St. Monica's Home plus Habitat for Humanity and other local needs

Small Lap--45x50 to Nap Lap--55x70

Operation Snuggles – quilts for soldiers' children, Camp Serenity, and Wounded Warriors

Baby to twin bed—36x36 to 60x75

TC Wiley for Foster Children's Project Baby to Large Lap—40x40 to 55x70

Please find our Charity Quilt BLUE WASH BASKETS where there will be:

- A slip of paper for you to say WHERE your quilt goes and if it's WASHED or not
 - A **place** to leave your quilt (two wash baskets!) before OR after Show & Tell

Quilt size can range from 36 x36 to 60 x 75—see sizes above.

QUILTS for the COMMUNITY 2017 REPORT

The First Friday, Lighthouse and Rainbow Quilters donated a total of 234 quilts in 2017!

18 Women's Resource Center

40 NICU, All Saints, Racine

22 St. Monica's Home, Racine plus 8 walker bags

16 Children's Hospital, Milwaukee

84 Operation Snuggles to Camp Serenity in Tomahawk WI

40 Wounded Warrior Quilts includes 10 to Union Grove Homeless Vets

36 Racine Foster Children includes

23 made & given by the Wannabee Quilters of Lighthouse Quilters

16 Other ~ includes 4 to Habitat for Humanity

272 TOTAL GIVEN out in 2017 with help from our **quilter friends** in Southport Quilters, Kenosha, who gave 15 quilts in the above total for Camp Serenity plus 23 quilts from 2016.

We have quilts left to give in 2018 to Wounded Warriors in Racine & Milwaukee, Camp Serenity, Children's Hospital and wherever needed.

The estimated total of 272 quilts is over \$100,000!!! This total includes fabric used and time served! Pretty amazing!!

The needs for 2018 are Racine Foster Kids Program, Camp Serenity, Wounded Warriors and local veterans' needs so keep making guilts in sizes 36 x 36 to 60 x 70!

QUILT CAMPS FOR 2018

WINTER: March 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 at Lutherdale on Lauderdale Lakes near Elkhorn about 1hour west of Racine. This camp is run by Barb Vallone, qltingb@gmail.com or Contact her for questions at 262-639-8185.

Cost varies by the day of the week:

Wed, March 7, \$42, arrive after 11 am, no meals until Thursday breakfast at 10 am Thu, March 8, \$72, arrive in time for 10 am brunch or at least for supper at 5:30 Fri & Sat, March 9 & 10, \$82 each night Departure is by 2 pm on Sun, March 11.

SPRING: April 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 at Lutherdale again. This camp is run by Lutherdale so you must contact them directly at 262-742-2352 to register. They accept charge cards over the phone for a deposit or full payment. Cost is based on arrival dates:

Wed, April 11 to April 15, \$240, arrive after 12 noon on Wed,

Depart by 2 pm on Sun

Thu, April 12 to April 15, \$210, arrive by 10 am on Thu, depart by 2 pm on Sun Fri, April 13 to April 15, \$170, arrive by 10 am on Fri, depart by 2 pm on Sun

NEW QUILT CAMP LOCATION IN 2018!!!!

I am very excited to tell everyone that I am now using a wonderful place called St. Iakovos Retreat Center owned by the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago. This is a new Retreat Center located in Kansasville just west of Union Grove and a short drive south of Hwy 11. I have to call this a "Quilt Resort" because it is truly elegant. Their web site is www.GoSIRC.org so you can go for a virtual visit. I have sewing space for 35 quilters and, yes, I now have a commuter option! For this Quilt Resort, you need to send me a deposit when you sign up so I reserve your spot. **Deposit required: \$100 for overnight quilters and \$50 for commuting quilters.** There are two choices for 2018:




