Brian David Woodward, age 64 of Detroit, passed away Monday, July 31, 2023 at William Beaumont Hospital, Farmington Hills. Brian was born on June 5, 1959 in Fremont, to the late Allen and Marjorie (Lang) Woodward. Brian graduated in 1977 from Port Hope Schools. He attended Delta Community College and also attended Northwood University where he graduated with a bachelors degree in business and computer science. Brian worked as a contractor for Ford Motor Company. Brian loved the outdoors. His caregivers took him fishing, hunting, and boating. He enjoyed being with family and friends. He was a member of the Mount Vernon Baptist Church in Redford where he was a member of the Choir. Brian was a huge advocate for rights for the disabled. He was instrumental in the group called "We Can't Wait," combatting the government that took their no-fault insurance benefits away in 2019. Brian mentored other quadriplegic crash survivors. He tutored and mentored children in his community. He was a caring, compassionate, giving person who always was willing to help someone in need. He always had a smile on his face and kind words to say.
