**Resurrection Greetings!** 

I want to thank everyone that had provided to the - Michael Strange Memorial Clothing & Food Drive this year. I believe it was a great success. Not just that much was contributed this year, but it shows the outpouring of the love and faith our church has for the community and those



needing assistance. Thank you to all who participated.

With that said, I would like to express that as we come to the beautiful time of year called "Easter" or, as some may refer to it, "Resurrection Sunday," I want to remind you that the same power that raised Christ from the dead is available to us today. ### **MEN'S DEVOTIONAL**

#### Consistency

"There I will meet you and speak to you; there also I will meet with the Israelites, and the place will be consecrated by my glory." - Exodus 29:42-43

Have you set up your tent yet? In the days preceding the Exodus, God established a special place to meet with Moses and the Israelites. He called it the Tent of Meeting; it was here that He said the words of our scripture verse

above. Where is your Tent of Meeting? For me, it's the worn wooden rocking chair on the back porch. That chair is where I read this passage several years ago, on a porch in Indiana, and recommitted myself to a daily time with God.

My friend Darren was the first to jump in the water at a small group meeting I had with my small group while discussing consistency in our daily quiet times with our Creator. Darren said "Every morning, I get up and show up to work on time, I am prompt for my appointments throughout the day, and I'm always on time for my son's baseball practice after work. On weekends I like to get up at the crack of dawn and be the first off the tee so I can motor around the course. But one appointment I could never keep was the one about reading my Bible on a regular and consistent basis. I made sure I kept my appointments with everyone else, but with Jesus, I was never on time. How sad is that?"

"So, what did you do about it? I asked. "I finally got on track with a steady quiet time with God by doing three things: having a plan, setting a time, and having a place to do it uninterrupted." Consistency is a very large key to starting your day with God's perspective. Don't leave home without it. God deserves to be your first appointment don't you think? This is pretty much common sense. Without your Creators' perspective, it can be a little dangerous to face your daily circumstances. Make your coffee and make God your first appointment every day. God is never late; He is waiting for you.

#### MARCH BOARD MEETING SYNOPSIS


• Review of Minutes: The minutes from the February board meeting were approved via email after the February board meeting.

- <u>Financial Report</u>: Offerings for February were \$8,672.00 and expenses were \$4,756.40. Our utility bill was high at \$364.93 for the month. We need to make sure that the heat does not stay on during the week. The temperature when we leave on Sunday should stay at 55 degrees for heat and then 80 degrees for summertime.
- <u>Pastor Contract:</u> We will have a committee get together to review the pastor contract and make any changes as needed. Then we will present it to Doc Gardner to review as well and sign.
- <u>CCLI license for printing music</u>: The board discussed purchasing a Christian Copyright Licensing International License. This gives us the rights to print the words and music to hymns and keep them at the church, while honoring copyright laws. The license will also give us access to songs and sheet music, so we would not have to piece it together for print outs. The cost will be \$142.00 annually for the copyright license and \$204.00 annually for Song Select Premium.
- <u>CD changes for bank</u>: We currently have 4 CD's at Bancorp South which can only be accessed by the church members on each CD. The board voted to give Marilyn Chamberlin permission to go to Bancorp South, close all four CD's out, create a savings account and put the money from CD's into that savings account. This will give the treasurer access to the money in case the board votes to use it for purchases in the future.
- <u>Women's Bible Study:</u> The church will begin a Women's Bible Study class. The board voted to purchase 20 books for the bible study. Cost is about \$15 per book.
- Fence: The board will revisit quotes from contractors to clear our fence area and put up a new solid structure.
- <u>Food Distribution:</u> Community Lifeline and Feeding Friends and Families have suggested pausing our food distribution for a few months and then revisiting it in summer months when the need might be greater. We will do the food distribution on March 20, 2022 in order to tell those that come by where other distribution locations are.
- <u>Church Pews and Carpet:</u> The board discussed the need to look at the carpet since it is bubbling in places and could be a tripping hazard. Each pew is bolted down and will need to be removed in order to replace or re-stretch the carpet. The cushions and backs on the pews probably need to be replaced in the next couple of years. The pews were purchased over 40 years ago. The board will look in to getting a quote to refinish and repair the existing pews. We could possibly replace the pews with something new if the cost to refinish the pews is more expensive then replacing them. We will discuss this at the next board meeting.
- Next board meeting will be April 3, 2022

Darlene Zschech is an Australian singer-songwriter and worship pastor of the famous Hillsong Church, Sydney. 
