

Dial Down the Anxiety

Parenthood can be fraught with crises and potential tragedy. But while a reasonable amount of worry is inevitable, high levels of anxiety can cause us to miss out on joyful moments in the present as we fret about the future. The Arch-diocese of Baltimore's online site, the *Catholic Review*, has a good suggestion: "A technique to deal with anxiety is to ask a question: 'Am I focusing on God , or am I focusing on the problem?' Focusing on the problem expands the problem and the anxiety." Giving the problem to God in prayer can bring peace even if the answer remains uncertain. Those who feel less anxious are able to keep their eyes on the big picture. Their faith allows them to understand that from the current cycle of suffering will come resurrection and new life - maybe not immediately, but in God's time.
