

Homework Expectations

None: Entire project(s) will be completed within class time

Little: Less than 15% of the number of hours of class scheduled, students will need to dedicate to their project(s) outside of class in order to finish before the class ends. No special equipment required...usually tasks like cutting pieces, fusing interfacing, finishing some hand-sewing, etc.

(example – an hour and a half for a 10-hour class)

Middle: Between 20-35% of the number of hours of class scheduled, students will need to dedicate to their project(s) outside of class in order to finish before the class ends. Usually tasks repeated that were learned in class like sewing the rest of a set of similar seams, assembling a lining, putting in gathering stitches, etc. A sewing machine and iron are typically needed.

(example – 3.5 hours for a 12-hour class)

Lots: Over 45% of the number of hours of class scheduled, students will need to dedicate to their project(s) outside of class in order to finish before the class ends. Reserved mostly for classes that involve considerable amounts of hand-sewing and repetitive techniques (i.e. Chanel Jacket, beading, lace garments).

(example – 15 hours for a 36-hour class)

Varies: Homework time is entirely dependent on a student's project choice, sewing level, schedule and workload desires.
