

About Pastor Terrie

By now most of you have heard that I broke my ankle. So here's what's happened.

The morning of October 15th I had done my chores outdoors with the chickens, watered the flowers, put out some bird seed and turned to go in the house when the rain boots I was wearing slipped out from under me on a wet muddy, grassy incline and I was on the cold wet ground. My left boot took an unnatural direction and I was in trouble.

At the Emergency Room an x-ray showed that I clearly broke the fibula (smaller outside bone). October 22nd after Dr. and covid clearance I had surgery. A titanium plate and 7 screws put me back together again. Pain management was challenging however I got some good medication for which I am grateful!

So far, I've had 2 weeks to reflect on this challenge and in-between being grouchy and frustrated; mostly I have been in prayers of gratitude! I am so grateful for the skilled surgeon and staff, so grateful for pain medications, so grateful for the scooter, wheelchair, walker, boot, pillows and ice packs! I am so grateful for my husband pulling me up and setting me down and cooking for me and running errands and tolerating my grumpy moaning. I am so grateful for the phone calls, friends, family, cards and prayers. Thank you to my church family for your patience with me. Thank you for my renewed attitude of gratitude. Thank you God for healing my lame leg, my mind body and spirit.

Because of a covid year, I have worked to improve prayers by telephone. Please call for a prayer anytime. I would love to have a phone prayer with you anytime.

God bless us all with patience and deeper faith in these increasingly darker fall days. Gratefully, Pastor Terrie



Pastor's thoughts....

Psalm 46 (NRSV)

- 1 God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.
- 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea:
- 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.
- 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.
- 5 God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns.
- 6 The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts.
- 7 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.
- 8 Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth.
- 9 He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.
- 10 "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations; I am exalted in the earth."
- 11 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.

As I write, our national conversation seems like a roaring tumult, a crashing sea. Though I lean in one direction, I don't really fit in either "camp." I don't want to speak. I don't want to rock the boat. I don't want to alienate. But I want to do the right thing. I want to respond to God's call no matter the cost. The waves are not only around me, but within me. Where is my refuge? Where is my stronghold?

Here it is, in the Lord God who says to be still (or stop, or let it go). The Lord was a refuge for King David and for Martin Luther in even more tumultuous times. Why should I fear? I am called to spread God's Kingdom here on earth in word and deed, as is the whole church. When confused and fearful, perhaps it's best to retreat to the fortress, be still and know, let go of fear and anxiety and wait for direction. The enemy—who is left, right and all around—is overcome with truth and love.

Prayer

O God my fortress and refuge, free me from fear and grant me courage and wisdom to speak and act in truth and love according to your will. Amen.

Worship When We Gather Indoors

The church council and Pastor Terrie are taking the health of our congregation very seriously and we do not want participate in the spread of Covid19. Therefore, because the numbers are higher now than in June, we are pulling back on our opening. At this time we are hoping to go indoors November 15th. That will be decided at the November 12th council meeting.

When we do, the following procedures will be in place:

- Masks will continue to be worn (extras will be available)
- Hand sanitizer will be available (You may also bring your own if you'd prefer.)
- Seating will be limited to every other pew. We ask that you limit seating in each pew to 2 people, observing social distancing, or 1 family per pew.
- The liturgy will be spoken, and, while there will be music, there will be no group singing.
- There will be disposable bulletins, no use of hymnals. Please take a bulletin from the table in the back of the church.
- We will have a place for you to leave offering envelopes.
- As you greet one another before and after worship, please refrain from hugs and handshakes except with members of your household.



- There will be communion during the worship service. Grape juice and wafer will be safely and individually packaged and picked up with your bulletin. Please dispose of your containers as you leave the building.
- If a participant who has attended a worship service tests positive, the Ogle County Health Department will be consulted
- All those participating, leaders or congregants, will be asked to not come if they have been in confirmed contact with someone who has COVID-19 within the last two weeks, they have a temperature, or they have traveled out of state in the last two weeks
- Participants will be asked to not linger and mingle after the service but quickly disperse in an instructed fashion by row entered.

All members are encouraged to consider their own situation and risk status before deciding when to return to worship or other gatherings in the building. **Our worshiping community will continue to include an active online video for the foreseeable future.** We will continue to serve members of the St. Mark's family who cannot be with us physically, so we will strive to make our virtual presence deeper and richer.

Finally, there is always the risk that we will need to move quickly to a fully online community again if there is an outbreak. Please stay connected with our Face book page, website, and provide an email for those announcements.

Currently there a few things happening at St. Mark's:


