Christ's Mini Communique

My dear friends in Christ,

Like many of you, I found myself longing for 2020 to end and looked forward to a new beginning in 2021. Like many of you, I have been disappointed that the change in the calendar did not automatically bring change to our world and our lives. Of course, we all know that such hopes were only wishful thinking. Our true hope yesterday, today, always is in Christ our Lord. Our true hope is in Emanuel, God with us, who lived and died and now lives again for us and with us. Our true hope is in Jesus, the Son of God, who calls us to follow him in lives of love and peace. Our true hope is in the Prince of Peace who, even now, is ushering in the Kingdom of God in which true justice prevails and no one is left out.

January 6, the day we watched in horror as protest turned to violent insurrection, was the Christian festival of Epiphany. On that day we celebrated the revelation of Jesus as our savior, the light of the world, our hope. On that day, we recall the Wise Men who followed a star to bring gifts and pay homage to the Christ child. Sadly, that age-old story is not only one of celebration, but of fear and violence. Afraid of losing his power, King Herod sought out young Jesus to have him killed. When the Wise Men failed to return with the child's location, "...he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under..." (Matthew 2:16). Such violence continues in our world, our nation, our lives. In her video statement on January 8, ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton shared these words: "Perhaps our epiphany from this year's Epiphany events is that our country is broken... May we have an epiphany of looking squarely and truthfully at ourselves, our church, our communities, our country acknowledging where we are broken and then determining that we are going to be part of the solution, so that there is equity and justice and equality for all. Let this be our epiphany, that we are, in Christ, given the power and also the mission to be healers of the breach."

May we live into that hope and that mission in this new year and beyond!
