The Flesh or the Spirit: Which Reigns?

There is no doubt that one of these powers rules in every life and there is a great deal of difference in the works of the individual whose life is ruled by the spirit of God and one whose life is controlled entirely by the flesh with all of its desires and lusts and its enmity against God.

The world today is torn with war and death and destruction because the spirit of the Lord has not had right of way in the lives of those who control the policies of the nations. There would be no wars if the leaders of the nations were all godly men and were able to listen to the Lord's voice. It is not God's will that the human race refuse to accept his leadership. The natural outcome of disobedience to the Lord is trouble and sickness and wars and all the terrible things that happen to mankind who for nearly six thousand years has disobeyed the commandments and Laws of God.

Let us look to the word of God for some examples of the way God deals with those who DO listen to him and serve Him.

Daniel was taken captive into a strange land. That was not his desire. He was ordered to partake of the meat and drink that the king or ruler of that nation would have him to eat and drink. He loved the Lord with all his heart and wanted nothing more than to be able to show the people of the strange nation that the God he served was THE God of heaven and that beside him there was no other. Notice in the book of Daniel Chapter 1 verses 3 to 20. Let us emphasize the 8th verse. "But DANIEL PURPOSED IN HIS HEART that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's meat, nor with the wine which he drank: therefore he requested of the prince of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself. First he was sure of what was the will of God in his case then he PURPOSED IN HIS HEART to abide in the will of God. He would not partake of the substance of the nation that worshipped not the God of his

fathers the Creator of all things that are made."

There are many people in 1945 that would serve God with all of their heart if it were not for the fact that they have to have a living from the substance of the world. "If I don't fellowship the boys I work with and go with them to the pleasures of this life I can't hold my job and I have to eat.' It is a sure thing that it is necessary for the natural human body to have food regularly to sustain life. We know this. Daniel knew it too. We say I will let the NAT-URAL or FLESH man lead and dictate to me so that I may have a natural life. Daniel said I will let the SPIRITUAL man lead so that I may have favor with God who will in turn supply all of my needs whether they be for spirit, soul or body. There is no natural gain that is worth the price of a soul yet there are millions of sinners. thousands of church members. hundreds of professors and dozens of Christians who are failing to turn away from the worldly practices of life and serve the living God with fervent spirit. What do we mean by worldly??? Here is What a rule that we can use to answer that question. Anything that does not DIRECTLY glorify God is not of the spirit but is of the flesh. Let us not even consider the natural man and what he would like to have us do but let us follow after those things that will allow the spiritual man to lead us. If we are really sanctified we will be led by the SPIRIT.

Hebrews 13:10. "We have an altar whereof they have no right to eat which serve the tabernacle." There is many a Christian who beholding other Christians with a wonderful testimony for the Lord will desire in their heart to possess such a blessing and a power in their own life. They do not seem to understand that there is a price that must be paid to obtain those blessings. Unless you are fully consecrated to the Lord you will not be allowed to partake of the wonderful grace that is the rightful property of those who are fully surrendered to the will and power

of the Lord. Do you want a testimony like Bro. Jones Kill the old man (The FLEST) and resurrect the new man (the SPIRIT) and give him full control and the Lord will fill you so full of the Love of God that you will have the kind of experience you need. You have no right to eat at the same spiritual table with those who are led of the spirit unless you too are so surrendered to the Lord that you no longer consider what the flesh wants. You cannot follow the Lord acceptably unless the spirit of God leads you.

James 4: 1 to 6. From whence come wars and fightings among you? come they not hence even of your lusts that war in your members? War among the nations and war among the Brethren springs forth from the same father. The flesh, the sin nature, the old man, the human side of man comes to the front to control as long as there is not another power more powerful to direct the motives and latent energies of the human race. It is a deplorable but true fact that there are very few people even among the ranks of the Christi faith that have ever learned to get the Lord have His way. All will move along real well until the flesh sees some act or hears some word that doesn't set well on old man Adam's nature. Things then begin to happen. War starts right now. Someone gets mad and tells someone else where to head in and gives vent to all the insulting statements that their father SA-TAN tells them to say (for indeed, until you are led of the spirit you are directed by the flesh which in turn obeys the dictates of the devil himself) then in the next prayer meeting gives the following testimony. "I thank the Lord that I have learned to walk in the spirit and feel that if the Lord should come before morning I would be ready to meet Him."
Brother and sister so and so are surely wonderful folks. They give so much to the Gospel work and sing such good songs at the services. Look at them now they are getting ready to sing. Listen to the song they are singing, it's "Have thine own way Lord." The next night they went to the movies and saw the latest hit starring the lov. ly actress so and so. I am confishowed them he wanted them to attend the movies: It was old man ADAM, LUCIFER. HU-MAN, FLESH in person. Movies, questionable literature, prize fights and all the rest of the worldly entertainments are not of the spirit but of the flesh. "Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is en-mity with God? Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." Whoever you are you cannot hope to arrive safely at the end of a Christian race if you are a friend of the world for all who are friends of the world are enemies of the Lord. God wants us all to be entirely in the center of his divine will at all times.

Galatians 5: 16 to 25. "This I say then, walk in the spirit and ye shall not fulfill the lusts of the flesh." "The flesh lusteth against the spirit and the spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary one to the other; so that ye cannot do the things that ye would." "But if ye be led of the spirit ye are not under the law." There is a warfare in the human life with the flesh and the spirit in a raging battle until the life is sanctified and made pure by the blood of Jesus and the life is changed into a spiritual being that is led of the spirit. When the spirit of God takes charge that warfare is stopped as long as the life will listen to the voice of the spirit. When the spirit takes control the life is free from the "Law" of opposing forces warring in the members. Complete surrender to God is the only way to please God with a fully yielded life. Let the Lord have His way with you.

I knew sometime ago a man who was the essence of selfesteem. He deplored emotionalism and magnified intellect. He was cold, self-righteous and self-satisfied. He had intended to enter the ministry but found another vocation more lucrative and brushed aside his former choice. I think the only thing that ever stirred him was the chatter of his baby boy to whom he was devoted.

One day that little one fell sick. He spared no expense in getting the best that medical aid could do. But his little lad was slipping. He was surely getting worse. Man's extremity is often God's opportunity. In his frantic grief he sent for the pastor of a little church to see if anything could be done by prayer. The wise pastor got that man on his knees.

It was months later that I saw him again. He was tender and broken.

Gone was the old arrogance and self-esteem. I asked him what had happened. He came directly to the point and said, "I saw Jesus." And when he saw Jesus he saw himself as he really was. He saw his pride and the emptiness of his life. He saw the meaning of Golgotha and the grace that crowned the hill called Calvary. He had knelt to pray for his little lad and got a vision of the healing Christ. He had found the compassion and pardon he needed in Jesus.

What a transformation. What a change. But you ask whether or not this vision will come to everybody. I believe it will. He turned immediately and walked away; and we passed on. We would not have gone into that tavern for all the wealth of Washington city."

PALESTINE A CHEMICAL CENTER OF THE EAST

(New Palestine)

Palestine's young chemical in-dustry is rapidly broadening its scope and increasing its productive capacity; there is every reason to believe that the Promised Land may soon become the chemical cen-

ter of the entire East.

Instead of interrupting the growth of this important industry, the present war has actually stimulated it. The development of Palestine's potash industry. based on the exploitation of the mineral resources of the Dead Sea. was greatly accelerated by the urgent demand for potash and its byproducts. With the outbreak of the war German potash disappeared from British markets, and when Alsace, the second largest source of European potash, was occupied by the Nazis. Palestine became the most important source for the British Empire. Bromine and magnesium, the most important by-products of Palestine's potash industry, are likewise in great de-

Figures on the present production and export of Dead Sea minerals are a closely guarded military secret. It is, however, a well known fact that the area of the 'pans." where the water of the Dead Sea is evaporated prior to the extraction of the minerals, has more than doubled since the beginning of the war, and the expansion is still continuing at a rapid pace. Thus the Palestine Potash Syndicate will, after the war, be in a position to supply the local chemical industry with large quantities of raw materials, which will form one of the bases for its future development. Other basic materials are already being produced in the country or imported from India and other countries of the East.

The chemical laboratories which existed in Palestine before the war are now working full speed. Some of them have enlarged their plants, and several new undertakings in the chemical field are in the process of construction. Many of the existing factories are supplying the Imperial Army of the Nile.

A promising branch of Palestine's chemical industry is the pharmaceutical trade. Palestine's drugs are already in demand all over the East, and there is every reason to expect a much greater development after the war.

SCHOOL OF "AMERICANISM"

Editor of Midnight Cry in October issue of 1944 says that:

As a blind the Communists in America announced their decision to adopt 100 per cent Americanism as their own, and under this guise they are energetically pursuing a program to make America communistic.

Since their announcement they have opened at least one new institution of higher learning, the Jefferson School of Social Science in New York. The school was named after Thomas Jefferson in line with the Communist party's practice of assuming labels designed to trade on American historical figures. Previously the party had used the names of Lincoln and Tom Paine for similar propaganda purposes. The Abraham Lincoln School is in Chicago.

The CIO will provide many of the teachers at the fall term of the Jefferson school. In addition, this latest educational enterprise of Earl Browder's is tapping other sources of instructors, including Columbia University, the Board of Education, the Civilian Defense Volunteers Organization, the Child Study Association of America and the New York School, of Social Work. The rest of the staff will be comprised of old Communist party intellectual stalwarts, officers of various Communist fronts, current writers for the Communist Daily Worker, and some of the New York City college teachers

fired in 1940-41 legislative inquiry into subversive activities in the city school system.

RELIGION CAN HELP SOLVE YOUTH PROBLEM. SAYS JUDGE

Pointing to "plain old-fashioned" religion as a powerful aid in solving wide-spread juvenile de-linquency, Municipal Judge A. F. Molina was a featured speaker on Station KFMB's "San Diego Looks Ahead."

'We are now faced with a grim struggle on all fronts to preserve our form of government," declared the jurist. "We are experiencing much suffering and this season is a

sad one in many a home.

Here at home, too, we have the problem of juvenile delinquency. This has been with us long before the war and it will be with us long afterward unless something is done by those responsible for it. This problem has been studied from many angles.

"Playgrounds have been built; dances for youth are being conducted; stricter enforcement of the curfew law has been promulgated. Suggestions have gone so far as to call for more drastic punishment of the delinquents and for the construction of penal institutions for the more vicious offenders.

'Psychologists have submitted reports; others have tried. And like perpetual motion, perhaps there is no solution. What then is the answer? I have no answer and this discourse is not a panacea. But I believe I can suggest an idea which, for some reason or other, is never suggested. It is religion! Just plain, old-fashioned religion."

In explaining his ideas, Judge Molina points out the power of prayer. He insists it will go far in aiding the pressing youth problems now confronting the com-

munity.

"Laws cannot cope with this sordid condition," declared the "You cannot reform a judge. youth by legislation. You can only make youth morally better by religious education instilling wholesome moral principles. I firmly believe that until this is done, we will be confronted with the plague of delinquency with its terrific toll, misery and suffering."

REPENTANCE TOWARD GOD—Repentance is godly sorrow for sin (Acts 20: 21; II Cor.

7: 10; Mark 1: 15).

RESTITUTION—The Blood of Jesus will never blot out any sin that we can make right. We must have a conscience void of offense toward God and man. Restitution includes restoring where you have defrauded or stolen, paying back-debts, and making confession (Luke 19: 8, 9: Ezekiel 33: 15)

JUSTIFICATION is that act of God's grace by which we receive remission of sins (Acts 10: 43 Romans 5: 1; Romans 3: 25; Acts 13: 38, 39; John I: 12;

John 3: 3).
SANCTIFICATION is that act of God's grace by which He makes us holy. It is a second, definite work wrought by the Blood of Jesus through faith (John 17: 15-17; I Thess. 4: 3; Heb. 13: 12; Heb. 2: 11; Heb. 12:14; I John 1: 7)

THE BAPTISM OF THE HOLY GHOST is the gift of power upon the sanctified life (Luke 24: 49: Matt. 3: 11; John 7: 38, 39; John 14: 16,

17, 26; Acts 1: 5-8).

And when we receive it, we have the same sign or Bible evidence as the disciples had on the day of Pentecost, speaking with tongues, as the Spirit gives utterance (Mark 16: 17; 1 Cor. 14: 21, 22. Examples-Acts 2: 4; Acts 10: 45,

46; Acts 19: 6).

HEALING OF THE BODY-Sickness and diseases are destroyed through the previous atonement of Jesus (Isa. 53: 4, 5; Matt. 8: 17; Mark 16: 18; James 5: 14-16). All sickness is the work of the devil, which Jesus came to destroy (I John 3: 8; Luke 13: 16, Acts 10:38). Jesus cast out devils and commissioned His disciples to do the same (Mark 16: 17, 18; Luke 10: 19; Mark 9: 25, 26).

THE SECOND COMING OF JESUS—The return of Jesus is just as literal as His going away (Acts 1: 9-11; John 14: 3). There will be two appearances under one coming: first, to catch away His waiting bride (Matt. 24: 40-44; I Thess. 4: 15-17; second, to execute judgment upon the ungodly (II Thess. 1: 7-10; Jude 14, 15: Zech. 14: 3, 4).



His plane was shot down in July, he and his navigator were the only ones able to bail out. They were dragged by their parachutes over the Cliffs of Dover, leaving the navigator a cripple for life. Sgt. Watkins was baddle crippled, but able to take flying duty again after two months.

When someone asked Lincoln how he could laugh at such a time, he replied: "With the fearful strain that is upon me. if I did not laugh I would die." FOUR CHAPLAIN HEROES

The blackness of the morning of February 3, 1943, envoloped the four chaplains as they went down praying. The transport Dorchester had been torpedoed off the coast of Greenland. The icy sea was swarming with men. Aboard, many of our boys who feared that death awaited them if they went overside were afraid to start. The chaplains calmed their fears and persuaded them to go overboard where there was a chance of rescue. Survivors who escaped the sinking, saw the four standing together, handing out life belts from a chest —and then when the chest was empty each removed his own belt and passed it out. When the ship poised for the final plunge the four men, representing three faiths, linked their arms and prayed together. The manner of their dying was one of the most noble deeds of the war.

The chaplains, all with the Army rank of first lieutenant were Clark V. Poling, Schnectady, N. Y.; John P. Washington, Newark, N. J.; Alexander D. Goode, Washington, D. C., and George L. Fox, Chicopee Falls, Mass.

"Two of the chaplains—Poling and Fox—were Protestants, Chaplain Washington was a Catholic, Chaplain Goode was Jewish.

The Army's Distinguished Service Cross has been awarded the four chaplains and will be presented to their next of kin.
