Stanley "Stan" Shores is a native of Murdock, Minnesota, a small farming town 112 miles west of Minneapolis. He played baseball and basketball for the Murdock High School Irish, and was a standout halfback and defensive back on the football team. After graduating from Murdock High, he joined the Army, spending two years in the Adjutant General's Office in Fort Knox, Kentucky.

Stan then went to Augsburg College in Minneapolis, where he played defensive back on the Augsies' football team. Augsburg is a member of the tough Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, which also includes Saint John's University and their legendary coach, John Gagliardi, the winningest coach in college football history....with 80 more than "Papa Joe" Paterno!

After receiving his degree in Business Administration, Stan entered the business world and worked for over twenty years for a graphic arts manufacturing firm, ultimately becoming the company Treasurer. He then worked in the banking industry for five years before founding his own commercial and residential mortgage business in 2000. Stan holds mortgage licenses in both Minnesota and Arizona and is still active in that business.
