#### THIS DATE IN HISTORY

June 2, 1965 As U.S. Marines & ARVN troops mount a joint operation against Viet Cong forces in the area of Chu Lai air base, they are supported by naval gunfire from USS Canberra offshore.

**June 19-July 1, 1966** Elements of the U.S. 1st Cavalry Division & 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne, conduct Opera -tion Nathan Hale, a search & destroy mission to clear and secure Tuy Hoa Valley in Phu Yen Province, II Corps.

**June 1-July 26, 1967** The 2nd Brigade, 9th Infantry Division, and the Mobile Riverine Force conduct Operation Coronado, their first major operation in the Mekong Delta.

**June 8-Aug 14, 1969** The 101st Airborne Division and 3rd ARVN Regiment conduct Operation Montgomery Rendezvous, a follow-on operation to Apache Snow to deny the North Vietnamese use of the A Shau Valley in Thua Thien Province, I Corps.

#### Sweeping Veterans Health Care Bill becomes a Law

In a ceremony June 6, President Trump signed the John S. McCain III, Daniel K. Akaka and Samuel R. Johnson VA Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks Act, also called the VA MIS-SION Act, into law. The comprehensive legislation impacts how veterans receive their health care through the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). It also includes provisions to consolidate community care programs into a single, streamlined service; provides sufficient funding to extend the program through 2019; expands comprehensive assistance; strengthens ability to recruit, hire and retain quality medical personnel; and reforms the VA health-care infrastructure. The legislative package is comprised of five titles that address major areas of deficit, including increased access to private-sector care, consolidation of community care programs, expansion of the Family Caregiver Program and the recruitment of qualified medical professionals.

Title I: Caring for our Veterans—Establishment of Community Care Programs

Title II: VA Asset and Infrastructure Review

Title III: Improvements to Recruitment of Healthcare Professionals

Title IV: Health Care in Underserved Areas

Title V: Other Matters

I'm certain that many of us have friends who's names appear on the "Wall" perhaps harbor guilt as I do. I think it is our solemn duty to keep their memories alive as long as we live. On another note, I would invite each and every one of you to communicate your ideas, views, suggestions, and yes "gripes" to President Shaw, myself or any other VVA 295 officer or Board of Director. Only through communication and teamwork can we make VVA Chapter 295 better. As I mentioned last month, time is running short for we, as Vietnam Veterans, to create the legacy that we will leave behind.

President Shaw and myself are planning to attend the VVA National Leadership Conference in July.
