Bee Box -taught by Nancy

Surface is on a round 7" or $7\frac{1}{2}$ " papier mache box. Pattern can be changed to fit a surface of your choice. This design makes a cute memory box also.

Palette: Decoart Americana

Plantation Pine, Houser Medium Green, Hauser Dark Green, Winter Blue, Tomato Red, Deep Burgundy, Zinc, Black, Warm White, Moon Yellow, Honey Brown, Lemonade

Usual painting supplies, including a mop

Prep:

Box with watermelon:

Using a large flat brush and Plantation Pine paint down about 1/3 of the area from top of box to the watermelon line.

Wipe the brush but do not clean it and pick up Hauser Medium Green and paint the next 1/3 of the area. Blend colors together where they meet and mop if needed.

Wipe the brush again and paint Winder Blue to watermelon. Blend colors together where they meet and mop if needed. Go beyond the watermelon line with the Winter Blue. When Blue is dry trace watermelon line back on box.

Paint the watermelon area with Tomato Red.

<u>Box without watermelon:</u>


Using a large flat brush and Plantation Pine paint down about 1/3 of the lid.

Wipe but don't clean brush and pick up Hauser Medium Green and paint the next 1/3 down, blending where the two colors meet and mop if needed.

Wipe the brush again and pick up Winter Blue and finishing painting down to bottom of box . Blend colors together where they meet and mop if needed.

Trace pattern onto box.

The bottom and edges are painted a color of choice. Original is Plantation Pine.

Jingle Bell Snowman

Palette:	Ivory (Delta)	Golden Brown	Tomato Spice	Maroon
	Tangerine	Pumpkin	Black	Dark Goldenrod
	Spice Brown	White	Raw Sienna	Mudstone

* Substituted True Ochre for Dark Golden brown; Slate Grey for Mudstone; Buttermilk for Ivory. If you do not have all the paint colors substitute! Barb's designs are the perfect pieces to use what you have instead of buying new paint.

Wash the glass block and wipe it down with alcohol to remove any fingerprints or any type of residue.

When dry sponge on "Ivory" or "Buttermilk" in an up and down motion, all the way to outside edges. This should be a solid coverage not a hit or miss. *You should not see any glass through the paint, even after first coat.* Sponge 2 coats of "Ivory" on front of the brick, letting each coat dry as long as possible. Preferably overnight!

Mottling: This is very easy to do, but if you are working on glass you have to work quickly. If you let the water sit too long on the Ivory basecoat it will lift. Working mainly toward the top of the brick since his coat will cover most of the bottom. Using a round brush Place a small puddle of Raw Siena on your palette and then thin it with water (...maybe half and half). With a clean damp brush wet the ivory background and quickly apply thinned raw Sienna in spots so it will spread. Direct the paint with a fan or hair dryer set on low heat. Leave a little Ivory showing in places, as well as having some Dark Raw Sienna areas. When this is dry (preferably overnight) gently apply your pattern. Your paint will still be very tender.

Basecoat:

Base the snowman's head with Buttermilk

Base his hat and the outer rim of the brick with Black

Base his coat and hat band with Tomato Spice

Brushes used by Barb: 3/8 DM stippler; ½ DM Stippler; #8 Flat Series 7300; #2 JS Liner; 18/0 liner series 75050 La Corneille; 1/4 Angular Shader Series 7400 and 3/8 Angular Shader series 7400.

This Project can be painted on the surface of your choice. Glass Block are available at Hobby Lobby and go on sale frequently. It would be cute on a skinny chalkboard or a small barrel stave. Use your imagination!!!


