

Hello St. Mark's Lutheran,

Welcome to another day held gently in the loving arms of God! What a blessing it is to be alive, well, and part of such an amazing church. If you were to but take a few steps outside I'm sure you'd agree, this year is off to a chilly start, but St. Mark's is welcome and warm, and we have Good News to share.

I want to get this off to a start with some scripture that kind of parallels what we heard in church this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after Epiphany.

This comes from **Hosea 10:12**, "Sow for yourselves righteousness; reap steadfast love; break up your fallow ground; for it is time to seek the LORD, that he may come and rain righteousness upon you."


Elyse and I read that in our devotion for the other day and it got me thinking how it parallels the story of the wedding at Cana and how they were emptying out the clay jugs and then filling them with fresh water. Through which God worked a miracle turning the water into the best wine. In my sermon I talked about how sometimes we need to empty out/get rid of some of the stuff we hold out into in our life: pride, resentment, anger, sorrow to make room for God's new life for us. God wants to fill us up to overflowing with hope, love, and joy. SO we need to LET GO (of the bad stuff) and LET GOD fill us with blessings.

I read a story about some farmers clearing land that helped me with this idea too. The farmers were clearing some new land for a new hayfield. First they cut the timber and cleared the stumps with a dozer, then they burned the stumps and brush. Then went and walked the ground to pick up any extra wood chunks before it could be plowed and planted. But the work doesn't stop there... the ground has to be kept up. A neglected field reverts back to weeds and brush.

I think our hearts are like that field. They take a lot of clearing of useless things before they become productive for God's use. The Good News is that when we are graced with God's salvation, God clears and plants his Spirit in us so that we can be productive for Him. But our hearts/our spiritual life needs constant care so that those weeds, brush, junk don't creep back in. Our Christian life isn't a one and done decision it is a lifelong commitment, a journey together.

Beloved, all we have been given is from God. And I pray that this year we turn all of those things we have been holding onto over to Jesus and trust that our amazing loving God will fill our lives to overflowing with hope, love, and joy. Beloved then you will see that holy, joy filled; newness and life overflow into the lives of the people around you! And together we'll be wrapping this whole world in the loving arms of God.
