



Our December Selection: The Cold Cold Ground, Book One of the Troubles Trilogy by Adrian McKinty

This first Detective Sean Duffy novel won the 2013 Spinetingler Award and was picked as one of the best crime novels of the year by *The Times* (of London). Adrian McKinty was born and grew up in Carrickfergus, Northern Ireland, five miles north of Belfast.

From Amazon's description: "Spring 1981. Northern Ireland. Belfast on the verge of outright civil war. The Thatcher government has flooded the area with soldiers, but nightly there are riots, bombings, and sectarian attacks.

Amid the chaos, Sean Duffy, a young, witty, Catholic detective in the almost entirely Protestant Royal Ulster Constabulary, is trying to track down a serial killer who is targeting gay men. As a Catholic policeman, Duffy is suspected by both sides, and there are other layers of complication. For one thing, homosexuality is illegal in Northern Ireland in 1981. Then he discovers that one of the victims was involved in the IRA but was last seen discussing business with someone from the Protestant UVF (Ulster Volunteer Force)."

The Cold Cold Ground is a police procedural but a procedural set in extremely unusual circumstances exploring the poisonously

claustrophobic time and place of Northern Ireland during the Troubles.

P.S. The other two books in the trilogy are I Hear the Sirens in the Street and In the Morning I'll Be Gone.

A Note from Ellen: Our book for January will be *To School Through the Fields*, by Alice Taylor. (All the books we choose are available on Amazon.) Here is the description from Amazon:

The biggest bestseller ever published in Ireland, this sparkling memoir of life in the Irish countryside is a book of charm and lasting appeal. "A delightful evocation of Irishness and of the author's deep-rooted love of 'the very fields of home', this picture of bucolic life in an earlier time, with its rituals of religion and the antics of local characters, has universal appeal."--Publishers Weekly. "One of the most richly evocative and moving portraits of childhood [ever] written ... A journey every reader will treasure and will want to read over and over again."--Boston Herald.

On November 14, 2016, we lost our friend and long-time IAS member John Murray. John was very proud of his Irish heritage (his mother was born in Co. Monaghan)



Warm and Indulgent Guinness Gingerbread Recipe

Dark, luscious, and full of spices, warming ginger and, of course, Guinness, this recipe will really hit the spot.

Ingredients

1/4 sticks 10 (tablespoons) butter, plus some for greasing

- 1 cup golden syrup (such as Lyle's)
- 1 cup (packed) plus 2 tablespoons dark brown sugar
- 1 cup stout (such as Guinness)
- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/4 cups sour cream
- 2 eggs

1 rectangular aluminum foil pan or cake pan, approximately 13 by 9 by 2 inches



Directions

Preheat your oven to 325F.

Line your cake pan with aluminum foil and grease it, or grease your foil tray.

Put the butter, syrup, dark brown sugar, stout, ginger, cinnamon, and ground cloves into a pan and melt gently over a low heat.

Take off the heat and whisk in the flour and baking soda. Be patient and whisk thoroughly to get rid of any lumps.

Whisk the sour cream and eggs together in a measuring jug and then beat into the gingerbread mixture, whisking again to get a smooth batter.

Pour this into your cake/foil pan, and bake for about 45 minutes; when it's ready it will be gleamingly risen at the centre, and coming away from the pan at the sides.

Let the gingerbread cool before cutting into slices or squares.




