014. Goodbye tradition, so long rivalries, see you later school heritage. What does the Big Ten get from adding Maryland? Not much other than the television sets along the Eastern seaboard and the Washington, DC, market. That is if anybody would really rather watch Maryland play Rutgers on the same Saturday as the Iron Bowl.

Look, the Big 12 is a fine football conference, and landing there was a pretty nice consolation for West Virginia; but there are no natural rivals to play and the travel is daunting from Morgantown to all those schools in Kansas, Oklahoma, and Texas. It is just not a good fit. Maryland in the Midwest-based Big Ten does not make much more sense.

AROUND THE NATION

There are several intriguing intersectional games this week. Jim Mora has UCLA (2-0) back in national contention as he takes the Bruins to the hill country of Austin to play Texas (1-1). First-year Longhorns coach Charlie Strong has been suspending people faster than you can keep count in establishing a tone of toughness and discipline. Another Big 12 teams hosts an out-of-conference opponent when Oklahoma (2-0) welcomes Tennessee (2-0) to Norman. The Volunteers are speedy but very young, while the Sooners are a popular pick to make the college football playoff. Arkansas (1-1) plays at Texas Tech (2-0) in another SEC-Big 12 pairing that might be worth a peek. The biggest conference game on the docket takes place in the SEC East, where South Carolina (1-1) hopes to jump back into the division race against Georgia (1-0). The Bulldogs are coming off a bye week.

GEORGIA AT SOUTH CAROLINA



Steve Spurrier and his South Carolina Gamecocks have their backs against the wall as they welcome Georgia to Williams-Brice Stadium. South Carolina is 0-1 in SEC play, having lost to Texas A&M 52-28 to open the 2014 season. If the Gamecocks want a chance to win the SEC Eastern Division, they must win this game. Quarterback Dylan Thompson and Running Back Mike Davis must be on their games for South Carolina, but it's the defense that's a concern. Not only did they surrender 52 to Texas A&M but East Carolina put up 23, so after 2 weeks they have allowed 75 points.

The Bulldogs had last week off, so they have had 2 weeks to prepare for South Carolina. Todd Gurley had a fantastic start to the season vs Clemson with 198 yards rushing not to mention a 100 KO return and if he puts up similar numbers against South Carolina, Georgia will come away with a win. Hutson Mason only passed for 131 yards in game 1 due to the great rushing attack but he will probably be asked for more production in this game.

Georgia leads the all-time series 47-16-2 and beat the Gamecocks in Athens last year 41-30 but South Carolina has won the last two times Georgia has traveled to Columbia and has held the Bulldogs to just 13 total points in those two games but there is no Jadeveon Clowney on the South Carolina roster in 2014. Based on everything listed above, we believe that Georgia comes away with the win on Saturday.

PROGRAM SPOTI OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma State is currently enjoying the best run of success in the history of the program but it was Barry Sanders that put the Cowboys on the map. In 1988 Barry Sanders won the Heisman Trophy and it was, with out question, the greatest single season by an individual in the history of college football. With such an emphasis on the passing game, it appears that the 2,850 yards rushing by Barry Sanders could stand for quite sometime. Sanders led Oklahoma State to a 10-2 record in 1988 including a win in the Holiday Bowl. Below we list his 1988 season in detail.

Why is Oklahoma State enjoying so much success? It's because they have T. Boone Pickens funding the massive improvements of the stadium and the training facilities as well as helping to pay to keep Mike Gundy as the head coach. Will Oklahoma State supplant Oklahoma as THE team in the state? No, but at least OSU can compete with the Sooners and that in it's self is something that didn't seem possible 15 years ago.

If the NCAA would retroactively go back and count the 222 yards and 5 TD's he scored against Wyoming in the Holiday Bowl, he would have 2,850 yards and 44 TD's.
