UPCOMING DAY TRIPS!!




Please call the Center at 740-852-3001 and get your name on the list! Seating will be limited. Deadline to pay will be Monday, September 27th.

Strawberry Whipped Sensation

It's almost strawberry pickin' time!



4 cups fresh strawberries, divided

1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk

1/4 cup lemon juice

1 (8 ounce) tub whipped topping, thawed, divided

8 chocolate sandwich cookies, finely chopped1 tablespoon butter, melted

Line 9x5 loaf pan with foil, with ends of foil extending over sides of pan. Mash 2 cups of the strawberries in a large bowl. Add condensed milk, juice and 2 cups of the whipped topping; mix well. Pour into prepared pan.

Mix chopped cookies and butter. Spoon over whipped topping mixture. Cover with ends of foil and gently press cookie mixture into whipped topping mixture. Freeze 6 hours or until firm.

Invert dessert onto serving plate when ready to serve; remove pan and foil. Spread remaining whipped topping onto top and sides of dessert. Slice remaining 2 cups strawberries; arrange over dessert. Store leftovers in freezer.





Required Minimum Distribution

from your IRA—If you are 70 1/2 or older and have an IRA, you know that each year you must take your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). But did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. If you want further information on how you can make a gift to the Senior Center from your IRA, please contact your financial advisor.
