8. CEO'S REPORT

- a. I have been attending the State Required 'New CEO Training' that was postponed last year due to COVID. It continues until November, and I will give updates as to what actually applies to the smaller Non-profit Fairs as most seems to apply to DAA Fairs. One thing that I learned right off is that I rented the Vet Office with an Annual Agreement which was discussed during my CEO Report, reviewed and approved through the normal agreement process, but because it is a month-to-month rental I should have had it approved under New Business, so in December of each year, or when initially renting, I will make sure all month-to-month rentals such as the fair house, vet office, and any other non-standard rentals for the next year are approved annually by the Board under New Business.
- b. I'm still working on the Golf Cart/ATV Policy for fairgrounds guests and our employees; I was able to purchase a Golf Cart that I picked up in Oregon last month which is being used for RV & Camp Rental and UHaul and then will be used for the Fair Camp and Jr. Livestock support during Fair, also purchased a Quad for Maintenance which works with a utility trailer we already had in the bone yard from Steve, which you may have noticed in the financials and to be transparent the check issued to Steve Bayley was for the Quad. With that said we still need a minimum of one more Quad for maintenance before Fair, and if anyone knows of a good deal or plans on selling their ATV please send them our way, really prefer a Quad or Side-by-Side for Maintenance rather than a Golf Cart due to the amount of use it will get; FYI the Golf Carts, Side-by Sides, and Quads that the fair utilized in 2019 apparently belonged to Ed DeLisle and were sold by him, so they are no longer available.
- c. The Grant Application for Concreting the Small Animal Barn that was submitted to the McConnell Foundation has moved up in the award process, and the Grant Committee will be coming to look at the Small Animal Barn on Thursday, April 22nd @ 9:30am and would like as many Board Directors as possible to attend, they do require we maintain 6' social distancing and mask protocol during the site visit. The Porta Coolers for Jr. Livestock Animal Barns Grant application was submitted to Redding Rancheria a couple weeks after the McConnell Grant so we should hear something back on that grant before the May Board Meeting.
- d. The well that is being donated and drilled by Shasta Well Drilling will happen Monday April 26th at 8:00am it is very important that we have attendance from our Directors as this is a huge donation to our organization. Kristie Anderson, Health Dept, will be at the drilling, and is helping to get coverage from KRCR, with that said we do need to make sure we are following the COVID protocols especially since we may be filmed for the local news. Again, this is being donated by Gavin & Mike the owners of Shasta Drilling, so let us show them our support and appreciation.
- e. The Grasshopper Bike Event, June 11 13 that had reserved our Fairgrounds and Camping Sites has postponed until 2022 due to the pandemic and the restrictions on out of state travel.
- f. Kristie Anderson from the Health Department called me earlier this week and gave us the go ahead for Bigfoot BBQ, so we are continuing to contact vendors, entertainment and competitors; a flyer was put up on our FB Page and all registration forms are on the website, we will continue to advertising to get the word out. Kristie also let me know I am not required to submit any more COVID Plans, with the State opening back up we just need to follow the State Guidelines, which she will also forward as she receives them...we are still very fluid with these guidelines so they will continue to change, right up to

Fair date. I will keep you all apprised of what the protocols are for Fair and events as we get closer. We will be opening the fairgrounds and buildings for rental beginning May 1st and will post COVID Requirements in each building. So even though we do not need to do COVID Plans, we do need to make sure our guests understand the requirements under our current tiers, such as occupancy, sanitation, face coverings, etc.

- g. We had our first Flea Market of the year, although attendance of vendors was low, we still had a good turn out from the public; we made over \$400 which is less than we expected, but now that we are opening back up this will increase. Our next Flea Market will be June 12th since Bigfoot BBQ is in May. We will have a surplus of items to sell, since the estate of Sandy Bechtold has donated items, I am going to look at these with Sharon next week and we will use Karen Leadbetter to help us price everything as she has been a great resource making sure we are getting the proper value for our items.
- h. Currently we have sold \$1645 in Money Tree Raffle Tickets and \$1460 in Tractor Raffle Tickets.
 - 1. \$18,000 worth of tickets out.
- i. Ex Hall Roof repairs, because we are a County owned property, I contacted Paul with Mast Roofing to confirm if he needs to pay prevailing wage for this job, if so, it may make it unaffordable to do within our budget, I did budget \$30,000 for these repairs. I have done some research on snow coat and we could do the minor repairs to the skylights and roof and then spray a snow coat to seal the leaks. This would be a temporary fix until we could get funds through a state allocation such as SB5, which is available to apply for again in 2024. I will continue to research other grant programs to get this repaired if the current plan with Mast falls through.
- j. The Quilt Guild will be having their Quilt Show this year but will require more help from Volunteers and the Fair Staff, due to the reduction in Quilt Membership. They have cancelled their Quilt Auction, which in the past was held on Saturday afternoon of Fair, they do have a few quilts available to auction so we will add them to the end of the Pie, Cake & Craft Auction on Thursday.
- k. Premium Book is almost ready to go to the printer, I am finishing up some final proof updates. It was delayed a couple days because at one point I lost everything and had to call the Adobe company, all they could see was some picture ads that were linked from an outside computer were corrupted with some type of virus, which even at one point was affecting Sue and Christina's systems. I was able to back track by printing one page at a time, then when I came upon a page that was corrupted, I checked the links, if they were not linked to my computer drive then I deleted them and recreated the picture or advertisement from my computer, this fixed the problem and also eliminated a backdoor into our system from whoever had those links on their computer.
- Horse Barns, so we toured the barns and at this time I would like to ask Christina Merritt her recommendations, then discuss Director's recommendations, as the conditions of the barns need immediate attention.
