Manager's Report - March 21, 2024

I was on vacation for the first week of March and things ran well with Jeff and Casey at the helm. A committee for recycling from the town of Winterport contacted me to learn about recycling here. During the week of March 4th two members from that committee came to tour the Center with Mike. Last week I went to meet with the whole committee to tell them more about the Center. Winterport currently recycles with EcoMaine. They pay \$55,000/year for transportation and another \$3,300/month for recycling. Winterport has a population of approximately 4000 people.

I have been working on the Annual Solid Waste Management Report which is due 4/30. Traffic so far for the month has been 366.

MRRA is having their trade show and conference April 29-30. There is training from the DEP for Hazardous and special waste on Tuesday (April 30). We were without phone/internet a couple days this week. The line at the pole had issues and Direct Communications came to fix it.
