

Recreation Minutes

May 3, 2018

Current programs and events:

-The T-ball seasons is underway, as opening day was on April 21. It will continue until early June.

-The Healthy Kids Running program has been ongoing on Sundays throughout the month of April and will end this upcoming Sunday.

-SNAG Golf has 2 weeks remaining in the program.

-Open gym for boys high school basketball is taking place on Monday nights for 2 hours over at the High School Gym.

-Youth Week officially begins this Saturday with the fishing tournament at Alcyon Lake; the unofficial start in this Sunday night with the Youth Council at Borough Hall.

Upcoming programs and events:

-The pump track project is almost complete. The information kiosk is going up tomorrow, while sodding will take place next week. A grand opening will follow soon after.

-Irrigation on the Lambs Road soccer fields will begin in about a week. The fields have to be marked, the company taking on the projects needs to gather the necessary materials.

-The idea of Disc Golf was discussed at Alcyon Lake Park. The idea was to explore the possibility of adding a 9-hole course at the back of the park near the nature area. Further information is being gathered before any additional talk will continue

-Next, open discussion took place regarding Ordinance 3-29.1. Previously, the commission had recommended to town council to adjust the ordinance to allow public events to occur before noon over at Alcyon Lake Park. That recommendation was shot down from council, in part due to the adjustment being limited to just the park. Now, the idea is to tweak the original change to expand to all park areas in

hopes to appease the council. Jason James was given the task to gather facts and build a stronger case for June's meeting.

-Finally, discussion on the naming policy began. Steve Snyder helped to organize the policy. The commission appeared in favor of the policy, albeit with a tweak or two in wording that needed to be amended. A motion to approve the policy was introduced and was seconded. The vote passed, and, once the changes are finalized, the commission will have a written policy to follow regarding potentially naming facilities in town.
