The purpose of the MARC Mileage Program is to offer national recognition for all miles driven. There is no intent to supersede or cancel any Regional or local driving programs now in existence; rather, the program seeks to further them by offering a driven-car recognition for all registered MARC vehicles.

GENERAL

All Model A's owned by MARC members and registered in the MARC Mileage Program, and which meet the following standards, are eligible.

- A. Of original manufacture from 1927 through 1931.
- B. Titled or registered as a Model A in accordance with respective state requirements.
- C. Authentic in overall appearance, with a minimum of the following basic features:
- 1. Original Ford four-cylinder engine produced from 1927 through 1934.
- 2. Body style for year of manufacture.

RULES FOR MILES DRIVEN

- A. All ground mileage is credited, except for non-emergency tow.
- B. All credited mileage is cumulative from year to year and to each higher award level.
- C. Mileage to be credited must be attested.
- D. No mileage is credited for any period of time that the owner is not a member of the Model A Restorers Club.
- E. Mileage does not have to be updated every year to maintain eligibility.
- F. Mileage is accumulated through the reporting of the odometer reading as of December 31 of each year.
- G. The MARC Driving Awards Committee is the final authority on mileage credit and awards.

NATIONAL AWARDS

- A. Award recognition begins at 2,000 miles; the second award level is 5,000 miles; and subsequent levels are at each additional 5,000 miles thereafter.
- B. A radiator plaque is awarded with the first mileage level, and a replacement mileage tab is awarded thereafter.

REGISTRATION

CAR 2

- A. A registration fee of \$1.00 is required at time of vehicle registration and is good for as long as the owner is a member in good standing of MARC. If membership is allowed to lapse, vehicle must be re-registered.
- B. MARC shall maintain the original registration card as a permanent record for each vehicle registered and receiving recognition.
- C. A vehicle transferred to a new MARC member who re-registers the car shall maintain its mileage award level and continues eligibility for further awards in accordance with the rules.

The quality of it's manufacture and it's simple easy to read design is a pleasure to see. Notice the scale that you read to determine the quality of the component that you are testing and see that the best reading on the scale is "Super".


Clinic continued

We had a "What is it?" brought by Bob Butek. He kept us in suspense as he showed us a plain paper bag, before our eyes the bag began to get bigger and bigger and then there was a Bang! . Shown is an original period type red inner tube that has somewhere around a dozen or more patches that with a patch or two by Bob still holds air. For those in the know, the red rubber from those tubes were a favorite to make a sling shot from. That mixture of rubber is extra

snappy.



Our main topic at the clinic which featured John Pritchard and Doug Portlance concerned the replacement of the top wood which with our cars built in the years from 1928 to 1931 have mostly used up the life of the original wood. Dry rot, broken bows and patched fixes are now requiring replacement. This clinic is an extension of a previous clinic given by these two members and incorporates some of the same methods and supplies used in the body wood covered last year. This clinic was to show the preparation of the top wood for the eventual roof fabric replacement that will be a feature of the March 16th. clinic. Through a large number of photos projected on to the screen and discussion as to where to purchase complete or partial wood kits and supplies, the process to re cover the fabric on your car should be easier as a result of the presentation.
