

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## Planning Strategically to Improve and Preserve our Masonic Temple


The Board of Directors is developing a Strategic Plan for the maintenance and operation of the Temple for both the short- and long-term continued use of this grand facility. This Strategic Plan will include a prioritized list of repair, replacement and maintenance projects for the building systems and equipment. This list will support a systematic procedure for the use of Temple funds earmarked for improvements and upkeep, and will inform the decision-making process for the selection of projects to balance planned system maintenance with urgent immediate needs.

This list of projects (such as HVAC replacement, elevator upgrades, improving kitchen equipment, etc.) is expected to be dynamic and regularly reassessed to make sure that current plans do not ignore long term planning needs for the Temple. If you have an idea for projects that should be added to the list, please pass it to your Board representative (see the last page) so that he can bring it to the attention of the Board of Directors and the House Committee.

In cooperation with the strategic plan, the Norfolk Cornerstone Foundation is being developed to help support the Temple as well as encourage the work of charitable and civic activities in the area. The Norfolk Cornerstone Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization. More information will be made available soon about the ways to support this Foundation and the Norfolk Masonic Temple.

## Project: Roof Replacement / Repairs

Work is almost complete on installing a new roof by Block Roofing Corporation. The contractor estimates that work will be complete by the end of March. The photo below shows the size of the roof, to give a sense of the scope of the effort to replace the roof and to provide an image of the old roof material.

## More Temple Projects Underway or being implemented:

**Exterior Building Lighting**: The exterior lights illuminating the building were removed during the roof replacement process. New lights with LED fixtures will be installed once the roof work is complete, to improve the image of the Temple at night and to add to the area security lighting.

**Flagpole Restringing**: A number of months ago, the rope for the flagpole in front of the Temple broke and came out of the pulley at the top of the flagpole. The House Committee has been looking for solutions to replacing the rope as the flagpole is over 100 feet high. The two photos below were taken using a drone and show the fitting at the top of the flagpole in front of the Temple. The current proposal is to obtain the services of a crane company with a personnel lift to reach the top of the pole, make any necessary repairs to the fitting/pulley, and put a new rope in place. This will allow Old Glory to once more proudly fly in front of our Masonic Temple for Masons and the general public to see far and wide.





**Replacement Lighting**: New LED lights have been installed in the Scottish Rite dressing room to provide better illumination for the degree teams and for those using the space during rental events. Thank you to Brother Norman Cohen for his efforts to support the Temple with his time and expertise.

**Dining Room Coat Room reflooring**: The photo at right shows the new tile floor in the coat room outside of the dining room. It dramatically improves the look of this area, and makes it more appealing for rental groups using the Temple as they look for areas to hang up their coats and jackets.

## Parking Lot Lighting and Trees: The House

Committee is working with the City of Norfolk to thin and

remove some of the pine trees at the back of the parking lot. This will improve the lighting of the parking lot which is currently obscured by tree branches and provide better security in the lot.

**Street ramp access to the Main Entrance**: The City of Norfolk has been requested to provide a ramp access from the street for the main entrance on Brackenridge Avenue. This will help make the Temple fully accessible and more appealing for visitors.

This will need to be done on a weekly basis, in order to keep the property looking well-kept and appealing. The Temple has a riding mower, leaf blower and other tools for use for this purpose, so personal equipment is not required. We are simply searching for brethren willing to operate the equipment and help get the work done.

If your Lodge or Appendant Body would like to volunteer as a group, please let us know. If individuals would like to volunteer on an occasional basis, we can work with that schedule too. The desire to maintain the Temple is the important thing and to help keep it looking great.
