



"Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love Him. Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth He any man: But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death. Do not err, my beloved brethern. Every good gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning," James 1:12-17. There are many temptations which confront God's people today, the same as in all ages, but the first verse we are using from the book of James says, "Blessed is the man that endureth temptation." There is nothing unique in temptation for we read in 1 Corinthians 10:13 "There is no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it."

Let us look at the word. The Webster dictionary says temptation is "the act of being tempted or enticed to evil." James says in the scripture above, that it is being drawn away of our own lusts and enticed. There is only one kind of temptation but many things a person may be tempted to do. To lust means to have a sensous desire; an inordinate or sinful desire. With this in mind, let us take a look at what God says about one specific sin which today has become a downfall in many homes, and has even become accepted in many churches. Today is saturated with a spirit of permissiveness and what was one time whispered about and frowned upon has become one of the fastest growing sins of our day.

After God made Adam and placed him in the Garden of Eden to dress it, He then made all the animals but there was no companion for Adam. God then took one of Adam's ribs and made Eve. Genesis 2:24 "—a man—shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh."

The prophet Malachi gives a very firm look at the sin of divorce. In chapter 2 he preaches to the priests and the people because of their marrying heathen women. God has always warned against intermarriage between the people who know the word of God and those who are unbelievers. The time of Malachi was several hundred years after God had sanctioned the marriage of Ruth and Boaz, but Ruth. though she was a Moabites had come to believe upon the same God as the Israelites. A heathen is one who does not know God. The prophet continues to say this sin has been compounded because the priests have been the leaders in the offense. Any direct disobedience of God's commands is a sin, yet with the continual practice of this sin in their lives. the Hebrew people covered the altar with their tears because God would not receive their offerings. If any people want the blessings of the Lord they must return to the commandments of our God.

Malachi continues in verses 14-16 of chapter 2. He says they made the sin of intermarriage even worse because they divorced the wives of their youth then married the younger heathen women. God witnessed those marriage vows of that first wedding and made them one. Therefore, according to God's word in verse 14, even though a man shall divorce his wife, she is still his companion. Those marriage vows promise to care for one another, for better or for worse, until death shall part them. Anyone who breaks those vows, whether husband or wife, Malachi says they are dealing treacherously with the other.

By divorcing that first and only companion, the home has been broken and the spirit of virtue and trust which God intended to be in the home, has been destroyed. The children in the home need to feel that trust in both parents. The prophet continues by saying "Therefore let none deal treacherously, (or unfaithfully), against the wife of his youth," meaning that first wife. The Revised Standard Version translates this portion as, "I hate divorce, says the Lord God of Israel." The Living Bible reads, "You were united to your wife by the Lord. In God's wise plan, when you married, the two of you became as one person in His sight. And what does He want? Godly children from your union. Therefore guard your passions! Keep faith with the wife of your youth. For the Lord, the God of Israel, says He hates divorce and cruel men. Therefore control your passions—let there be no divorcing of your wives." The Jewish Talmud says, "Hateful is he that putteth away his wife; even the altar sheddeth tears because of this.'

Where Malachi says "one covereth violence with his garment," he is referring to an ancient custom of a man claiming a woman as wife by casting his outer garment over her. When Ruth went down to the threshing floor of Boaz, as Naomi had bidden her to do, she asked Boaz to cast his skirt over her because he was a near kinsman of Ruth's first husband who was dead. The rest of that story can be read in the book of Ruth, chapters 3 and 4. In Ezekiel 16:8, God likens Israel to a young woman whom He claimed for His wife by casting His skirt over her. Now, back to Malachi 2:16, another translates this phrase, "For one who hates and divorces, says the Lord God of Israel, covers his clothes with violence-so take heed of your spiritual life, and do not be faithless." The same commentator continues with, "Such a man does injustice to her who is as near to him as his garment."

In Mark 10:1-12 as Jesus left Galilee for the last time and went through the Jordan valley and into Perea on His way to Jerusalem, the Pharisees tried once more to ensnare Him with a question. Their subject this time was divorce. They hoped to embroil Him either with Antipas, who was a divorcee, or the Sanhedrin, through a conflict with the Law. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to put away his wife?" Jesus answered them with another question, "What did Moses command you?" The Pharisees then referred to Deuteronomy 24:1 where Moses authorized a bill of divorcement to be given to the women, when her husband left her, that she might be free to marry again. This was not to encourage the practice of divorce but was given as a merciful provision for the wife. Jesus says this provision was made because of the hardness of their hearts. Men were leaving their wives and taking younger women as their wives without provisions for the first wife or the family. In those days, womanhood had no rights. Jesus reminded them that it was not that way in the beginning when God made them male and female and said that a man was to forsake his father and mother and cleave to his wife. God's intention from the beginning, for the human family, was monogamy, which ruled out both pologamy and divorce. Verse 9 says, "What God therefore hath joined together, let no man put asunder."

The Israelites originally were intended to have been an example to their neighboring nations that they might see the power and goodness of the Living God, but instead, they were constantly adopting the heathenistic influences of the heathen neighbors. The divorce subject was no exception. They had, for many years, calloused their hearts to God's words on the subject and made their own rules. In Jesus' day they were under Roman rule and though, previously, for a Jewish women to divorce her husband had been unheard of, it was possible among the Romans. When the disciples, later on, asked Jesus about the same matter, Jesus was not attempting to set forth anything new on divorce but was merely setting forth principles which would raise the entire subject back to the spiritual level of God's will from the beginning.

Matthew, in 5:32 and 19:9, adds another clause to the same instance found in Mark, which we have already discussed. That clause says, "except for fornication," which some feel gives legal grounds for divorce and remarriage to another. This is not the correct interpretation. In the first place adultry or fornication was and still is a personal denial of the marriage vows but does not alter the fact that God joined them together as one when they took those vows. In the second place, to be found guilty of adultry was punishable by stoning." If a damsel that is a virgin be betrothed unto a husband, and a man find her in the city, and lie with her; then ye shall bring them both out unto the gate of the city, and ye shall stone them with stones that they die; the damsel, because she cried not, being in the city; and the man, because he hath humbled his neighbor's wife: so thou shalt put away evil from among you,' Deuteronomy 22:23,24. This is the scripture the people were referring to when they brought the woman found in adultry before Jesus. Even then, they were not holding to the law because it said both the man and the woman were to be stoned. They only brought the women. Jesus does not excuse the fornication which is in this clause in Matthew but continues by saying if either of the divorcees, what ever the excuse for the divorce, if they shall marry another, they are guilty of adultry.

Paul says in 1 Corinthians 7:10,11, "And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, Let not the wife depart from her husband: but and if she depart, let her remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband: and let not the husband put away his wife." Divorce is considered a sin, by God, but to save compounding it, let the divorced people remain unmarried or be reconciled to that companion whom he, or she divorced. Paul says this is not his command but the Lord has said it: then he finishes by saying to save committing sin, do not divorce.

Man may change times, laws and customs but God's Word never changes. When He was naming the sins for which He will judge the people in Malachi 3:6, He specifically named adultry. Then in the following verse He says, "For I am the Lord, I change not." Jesus, as one of the three in the Godhead, made it very clear that in the day He was on the earth, the marriage vows were still as sacred as they were in the beginning. In Hebrews 13:8 we find these words, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever." Not only is Jesus the same today but His word changes not. What was sin then in the sight of God is still sin today.

Let us look again at the verses in James, used in the beginning of this article. Every man, or in this case, every person, is tempted when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Satan did not tempt Eve to eat the forbiden fruit until after she had looked upon it, Genesis 3:6. One is not tempted to be unfaithful until after he has looked with lustful or desirous eyes upon someone else. James continues with saying when lust has taken root it brings forth sin. As the Living Bible translates Malachi—control your passions because James says when sin is finished, it brings forth death.

It is true God will forgive the sin of divorce and remarriage just as He will forgive any sin but divorce carries a scar that cannot be erased. 1 Timothy 3:1.2 says "-if a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work. A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife-". Another translation reads, "married only once." A person who has been divorced and married to another cannot receive God's approval as a bishop. A bishop, according to the dictionary, is a clergyman or a spiritual overseer or director. Verse 11 of the same chapter says the same applies to the deacons and if it applies to them, it undoubtedly applies to the other workers of the church. As already stated, this sin can be forgiven and those who have been guilty can have the fellowship in the church with the other Christians, but in those moments of weakness and yielding to temptation he has cut off the privilege of being a leader, Sunday school teacher, singer or minister because he is not living an irreproachable life.

If you should ever be tempted to break up your home, think twice and, together, call earnestly upon God for in Him is no varibleness, neither shadow of turning. Fasting

Fasting is one of the ordinances of God which we are to keep. We are advised how to fast in Isaiah 58:3-6: "Wherefore have we fasted, say they, and thou seest not? wherefore have we afflicted our soul, and thou takest no knowledge? Behold, in the day of your fast ye find pleasure, and exact all labours.

"Behold, ye fast for strife and debate, and to smite with the fist of wickedness: ye shall not fast as ye do this day, to make your voice to be heard on high.

"Is it such a fast that I have chosen? A day for a man to afflict his soul: Is it to bow down his head as a bulrush, and to spread sackclothe and ashes under him? Wilt thou call this a fast, and an acceptable day to the Lord?

"Is not THIS the fast that I have chosen? TO LOOSE THE BONDS OF WICKEDNESS, TO UNDO THE HEAVY BURDENS, and TO LET THE OPPRESSED GO FREE, and THAT YE BREAK EVERY YOKE?"

Often our fasts are not honored because we do our work as on any other day. We carry on conversations and visit our friends. God will not honor such fasts. He wants us to forget the things of this world and have our minds on Him. If we come to God fasting for the Gospel's sake, denying ourselves for the glory of God, then our fasts will be honored in heaven. Fasting was not placed upon us as a means of punishment or affliction, but the Lord has given us fasting to use as a weapon against the devil. With this weapon the bonds of wickedness are loosed, the oppressed are set free, heavy burdens are rolled away, and every yoke is broken.

We should pray as much as possible while fasting, and we need to study God's word. When Jesus was fasting and the devil came to tempt Him, He said, "It is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God."

We can gain nothing by fasting if we are fasting for a selfish purpose, or to be seen of men. In Matthew 6:16-18 Jesus says, "Moreover when ye fast, be not, as hypocrites, of a sad countenance: for they disfigure their faces, that they may appear unto men to fast. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; that thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly." If we are fasting for the praise of men, then we have our reward in their praise; but if we are fasting for spiritual reasons, we will have treasures laid up in heaven.

What rewards and blessings shall we receive for fasting? In Isaiah 58:8-9 we read, "Then shall thy light spring forth speedily: and thy righteousness shall go before thee; the glory of the Lord shall be thy reward. Then shalt thou call, and the Lord shall be thy reward. Then shalt thou call, and the Lord shall answer; thou shalt cry, and he shall say, Here I am..."

The will of the Lord will not lead you, where the grace of God cannot keep you.

So You Want To Prosper, Huh?

Much has been written lately about the scriptural concept of prosperity and how that it is God's will for His children. To that I add a hearty, "Amen!"

If we were choosing up sides right now and I had my choice to join either the team of the prosperous or the ranks of the unsuccessful, I would chose the prosperous! After all, who really wants to be a failure?

The promise of prosperity really appeals to me. (And, why not, it is God's will!) The condition of God's promise, however, is less appealing than the promise. Nonetheless, it is so very important to me also. Being still wrapped in my natural flesh wrapper and not so long off the shelf, I can remember wanting the results of prosperity without wanting to really fulfill the conditions.

The psalmist begins his collection of songs and praises (the book of the Psalms) with the singular word "blessed." Connected to it is a principle which runs consistently throughout not only the Psalms but the entire Word of God as well. What is that principle?

If a man will simply learn God's Word and diligently apply it to his life, he will make himself blessed and successful. This thought occurs time and time again throughout scripture. David, by beginning the Psalms with this principle, builds the correct foundation for all his writings.

In the New Testament we are told that God will test or shake everything that can be shaken. Can anything connected to man be left standing after God has shaken it? Let's read Luke's Gospel, Chapter 6, verses 46, 47 and 48.

And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?

Whosoever cometh to me, and heareth my sayings, and doeth them, I will shew you to whom he is like:

He is like a man which build an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock.

Notice what is left standing. Go farther than that and notice why it has been unshaken. The man of Luke six remains successful because of three conditions that he has met.

- (1) He came to Jesus. (Jesus was his Source.)
- (2) He heard His sayings. (He was attentive to His word.)
- (3) He did them. (He obeyed the Word of God.)

Notice any parallel between the Luke six man and the blessed man of Psalm one?

The basis for any measure of lasting success is dependent upon continued obedience to God's Word.

Let's return to Psalm 1:1 and that neat word "blessed." It is translated from the Hebrew word 'esher which means "happiness" or "how happy!" 'Esher is derived from the basic root 'asher which means "to be straight, level, right or happy." Figuratively, it means three things.

- (1) To go forward (this speaks of advancement.)
- (2) To be honest (This refers to having pure motives and attitudes.)
- (3) To prosper (This is an all-inclusive term relating to every area of life, not just riches.)

Happiness, then, could be defined as the divine reflection found in a man after God intervenes in his happenings.

What about it, man? Do you want a life that is always on the move in the right direction? Who doesn't! Do you long to be a person whose motive and conscience is right before God and man? You bet! Do you dream of being totally successful? I mean so successful and prosperous that whatever you do ends in success rather than defeat? Come on now, this is beginning to sound like a fairy-tale. Get back down-to-earth, man! O.K., then, let's do get back to earth! Let's get to where the rubber meets the road. God's Word will never present an attainable ideal (in our case, prosperity or blessedness) without also revealing a plan whereby we can achieve the ideal.

God's Plan can be discovered in those first three verses of Psalm one. The "blessed" man has four characteristics. Or, for us, there are four things we need to be aware of and appropriate (personalize) if we are to become prosperous. The first three are negative in nature while the fourth is utterly positive.

First of all the blessed man does not walk in the "counsel of the ungodly." The key word to note here is "counsel." It is translated from the Hebrew word 'etsah. It means "advice or plan."

The prosperous man does not dare go to the ungodly for advice. They see things without the aid of the mind of God.

However, by seeking the wisdom and advice of the saints of the Lord, the blessed man receives little bits of God's mind. Of course, this should be in conjunction with diligently seeking God through prayer and the study of His Word.

Secondarily, the prosperous individual does not stand in the "way of sinners." "Way" surfaces as our key word in this phrase. Derek is the word translated "way" and means "a trodden road; a course of life; and a mode of action."

The highway of the unrighteous is well-traveled. Many have driven on its cold, gray asphalt surface. It is four-lane and 70 m.p.h. all the way! And today's life appears to have that highway jammed bumper-to-bumper with rush-hour traffic. Each exit ramp affords so many sensual allurements complete with flashing neon lights secretly cloaked in darkness. God's highway (in sharp contrast) is a single-lane, ever-climbing road that offers no exit ramps. To voluntarily run off this road would mean the same as self-destruction. Hey, but at the end of this straight and narrow road lies a crystal city snugly wrapped in warm, white light. It is there we end our journey. It is there we receive our welcome, our crown, and our final king.

Thirdly, the successful person does not sit in the "seat of the scornful." "Seat" and "scornful" become our key words here. "Seat," the Hebrew moshab, refers also to "a site, an abode, or an assembly" of persons. Luwts is the word for "scornful" and means "to make mouths at!"

Notice the natural regression of the action verbs used to describe the road of the ungodly and unprosperous man of verse one. Giving in to the haunting of Satan leads a man to begin WALKING in the advice of sinners. Once he has begun this, he finds it very easy to just STOP and STAND around. STANDING around doing nothing for a long enough period of time makes it so easy to just SIT DOWN. Once SITTING this unprosperous man begins to make fun of his former life. He also begins to criticize the faith of believers. Let us take this as a gentle warning from God.

Oh! But that isn't characteristic of the prosperous or blessed man. This leads us to point 4 in our study. The prosperous man has "his delight in Law of the Lord.**"

"Delight," or the Hebrew chephets, means "pleasure in or desire (of a valuable thing.")

Not only does the word "delight" give us an idea of the ideal attitude toward God's Word, but it also infers that the object of his delight is extremely valuable. (Take time to read Psalms 19:10, 119:72, and 119:127.)

Delighting in the Word touches me inside in a way I have no words to explain. But, listen, just how do I delight in scripture? Verse two tells us both how and when to do it. "And in his law doth he meditate day and night."

Mr. Bill Gothard, founder and instructor for the Institute in Basic Youth Conflicts, remarked that there is only one thing we are allowed to meditate on. That is scripture. He continued to say that if any person could discover an area of time which was neither day nor night, then he or she was at liberty to meditate on other things.

To further increase our understanding of what meditation is, let's study its Hebrew equivalent, hagah. Hagah means "to murmur (in pleasure or anger) or to ponder." Synonyms might be to think about, talk about, study about, sing about, meditate upon, read about and more.*

So, here is the final unfolding of the plan. Delight yourself in His Word! How? Read it. Have a set daily time to systematically read through both the Old and New Testaments. Study it, ask questions about the author of each book, why he wrote it and to whom it was written. Ponder

it. Ask how it applies to us today. Obey it. Internalize it. Hide it in your heart and do it. Confess it. Let it become a natural part of your conversation.

Until now our study has concentrated on the conditions or plans given by God. Now let's see what happend in the believer's life after he has begun to saturate himself with scripture. Results, man! Let's get to those results!

There are three main results. The first of these is summed up in the first word of the first verse of the first chapter of the Psalms—"Blessed!" The man who delights himself in God's Word becomes "blessed." He becomes ever-advancing. His motives become pure and honest. Generally speaking he is prosperous.

The second result is that he will "be like a tree." This "tree," 'ets, has firmness as its dominant characteristic. The connotation is that this man is firm, not like a bowl of jelly which is easily shaken and divided.

The tree itself has three characteristics of its own. Notice, first of all, that it is "planted by the rivers of water." The two most striking words found here are "planted" (Shathal) and "rivers" (peleg).

The definition of shathal is not merely to plant but "to transplant!" What insight we gain when we visualize this tree being yanked out of poor, dry, wind-blown and sun-parched ground to be re-planted in rich, humus, moist, black soil.

Peleg doesn't strictly mean a river like the Mississippi, Missouri, or Arkansas Rivers. It doesn't even mean a little stream like Sugar Creek or Shoal Creek. It actually refers to "small irrigation channels." The implication could be that these irrigation ditches have flood gates nearby which regulate the flow of nourishment to the tree. The insight we gain from this knowledge of the facts is that the gates are kept wide open in relation to the amount of quality time spent meditating in scripture.

A tree that is healthy can survive for an extended amount of time after the flow of food has been cut off. The same is also true in the spiritual realm. We do not always immediately reflect the effects of decreased spiritual feeding. Beware. Time will tell on that tree and time will tell on us.

The second characteristic of the tree is that it brings forth its fruit "in its season."

Fruit is a natural by-product of scriptural meditation. But, in an edict set down by God in Genesis and in effect until the cessation of time, there will always remain a season of planting, dying, cultivating, bearing and reaping. In less technical terminology, don't look for AUTOMATIC RESULTS! A farmer doesn't plant his rice on Monday then gather his family and hired hands together on Tuesday to harvest mature heads of grain. Unthinkable! Yet, I've been guilty of wanting automatic spiritual fruit the very next day or week or month not realizing that "to EVERYTHING there is a season." (note Ecclesiastes 3:1-8.) So, don't be like me and see "fruit" in verse three without realizing it can only come forth "in its season."

Be aware of the third characteristic of the tree itself. This tree had "leaves" which "shall not wither." These "leaves" which neither "fall away, faint, nor fail" are relative. That is, the promise of an unfailing leaf is only in effect in relation to the quality time invested in the meditation of God's Word. The word "wither" also means "to be foolish." It is foolish not to meditate upon scripture.

To me a leaf would connote shade and protection. With that in mind, I envision my total life as one of those great, spreading oak trees that sit so magnificently on the inky-black banks of Oyster Creek near Bailey's Prarie, Texas. With over 60 inches of annual rainfall and an unceasing supply of food; those giant oaks reach upward toward the heavens with great leafy boughs. Talk about a work of protection and shade! Why, to stand beneath one of them is to never come into contact with that scorching-hot, Gulf Coast sun. To seek the great oak's protection is to be safe and dry from those sudden, South Texas cloudbursts. They become God's natural umbrellas.

As I mature in God's Word and His love, I can become a great spreading oak of shade and protection for some person. My leaves can provide protection and healing as I become increasingly sensitive to the hurtings of God's people. (Do you remember the tree of life in Revelation 22:2 and the function of its covering?)

Now, let's touch on the third and final result found within the man who saturates himself with scripture and seeks to make it a vibrant part of his life. The final part of verse three says, "whatever he does will prosper!"

Wow, that's a mouthful! But "whatever?" Whatever he does will propser? Yes, but here is the catch. No one who fulfills the requirements of meditation will attempt to do anything contrary to the nature of God expressed in His Word. Meditation, for our study purposes, goes far beyond simply musing about God's Word. Meditation is the function which directs us to make scripture the center of our very being. Therefore, every plan we make, every deed we do, every thought we think, every word we speak revolves around that scripture hidden in our hearts. Yes, "Whatever" the blessed man does will push forward. It will be a success. He will be a success.

How does your tree appear right now? Is it weak and sickly with drooping limbs and crusty, falling leaves? Are those ditches near the trunk completely dry?

Perhaps your's appear strong and healthy but those irrigation ditches running next to its root system have only a trickle of stagnant, muddy water in them. It could only be a matter of time for you.

However, you might be growing and growing and experiencing and experiencing and beginning to bear more and more fruit. You may honestly be able to say that the flood gates are wide open and those ditches cannot contain the flow of water.

"I'm patiently waiting for my season to come," might sum up your life presently.

Well, no matter which tree you or I might resemble right now, Jesus doesn't condemn us. Instead, He tenderly calls us unto Himself by saying, "Come unto me. Dive deep into the crystal clear waters of My words and let their healing flow deep within you. Let them restore you. Let them cleanse you in every area of your life so that whatever you do will prosper."

(*Read Joshua 1:8. This is the only time in the entire Bible the word "success" is used. What are the three requirements for a man to fulfill in order to be successful?)

(**"Law of the Lord" in the O.T. sense refers to the Pentateuch. Since we are fellow heirs of the N.T. (a new covenant,) how much more have we to "delight in!")
