A Year in the life on Bisterne

As Covid rumbled on, 2022 was a year when we all started to emerge again and feel relatively normal.

In May, combined with the Stable Family Home Trust, the **Manor garden** opened through the **National Garden Scheme**. 250 people came through the gate to walk through both gardens and be rewarded with the offer of tea and cake while being serenaded by the Ringwood & Burley Rand

On the same day, the **Young Farmers' Club bi-annual Steam Rally** took place at Kingston Farm which was a great success and raised over £3000 for their chosen charity which was a tremendous effort.

June was a busy month starting with **HM The Queen's Diamond Jubilee Street Party and Barn Dance**. The weather was on the cool side so no chances were taken and the food was

laid up on trestle tables in a barn at Kingston. Festooned with bunting and flags, we were put through our paces by an enthusiastic caller who had driven all the way from Swansea!

The following w/e **Open Farm Sunday** brought 4000 people to Brixey's Farm for an educational day out to see the milking parlour, and be offered tractor rides through the woods with informative stands to learn the ways and crafts of the countryside. **The South Avon and Stour Agricultural Society** Committee did a great job organising this event. St Paul's Church, Bisterne, one of the six churches in the Ringwood Benefice, continues to offer two services each month on the **first (18.00) and third (10.30) Sundays**. The Vicar resigned in July to become Archdeacon of Derby City so a worthy group of retired clergy or lay preachers currently preside at services. Probationers under supervision do a great job keeping the churchyard in order, the grass cut and the hedges neat and tidy. The church was originally built for the Estate workers to save interved and otherwise the congregation has divingled as were the warry it continues to provide comfort.

them walking or bicycling into Ringwood and although the congregation has dwindled over the years, it continues to provide comfort and solace to all who use it for regular worship, christenings, weddings or funerals. The **Harvest Festival** at the end of September brought in representatives from all the churches in the Benefice and was a wonderful celebration of rural life. On **Remembrance Sunday** a short service took place by the War Memorial to commemorate the fallen, the names read out and the last post played, a poignant reminder not to forget and to thank all those who lost their lives on our behalf. The annual **Carol Service** will take place on **Sunday 18**th **December at 11.00am**, an opportunity to come and sing some of the old favourites.

At the end of August the annual **Scarecrow Competition** took place with people flocking from all over the locality and further afield to come and see the innovative creations. The Village Hall Committee is responsible for organising this event and it is a key way to raise funds for the Hall. In September the scarecrows are all gathered on to a float for the Ringwood Carnival, and this year were rewarded with a Bronze award for their efforts.

The Stable Family Home Trust continue to hold fundraising events throughout the year and in September gave a marvellous Jazz and Soul concert in the garden. These are public events and all are welcome to attend. They raise awareness for the charity which provides vital support for adults with special needs.

After HM the Queen's death, on the eve of her funeral on September 18th, the Government encouraged communities to get together for a minute's silence. Tenants and locals gathered at the Manor when Hallam, in his role as a Deputy Lieutenant of Hampshire, read out the letter of condolence and reread the Proclamation for King Charles's succession. The National Anthem was sung followed by refreshments. I think everyone felt her loss and it was good to share feelings.
