Macroevolution of Suboscine Birds and Explorations in Southern Mexico

Dr. Oscar Johnson will talk about his research on macroevolution in the suboscine birds, which combines data from phylogenetics, citizen science, natural history, and museum collections to answer questions about how new species form. He will also talk about recent field work in southern Mexico to gather data for this kind of research.



Bio: Oscar Johnson is a postdoctoral fellow at UTEP, where he studies macroevolution, phylogenetics, and taxonomy of birds, with a focus on tropical regions. His research combines exploratory field work and modern genetic analyses with museum collections and citizen science. He serves on the North American Classification Committee, which maintains the taxonomy and checklist of North American birds, and is actively involved in the eBird project as a volunteer reviewer. AT FEATHER LAKE

When Feather Lake is fully flooded, it is usually the result of runoff from significant storm events. Such events have been essentially absent this year, but 2023 has continued to be a good year for intermittent deliveries of excess irrigation water.

In late September, when the water depth at our inlet gauge peaked at 9 inches, most of the basin was flooded. With the consistent periodic flooding, the lake and surrounding uplands are the greenest they have been in over a decade.

Ducks, shorebirds and wading birds found these conditions to their liking. Now, the irrigation season is winding down, and we can expect another long dry season to begin.

Upcoming workdays at Feather Lake will be **Sun., October 15** and **Sat., December 16**, both starting at **2 p.m.** Join us.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.
