

During the holidays, we'll probably all gather around tables: at home, visiting friends and family, in common spaces in our communities and houses of worship. We'll pull chairs up close, enact rituals of thanks, and share in food, fellowship, laughter and love. What stories could your table tell?

Because of your support for Open Door Exchange over the last year, 141 families now have a table where they will gather with loved ones this holiday season. And imagine how that table is used all year round—for meals and homework, art projects and board games. A table makes a house a home.

Each piece of furniture that comes into our warehouse has a story. It was a childhood desk or a grandmother's dresser, a movie-watching couch—or a table that hosted years of holiday gatherings. And each piece of furniture is given a new story in the home of our guests, who may be homeless veterans being placed into housing, women who have escaped an abusive relationship, Long Islanders recovering from losses due to fire or flood, or neighbors who simply struggle to make ends meet.

In January, Open Door Exchange will celebrate its third anniversary! We've now served more than 583 Long Island families thanks to countless generous gifts of furniture, volunteer hours, and funding.

And this year, you helped us raise more than \$20,000 to purchase new mattresses by supporting Miles for Mattresses, Ken Rogers' 277-mile walk from Maryland to our warehouse in Port Jefferson Station!
