

 General secretary signs letter to new administration calling for defense of dignity of all people

Church of the Brethren general secretary David Steele is one of the American faith leaders who have sign a letter to president-elect Donald Trump calling on the incoming administration to robustly defend the dignity of all people. The letter also was copied to the members of the 115th Congress.

The letter was created with leadership from the National Religious Campaign Against Torture (NRCAT). "In advance of confirmation hearings on executive branch nominations, national faith leaders sent a letter to President-elect Trump sharing their hopes and prayers that he would advance American values and defend all people from torture, genocide, and other assaults on human dignity," said an NRCAT release about the letter.
