Prayer in Ordinary Life: The Water of Creation

This month I wanted to share a sneak preview with the church of what Lauren has been working on for the denomination. She was asked to write material for the Week of Prayer coming out in January of 2018. This material will be online and available in print in multiple languages. The following is "Day 1":

Read: "Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." (Genesis 2:2)

Devotion: Out of depth, God creates the universe. This depth mentioned in Genesis is no ordinary emptiness. The Hebrew word *tehom* suggests an ongoing primal catastrophe that preceded God's creative activity but was subdued by his power. God's creative activity culminates with his declaration of the sabbath. As people we are made in God's image. Knowing that God's creative action works



to subdue catastrophic darkness, indicates that God works alongside us to create meaning out of the mystery and depth of our lives. God faces catastrophic darkness with us and creates good out of depth we cannot comprehend. As we look to the creation story as a model for the good God brings out of chaos, let us pray for eyes that see God's invitation to creative work as a path to sabbath rest. Life often does not hold sufficient answers for unspeakable circumstances. However, when we know that God is with us amidst the darkness, perhaps we can also meet God in rest, resolving to spend one day of the week living as though we had all the answers, as though God's promise to make all things new had been fulfilled.

Prayer Practice: Today be mindful of God's creative action over the face of the waters while cleaning up after dinner. Washing dishes or loading the dishwasher are two ordinary places to find a parallel to God's creation of good from darkness. When we wash dishes, the dirty object is immersed into the hot water and emerges clean. It is ready for its next use. Likewise, God moves over the chaos of the waters and generates life. Remember the "Spirit of God hovers over the waters", each time you interact with water: a sink, a dishwasher, a shower, or bath.

In a group setting: experiment with artistic creation. Have colored pencils, paper, play-dough, markers, and watercolors available. Spend some time thinking over the creation story and illustrating the deep waters mentioned in Genesis. Try to let the image move with your feeling, and resist the temptation to illustrate a known experience or object. If abstraction is challenging, create a picture with large waves, churning rapids or a whirlpool. How does it feel to think about the mystery from which God created the universe?

For children: fill a bucket or sink with water. Put several objects in the bottom of the water. Such as a stone, spoon, matchbox car, or other toys that will remain at the bottom of the bucket. Encourage children to reach into the water and pull out the objects. As they celebrate retrieving objects from the water, help them connect their discoveries to God's creative action in Genesis.

Prayer: God, whose face was known in mystery, invite me to see myself as made in your image. As you moved in love to generate life, nurture me through your creative action. Restore my life from chaos, as you did when you created the world out of the depths. Weave new connections between you and I, myself and others, myself and your image in me. As I face many waters, re-create me. Grant me rest in your good creation.

Day 2: God can build your life the right way through Jesus.


Day 3: Jesus can forgive you and give you a new, changed life.

Despite this, our children's needs for development and our responsibility to guide and assist them are the same.

In the Bible Paul encourages us to consider only those things that are true, right, and noble (Phil.4:8)

We are also encouraged to live godly lives, and be lights in the world, rather than belonging to the world. (Titus 2:12, Mt. 5:14, Jn15:19)

As a family we could lift up in prayer, our children, their friends and other families. Consider web sites for movie reviews and consider saying no to movies that focus on behaviors we don't want our children to copy and also consider similar standards for ourselves. (Phil4:8)

Consider limiting technology time for your kids on a daily basis. Having face to face time with your kids and they with their friends will bring positive, fun outcomes this summer!

Here is a little information regarding what a Parish Nurse is:

A parish nurse is a professional registered nurse who provides for the emotional, physical and spiritual needs of people. Parish nurse responsibilities may include the following:

- 1. Integrator of faith and Health-Tends to both the physical and emotional health and wellness of people.
- 2. Health Educator-Provides opportunities for the congregation to learn about health issues.
- 3. Health Counselor-Discusses health concerns, emphasizing early response to small problems and encouraging healthy life style changes.
- 4. Referral Advisor-Refers members to healthcare and social services within the community.
- 5. Health Advocate-Helps congregational or community members obtain needed health-related services.
- 6. Developer of Support Groups-Facilitates the development of support groups for the faith community and others.
- 7. Volunteer Coordinator-Recruits, prepares and oversees congregational volunteers.
