MAJOR CHANGES are taking place at the park. The OSLAD grant projects have begun. Those projects include the following: widening and resurfacing the walking path, resurfacing the tennis court, new basketball court surface, installing new playground equipment and a new pavilion by the ball diamond that will eventually include the concession stand, restrooms, and storage.

GRANT SHORTFALL: The OSLAD grant of \$318,000 requires matching village funds of \$318K. To date the board has \$180K (\$130K from fundraisers) set aside for the project. We will need to borrow money to come up with the balance of our \$318K match. The grant, (which included pre-covid bids) will be used for the walking path, tennis and basketball courts and playground equipment, but will not be enough to cover the full cost of the pavilion, with only a roof and a floor to be completed this year. Walls, lighting, restrooms, concession stand, kitchen and storage for the pavilion project will be completed as soon as money becomes available.

WORK HAS BEGUN: Restrooms, the concession stand, and the ball storage buildings were demolished in July. The village has contracted Grunloh Construction of Effingham to complete as much as the OSLAD grant will allow. Work is scheduled for July through September 2024.

FUNDRAISERS: To complete the park restrooms, concession stand and pavilion will require additional funding. We are researching and applying for other grants and we ask the community to be supportive of upcoming fundraisers. The first fundraiser will be a joint effort by SCAN, the Strasburg Lions and LEO Clubs and the Village Board. See Page 4 for details on the Burrito meal fundraiser.

Other announcements:

1st: Do not let your dogs roam the town off a leash. Dogs are the owners' responsibility. If animal control is called, you may have to pay the \$100 fee.

2nd: Thank you to Lisa Rincker for covering the office while Linda was off.

3rd: If you have not gotten your golf cart permit, do so soon while the weather is good. Vehicles that do not have a permit sticker are subject to penalty set by state law.

Loss of 3 Local Teens leaves a void in the Hearts of the Strasburg and Stewardson Communities

The Communities of Strasburg and Stewardson were hit hard in July when a UTV collision with a grain hauler killed three Stewardson-Strasburg teens who would have been incoming freshman girls. The accident occurred at 5:30 p.m. on July 10 at the intersection of County Roads 1200 North and 1350 East, east of Strasburg.

The deceased are Karly Wetherell, 13, of Stewardson; Edie Wittenberg, 14, of Strasburg; and Sienna Bostedo, 14 of Mode.

A Prayer Vigil was held the evening of July 11 at the Stew-Stras HS gym and was organized and led by Stew-Stras superintendent Justin Deters, Rev. Kene Whybrew of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Strasburg, and Rev. David Weaver of Trinity Lutheran Church in Stewardson. The gym was completely full as both pastors read scripture and brought people together in prayer.

A visitation for Edie, Karly, and Sienna was held from 2-8 p.m. on Tuesday, July 16 in the Stewardson-Strasburg High School gym, with thousands of people lined up for hours to pay their respects and remember the three.

The outpouring of care and support for the families has continued for several weeks with fundraisers, gifts, food, yard signs, and bracelets. The three were teammates and friends who excelled in both athletics and scholastics. They had all professed their faith in God this spring during the rite of confirmation, Karly and Edie at St. Paul's Lutheran Church and Sienna at Trinity Lutheran Church. Many stories and memories of these young ladies have been shared on Facebook by teachers, coaches, and friends of the family. We have all gotten to know even more how

special these three were.
