Playing for Keeps: Play Therapy Techniques to Promote Regulation and Resilience for Children with Anne Stewart, Ph.D., RPT-S



Dr. Stewart is a professor of psychology at James Madison University. She has worked to promote the secure attachment and resilience of children and families in projects throughout the world. Dr. Stewart has implemented education and intervention projects addressing the psychosocial problems of landmines in Jordan, Bosnia, Vietnam, and Cambodia. In the United States, she served as a consultant and service provider after Hurricane Katrina, the 9/11 attacks, Virginia earthquakes, the Virginia Tech University and Sandy Hook School shootings, and other catastrophic events. Books written with colleagues include Becoming a Community Counselor and Thriving! A Manual for Students in the Helping Professions. She is co-editor, with David Crenshaw of Play Therapy: A Comprehensive Guide to Theory and Practice.

Anne is the founder and president of the Virginia Association for Play Therapy, Chair, National Foundation for Play Therapy, and past member of the Education Board for the International Journal of Play Therapy. Dr. Stewart served as the director of the James Madison University Human Development Center and The Department of Health and Child Development Clinic. She received a gubernational appointment to the Virginia Interagency Collaboration Committee for infants and toddlers with disabilities, where she served as a chair. Dr. Stewarts scholarship focuses on caregiverchild relationships, attachment security, interprofessional practice, and resilience, particularly in times of crisis and disaster. Dr. Stewart is an active collaborator with Virginia Child and Family Attachment Center. She is recipient of the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia Outstanding Faculty award, the Association for Play Therapy "Distinguished Service" Award, and the Virginia Counselor's Association "Humanitarian and Caring Person" Award.

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Day 1- Reaching Out to Children who lash out: Play Therapy with Children with Aggressive Behaviors.



The workshop presenter will share information on the complex interaction of factors which have been shown to increase the risk of aggressive behavior. These factors include being the victim of physical abuse and/or sexual abuse, exposure to violence in the home and/or community, exposure to violence in the media, and stressful family socioeconomic factors. The importance of secure attachment relationships to help children regulate their emotions and behaviors will be discussed, along with strategies to promote positive connections through play therapy and play-based techniques.

As a result of the workshop participants will learn to look for what is contributing to the anger and aggressive behavior and learn to practice play therapy and expressive arts techniques to help children identify and regulate intense emotions that contribute to aggressive behavior.



Day 2- Wired for Resilience: Using Play Therapy to Promote Attachment, Regulation, and Healing in Crisis

Although a crisis can leave destruction and heartbreak in its wake, play therapists can help children and families not only to survive, but also to go on to thrive. A fundamental goal of the workshop is for play therapists to recognize the ways that they can value and promote health attachments and resilient coping in times of crisis. Our goal as play therapists is not to treat children and families as helpless victims, but to support them to find ways to reach out, make meaning, take heart, and discover creative pathways, to rebuild in response to the disruption they have sustained. During the workshop we will explore techniques that promote attachment, regulation, and collective resilience and resolve.


