

Basically, you will need to make sure you have all information when you go down to the permit office. This includes (but is not limited to): a copy of each Maintenance Technician's card, a completed Electrical Permit Application (including the names and card numbers of each maintenance technician or electrician), and a copy of the certificate of insurance in the stated amounts and insured. Also, be sure that each Maintenance Technician's card is current/valid when applying. Last but not least, do not forget to take a check!

Some additional helpful info: if you are going to renew a card, check in at the info desk and get a number. You will need to see a clerk. If you are going to renew your permit, bypass the front desk and go upstairs. See Mimi Camargo with all your paperwork completed and in hand.

For those of you who are taking classes, attending the Thursday training, attending seminars, etc, thank you for taking the time to further advance your knowledge and increasing your marketability! Trust me...this will pay off down the road.



# Communications Check-Up<sup>®</sup>

#### Stylebooks

Nearly all writers, journalists, and editors have a variety of stylebooks on their professional bookshelf. Stylebooks lend consistency to a publication by making sure that information is presented in the same manner from issue to issue and from writer to writer. One of the most popular stylebooks is "The Association Press Stylebook." Here are some of their more useful suggestions:

- Acronyms: It's usually best to omit periods in capitalized acronyms (which is why you always see "SAABE" and not "S.A.A.B.E"). Exceptions: when the no-period acronym ends up spelling an unrelated word, or two-letter acronyms (such as U.S. or D.C.).
- Afterward: Like that, not "afterwards."
- Ages: Use figures for people and animals, and spell out for inanimate objects ("my dog is 7 years old" and "the chiller is ten years old").
- Building: Not capitalized in general, except when part of a proper name ("Empire State Building").
- Capital and Capital: The first (with an a) is a city where the seat of government is located; it also describes money or equipment when used in a financial sense. The second (with an o) are the buildings in Washington, Austin, etc.; it's usually capitalized ("the U.S. Capitol").
- Company Names: Visit the Standard and Poor's Register of Corporations online or company websites to determine the correct presentation of the name (for example, the beverage "Dr Pepper" doesn't use a period in that initial abbreviation). Don't use a comma before Inc. or Ltd. &

### **News from the City of San Antonio**

- Project Cool Seeks Fan Donations for the Elderly: The City of San Antonio again has joined forces with residents and several local corporate and human service organizations to collect and distribute electric box fans to help elderly citizens who may suffer most from high summer temperatures. Through the City's Project Cool Program, citizens are asked to donate new box fans by dropping them off at any local fire station. Fans will be distributed to eligible clients in San Antonio and Bexar County through Catholic Charities and the Society of St. Vincent DePaul.
- Main Plaza Redevelopment Project Update: Dolorosa Street from Flores to Dwyer will partially close on Tuesday, July 10. Downtown drivers may wish to take alternate traffic routes next week as the block of Dolorosa from Flores to Dwyer streets will narrow to two lanes beginning Tuesday, July 10 until Monday, July 16. The partial closure will allow construction crews to continue infrastructure improvements as part of the Main Plaza Redevelopment Project. Visitors to the courthouse will be able to enter at the south entrance at Nueva Street. The north entrance will remain closed until the Main Plaza Redevelopment Project nears completion in the spring of 2008.
- Applications Sought for City Boards and Commissions: San Antonio residents are encouraged to get involved in their local government by serving on a City board or commission. Applications are being sought for several At-Large City boards or commissions, including the South Fort Sam Houston Development Advisory Board, the Air Transportation Advisory Commission, the Convention and Visitors Commission, and the Municipal Civil Service Commission. The deadline date to submit applications is July 20, 2007. See the website for application details. ❖

I should have started a diary long ago because Peyton Place wouldn't have a thing on the stories I can tell.❖


