Forgive and you will be Forgiven

Forgiveness is a Christian virtue. It is the hallmark of our Christian faith and practice. Truly forgiving another from our heart is a form of loving and caring. Forgiveness is a spiritual act, which means that, ultimately, we rely on God's grace to accomplish it. Sometimes we hesitate to forgive because we think it must automatically include reconciliation. These are two separate processes, and one does not always lead immediately to the other. There are two approaches to reconciliation. One is the human approach where we expect the offender to acknowledge the wrong done, apologise for it, repair the injury and in return receive forgiveness from the victim.

The other approach is the Christian understanding of reconciliation, where we see how freely God has forgiven us our offences. Inspired by divine forgiveness, we extend forgiveness to the one who offended us. Here reconciliation does not begin with the offender, but with the victim. God will forgive the one that forgives others and God's Spirit will dwell within the forgiving person.

The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant in today's Gospel raises the frightening prospect that forgiveness already granted by God could be revoked. The king who forgave his servant his debt meant it. But when the servant went out and failed to forgive his fellow servant, the king revoked the pardon. By his action the servant had shown that he did not appreciate and therefore was unworthy of the pardon given to him. Is this how God deals with us? That seems to be the point of the parable. Jesus tells us that His Heavenly Father will not forgive us if we do not forgive our brother or sister from our heart. In other words, when God gives us His word of forgiveness, everything is not over yet. The deal is finally concluded only when we are able to go out and forgive those who sin against us.

The free grace of God's forgiveness needs our response of forgiving our neighbour to be finally ratified. This is indeed a frightening thought. Hence the first reading tells us to forgive our neighbours the wrong they have done, and then our sins will be pardoned when we pray. In real life, we find it so hard to forgive others even though it is the only way to obtain God's forgiveness. Often we fail to appreciate and celebrate God's forgiveness like the ungrateful servant in the parable. We tend to focus on the little things that others owe us rather than the larger amounts we owe to God; which God has graciously chosen to forgive.

Hence forgiveness has to be part and parcel of our Christian lives. May we learn to experience the depth of God's forgiving love in Christ and may we in turn learn to expand our hearts, stretching its limits to match the breadth and the height, the length and the depth of God's love.

His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt.
