1) Oceanside's first Mayor was Col. Daniel H. Horne who came to Oceanside around 1886
2) Oceanside was incorporated in 1888 as the railroad came from Los Angeles.
3) John Daley and Kristi Hawthorn give walking tours the 2nd Sat of the mth. 4) This is the 6th pier built in 1987.
5) The Playgirl bar, now Surf Museum, was a Marine nude bar for 40 years closing in 2002. The city paid \$700,000 for the property plus \$700,000 for the owner not to reopen in Oceanside.
6) The Oceanside Harbor was built in 1961. The Camp Pendleton turning basin in 1942 requiring the Army Corp of Engineers to replenish sand each year on the beach.
