Meet Trooper

This sweet boy has lived up to his name and has proved he is a survivor.

A lady discovered Trooper in the woods locked up in a trap. The lady said she could hear this cat cry out for days when she would go for her daily walks and after the fourth day of hearing these cries she hiked up in the woods to see what was wrong thinking maybe it was a cat stuck up in a tree and afraid to come down.

What she discovered instead was a very emaciated, dehydrated and scared cat begging for someone to please help him and let him out.

Poor Trooper was rescued just in time. Trooper's liver was trying to shut down, and Trooper was starved to the point where his body was absorbing itself. PAWS immediately rushed Trooper to Cherokee Animal Care Clinic where he received the utmost care to save his life. Trooper had to be hospitalized, and due to his severe dehydration, he had to receive SubQ fluids for several days even after he was released from the hospital.

Trooper was so emaciated that he lost a lot of his muscle mass that can't ever be restored. This has caused his eyes to sink in and droop down. Just as soon as he is stable, he will undergo surgery to help with this muscle loss around his eyes.

Trooper is on several medications and fighting off lots of secondary infections due to his close call with death. Traps should never be left unattended, in Trooper's case it was almost a death trap.



Please donate to PAWS so we can get Trooper the surgery he so needs and deserves. We are expecting Trooper to make a full recovery. This would not be possible without our wonderful donors. Without you, we could not save the lives that we do every day.

How Trooper got his name-Our shelter manager made the statement about his being such a good trooper through all of this, and we knew the name was perfect for him.

DID YOU KNOW.....

PAWS donated over 60 dog houses and 60 bales of hay in January to families that could not supply shelter or warmth to their animals living outdoors.

We are thrilled to tell you because of your generosity and support, we have been able to assist over 800+ animals in 2018. It has also allowed us to assist in helping hundreds of animals get spay/neuter surgeries in Swain County this year.

PAWS has supplied over 2,000 lbs of dog and cat food to families in need. We want to ensure that no animal goes hungry.

Did you know that the majority of animals we currently have in our shelter at this time have come to us due to animal cruelty or neglect? Did you know that 84% of our vet and medical bills stem from animals that are severely neglected or abused? That's right their ailments or injuries came from the hands of a human. That percentage is way to high, we as a society must do better. Another reason why we work so hard to bring more awareness and education about proper and responsible care and fight so hard against animal cruelty.

Did you know that a large portion of the animals in our shelter at this time are there because a local county official or officer called for our assistance, yet we get zero county or state funding?

On March 29th Mountain View Manor hosted a benefit for PAWS. They raised over \$900 with this beautiful and delicious lunch benefit.

In January PAWS participated in a large-scale puppy mill operation in Candler County, Georgia. Working in conjunction with the Humane Society of the United States, Atlanta Humane Society,& CHHS, PAWS brought back two young adult German Shepherds to the mountains of western North Carolina. This was a large-scale rescue operation that spanned two counties and multiple animal welfare agencies across many states. At the scene in Candler County where we were, 165 German Shepherds were living in filth and horrifically inhumane conditions.

In total there were over 400 German Shepherds that needed to be quickly removed from these horrid conditions.

Atlanta Humane has helped P.A.W.S. in the past when we have needed help with overcrowding in our shelter, so we knew we needed to assist them in any capacity possible when dealing with such a large quantity of dogs. No one shelter should ever have to bear this burden alone, no matter the size of the facility.

We are so glad we were able to help AHS if only by taking in two- Meet Hans & Faith. Hans has been adopted, but Faith needed time to heal. When she came into PAWS, she couldn't use her back leg. We took Faith to the vet, and they determined that it was canine bites that never got any medical attention and had become very infected.

Neither Hans or Faith had ever experienced the gentle touch of a human hand so being petted or cared for was foreign to them. They were never socialized and before being rescued had lived in small lots with lots of other dogs with no real human interaction. Faith had several canine bites on her body that significantly tells the tale of the anguish and pain she must have suffered not only by the humans but the other dogs sharing the lot with her.

PAWS staff spent several weeks rehabilitating both Hans and Faith and now both love to feel the loving touch of humans and now love human interaction and companionship.

Hans has already been adopted but Faith needed more time to heal. Come by and meet our beautiful girl Faith.

Meet Moonshine

Moonshine hit and run victim. So sad to know that after he was hit by a car, he was left in the median with only a bowl of water and after surviving being struck by a car he still came so close to being shot rather than helped. His injuries were severe, and he was in excruciating pain, and now his fate was being determined because Swain County has no animal control and no one willing to claim ownership of him or take on the medical expense to help him. Nor would they take him to the animal hospital. The deputy had been instructed by his commanding officer to shoot him because there was no other options. Luckily for Moonshine P.A.W.S. was the option and when the deputy called PAWS we were willing to take on those responsibilities and save his life. PAWS made sure that he was immediately taken to Junaluska Emergency Animal Hospital.

Moonshine had to have surgery, and one of his back legs was crushed so severely it could not be saved. He had large lacerations on his other hind leg that required several staples. His whole little body was bruised and swollen. The orthopedic surgeon was hoping he could save the leg but when he went to set it and put pins in the leg he realized there was nothing to hold it together: because the femur bone was crushed into

tiny pieces. Moonshine had to stay hospitalized for over a week and then came home with a foster to finish healing and to receive care in learning how


to walk with only three legs. Moonshine has not let that slow him down or dampen his spirit, and he now runs and plays and loves playing with other dogs. His surgery & hospital care cost P.A.W.S. close to \$2,000 but seeing him and knowing he is going to live now a happy and healthy life makes it worth every cent.


THANK YOU VOLUNTEERS!
